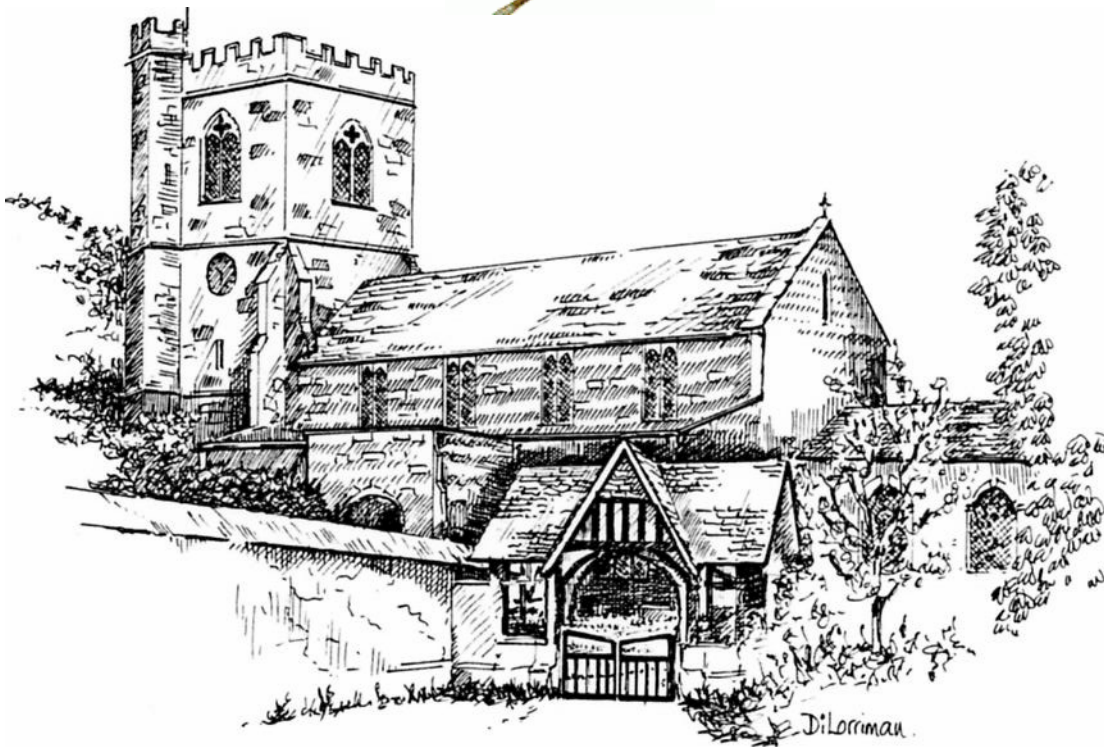

An Assault occurred in the High Street of Netheravon on 07th August 2007. A local man was the Victim of what is suspected to be a deliberate hit and run incident, which resulted in the victim sustaining leg injuries.

A Theft occurred at Netheravon Church, whereby much of the lead roofing was stolen overnight. This is the second time such an offence has happened here in the last few months. Villagers in Netheravon are asked to keep an eye on the church whenever possible and police patrols will also be visiting regularly.

Problems highlighted for action by the local community included youths gathering at Court Farm Close in Netheravon and engaging in anti social behaviour acts (ASB). Speeding in Rushall and Upavon were also highlighted for specific action. The team are pleased to report that for the most part the youths in Netheravon now congregate somewhere more suitable and police will continue to monitor their actions. Reports of ASB have decreased in the village and we will continue to patrol here at key times.

Speeding motorists in Upavon and Rushall have been issued advice and on occasions, for the most serious offenders, speeding tickets. A number of static speed checks have been carried out and villagers have informed us that they are pleased to see us acting pro-actively. We will continue to monitor the situation here in future.

The following incidents have been reported to The local Neighbourhood Watch

1) A trailer was stolen from a Water Lane the night of Sunday (19 August) about 10:30pm. This was the same day as a visit by a man with a flat-bed truck with a crane who came around "looking for scrap".

2) A roundpen was stolen between 20.30 on Tuesday 28th August and 7.00 on Wednesday 29th August from the field next to the playing field in Enford. It was almost certainly stolen in the early part of that night.

It was a Monarch Paddock Pen consisting of 20 interlockable 7'0 