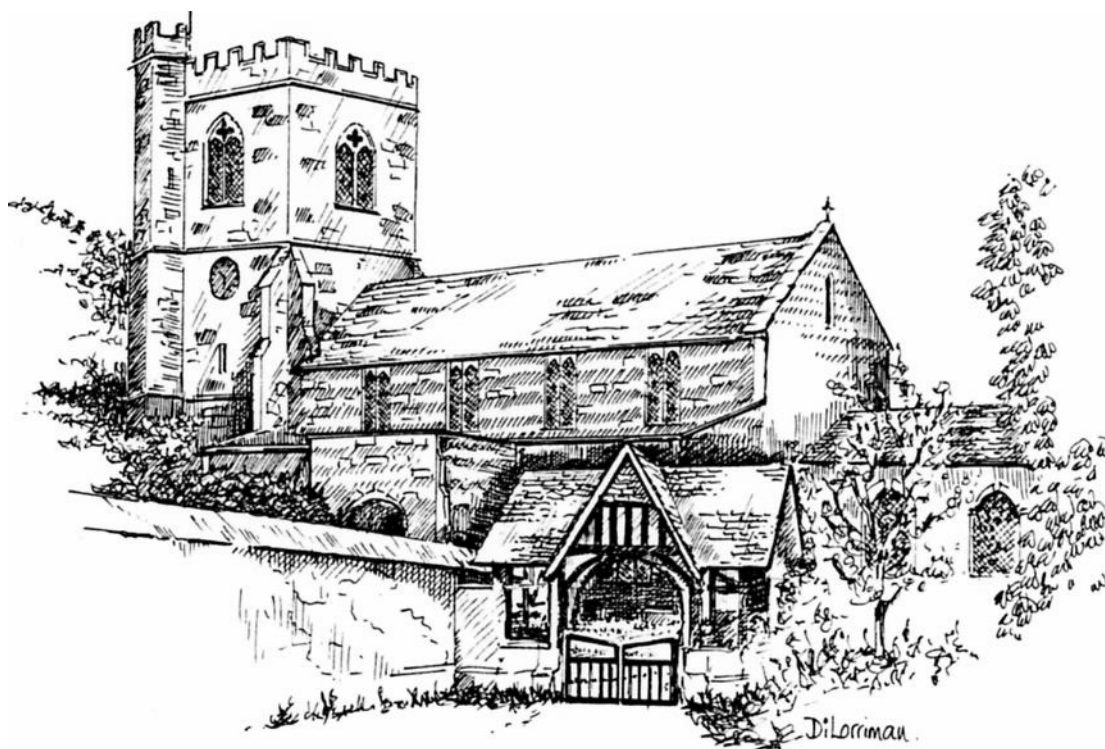
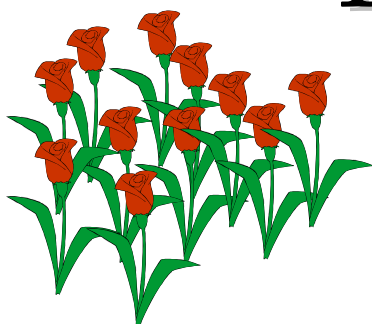

### THE CUP FINAL DAY HAS ARRIVED

5.30 pm and the coach pulled into The Red Lion car park ready to take us to The Final. All suited up, we boarded the coach and started our journey to Downton Football Club. We arrived on time and with 45 minutes till kick off and we changed into our kit and started our warm up routine. With 10 minutes to go we were given our match talk and final instructions.

We kicked off promptly at 7.30 pm.

We started very well against Phil Small Sports FC and controlled the game from the off. 20 minutes in and we took a deserved lead with Fred Kenny getting his first goal. Our keeper made a fine save 5 minutes later to keep us in the game and combined with Alex Brown's superb defending in 6 yd box saw us retain our lead. 10 minutes before half time we scored our second goal. A long clearance from our keeper cleared their defence and Fred latched onto the ball and calmly took it around their keeper to grab his second goal.

The second half started and as anticipated we came under pressure early on. Ali and Smudge, our central defenders, dealt with every high ball that came their way and anything that got through, Roy was there to mop up. Good coordination and pace was the key to remaining in the lead, and we found that in our midfield with Rory and Alex who were strong on attacking and resolute in defending when needed. Fred was constantly making excellent runs and it paid off with his getting his hat trick mid way through the half. Three goals up and fifteen minutes left and we were in a strong position. A long range effort from Lee Norris deserved to go in but we saw the shot come off the underside of the cross bar. The last quarter of the game saw them change formation and press forward. ## CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 13<sup>TH</sup> – 19<sup>TH</sup> MAY

There will be a house-to-house collection in all the villages of Avon Valley benefice again this year: Bulford, Enford, Figheldean, Fittleton, Milston & Netheravon.

One of the communities, which benefits from the money we raise, is in the San Luis la Herradura area of El Salvador. Jesus Antonio Echevarria, usually known as Chus, is 15; he lives there with his sister and her husband. This area is particularly prone to natural disasters – hurricanes are a growing threat, and the low-lying land is very susceptible to flooding. Chus's hut was battered by Hurricane Stan in 2005, and this has left holes in the roof. The family survives on just a few dollars a day.

Chus likes to get involved with his community in a practical way, and has worked on strengthening the local riverbank with Christian Aid partner Aphrodehni. In the aftermath of Hurricane Stan he helped to make up food parcels for other families.

His 7-year old cousin, Jackeline, participates in Aphrodehni's workshops, which use sport and art to help children forget the trauma of hurricanes and earthquakes. She has also taken part in rubbish-collecting brigades.

Aphrodehni encourages people to take responsibility for protecting and developing their own communities. Its work includes reducing the risks created by natural disasters, reducing environmental pollution and responding to emergencies. The increased frequency and intensity of hurricanes and subsequent flooding demonstrate the catastrophic effects that climate change is already having on some of the world's poorest people.

***A gift of just £6 to Christian Aid would enable Aphrodehni to clean a well after a flood. You will also be paying for the education and training of the local community – people who can make an immediate difference, particularly young people like Chus.***

***And please remember to Gift Aid your donation if you are a taxpayer. Last year Gift Aid declarations raised an extra million pounds in Christian Aid Week. It costs Aphrodehni £117 to build a well – one million pounds would build 8,500 wells.***

Christian Aid believes that we must tackle the underlying causes of poverty – which now includes climate change.

## ALL SAINTS' CHURCH ENFORD

What Hope For Our Churches?

*Dear Friends*

The architectural historian and committed 'church goer' Sir Roy Strong has proposed a drastic solution to the problem of tiny congregations in country churches.

'Burn the pews and share the buildings with community centres and Farmers' Markets.'

This sounds radical but he estimates that there are 10,000 country churches most of them built in the middle ages when most people lived on the land. These building can only survive if they are repossessed by the community and put to better use for 'Bring and Buy Sales, Post Offices and school meetings. If the village community is to be secure, the Church once again needs to be at its centre. The Church authorities put a number of obstacles in the way which prevents initiatives and imaginative ideas being introduced. If we, as a benefice of 6 churches are going to protect the churches in years to come, we must alert everyone to think of ideas of raising money and encouraging youth clubs, discos, dances, concerts and children's parties. If this sounds radical and provocative and challenges us to think more deeply, then it will have achieved its aim.

Finally in these buildings there are sacred areas; the beautiful choir, chancel, and sanctuary which must be respected and used as sacred places. In the vast majority of these buildings the 'Nave' is ripe for imaginative use.

I would value your comments.

WILTSHIRE CONSTABULARY**PEWSEY COMMUNITY AND NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH BULLETIN**

**January-February 2007****(Looking forward to another year of working together for a safer community)****Anti Social Behaviour**

We continue to get reports from many of our villages about the dreaded Anti Social Behaviour. This usually consists of nuisance youths causing problems for local residents and particularly elderly neighbours. This is a difficult subject for us to deal with as it is not something that can be readily resolved after the event. With this in mind we would ask that these matters are reported as they happen. These incidents tend to occur on a Friday and Saturday evening which is when we are most effectively staffed with the assistance of our Special Constables. If the offenders are caught 'in the act' then we have far more powers to deal with them through Public Order and Breach of the Peace legislation.

We attend regular Anti Social Behaviour focus partnership meetings which assists us to identify and deal with persistent offenders through Agreeable Behaviour Contracts and ASBOs. We can only use these enforcement legislations with the information and evidence from the community. Help us to help you and please do not be afraid to ring the police over something which you consider may be very trivial. We rely on information and complaints to show us what is going on in our area and help us plan our targeted patrols.

**Neighbourhood Policing**

The response to the survey sent out in the last bulletin was very good. As a result of this we are well on our way to completing our first stage of the Neighbourhood Policing Plan of consultation with our communities. Although we have had feedback from across our area, we have currently identified the main issue as being speeding with approximately 30% of the answers received. In the coming months we will be looking at working in partnership with our colleagues from the Roads Policing Unit and also with outside agencies including Parish and District Councils to see what measures can be put in place to tackle this and other main issues that have been identified.

Our team of Special Constables continue to show their enthusiasm and commitment to the Neighbourhood Policing objectives. The teams have been out and about in their communities as detailed below. They have been specifically tasked on occasions to assist their regular colleagues with enquiries on their areas and have been keen to complete these tasks. They have included house to house enquires in relation to specific crimes and also targeting particular areas in relation to reports of anti social behaviour.

## Reported Crime for 1<sup>st</sup> November to 11<sup>th</sup> December 2006

**Below are listed outstanding crimes still undergoing investigation and accordingly any information received relating to these would be welcomed. This is NOT a comprehensive list of all offences which have taken place, just some of those which require further enquiries.**

### **Pewsey Village**

During early February a number of wild doves have been shot and killed in the Vale Road area of Pewsey. It is believed that they have been shot with either an air weapon or a catapult. We are also investigating a number of offences of criminal damage mainly at weekends. This includes damage at the Bouverie Hall and also damage/burglary at the shed by the doctors surgery in The High Street.

### **Pewsey East (Wootton Rivers, Milton Lilbourne, Easton Royal, New Mill)**

Between 1300 and 1400hrs on 29<sup>th</sup> January persons removed a chainsaw from an open and insecure garage in Milton Lilbourne. People should be reminded to keep their property secure as open property makes life easy for those that want to help themselves.

### **Pewsey North (Altons, Oare, Wilcot, Wilsford, Woodborough, Marden, Patney, Charlton, Stanton, Chirton)**

The few rays of sunshine have brought the tourists to our area again. With that comes the interest of our opportunist thieves who break into motor vehicles. There have already been a couple of reports of vehicles broken into at Martinsell Hill. For the locals who may be walking the area please take the opportunity to advise people about leaving property in their vehicles and report any suspicious vehicles to us at the earliest opportunity.

Throughout February we have received reports of damage to canal boats moored at the Ladys Bridge Mooring at Wilcot. There are no specific times or dates for these offences as many of the canal boats are left for up to a week before the occupants return.

A trailer has been stolen from the front garden of a premises in Andover Road Chirton some time between 15-26<sup>th</sup> February. It had been secured locked to a tree. At 1115 on 28<sup>th</sup> February an Iveco Tippa with a registration number including J565 removed a vehicle from a parking space in Small Street Chirton without permission. Lock up your vehicles securely and report any heavy vehicles acting suspiciously.

### **Pewsey South (Netheravon, Enford, Fittleton, Haxton, Chisenbury)**

At approximately 1415hrs on 26<sup>th</sup> February a male posing as Wessex water Board official called at an address in Paddock Close Enford. He had no official ID but the caller invited him in. He asked the resident if she worked and if she lived alone. It's not believed that anything was taken. These distraction burglars are still active across the county so look out for your neighbours.

**On a lighter note...** A Senior Investigating Officer in a Met Murder Squad was left rather bemused after taking a call from his local Force Press Officer. The eager Press Officer, keen to keep the local papers on side, had taken a range of questions from them about a specific murder enquiry to put to the Detective Chief Inspector. The DCI patiently listened and replied to each question in turn. Finally, the Press Officer, pleased with himself for capturing so much information, posed his final question to the Detective. "Finally Sir, can you just confirm the condition of the victim for me?" The Press Officer was confronted with a stony silence on the end of the phone. After a short pause, the baffled DCI replied "Well, he's still dead son."

**HIGHWAY NEWS****Hello Residents of ENFORD**

As you must all have noticed the 30MPH Zone through the A345 at Enford has been upgraded to what is known as “Gateway Treatment” to Traffic Calm speeding vehicles. This work has now been completed and the new signs denoting Enford and “Please Drive Carefully” have been installed at both ends of the zone.

You may have noticed the speed camera signs on the posts at each end of the 30mph limit. This now means that we have been accepted onto the Wiltshire and Swindon Camera Partnership Scheme. This is because there are still vehicles doing excessive speeds through the area.

Please be aware of the enforcement cameras operating though this 30mph zone and also the Wiltshire Constabularies presence conducting “Speed Checks”.

**The Village Lane**

The C32 connecting Lane through the Villages. We are compiling a report to be presented to Wiltshire County Council regarding Speed Limits and Road Safety.

This report will be from the Everleigh Road Junction (South) through to the A342 Junction (North) past East Chisenbury. It will include Coombe, Coombe Lane, Enford Village Enford Hill, Water Lane, Littlecott and East Chisenbury Village.

The Government have instructed local authorities to re assess Rural A & B roads regarding the present day speed limits and this has to be completed by 2011. To this end we are aiming to get the speed limit reduced along the C32 in the unrestricted areas to a more sensible speed other than 60mph and through the 30mph zones we aim to get this reduced to 20mph. In areas like Coombe Lane, Enford Hill and Water Lane we hope we can get a restricted speed limit enforcement to 20mph to protect children, pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders.

On a different issue on Highways and Lanes, we have been advised by the Authorities on the new laws regarding residential rubbish disposal. 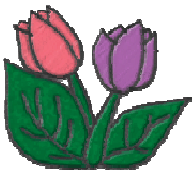

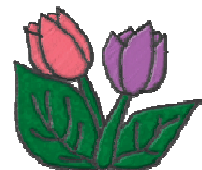

**TRAINING:** The month of May will be relatively quiet on the Plain apart from the first week which sees the culmination of a pre operational TESEX for the Coldstream Guards battle group who will be deploying to Afghanistan later in the year. There will also be a heavy armoured exercise run by the Land Warfare Centre in the week beginning 14<sup>th</sup> May but this should not cause any disruption to the Parishes abutting the Plain.

**LIVE FIRING:** : Normal live firing takes place from 0830 - 1700 hrs daily, but may continue throughout the night, this is normally on Tuesdays and Thursday only. Noise may be greater in certain areas depending upon the meteorological conditions at the time of firing. Dates and locations are subject to change

**DEER:** Roe does give birth towards the end of May and early June; this is an extremely vulnerable period for the young, if you come across them they will remain still, be assured they have not been abandoned, their mother is most likely watching you from cover nearby. Loose uncontrolled dogs at this time can cause great distress to the young deer so please if walking with them on the Plain keep them under control.

**HORSE RIDERS - BE SAFE - BE SEEN:** We must emphasise that Salisbury Plain is a low flying military area and so riders should use the Bridleways and PROW where they can be anticipated and easily seen. Providing riders wear high visibility clothing this significantly improves pilot's visual detection range and thus initiate avoidance procedures. However such apparel may not always prevent helicopters over-flying riders: it does however provide a considerable and cost-effective improvement in rider safety on the MOD.

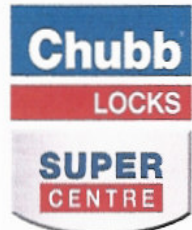
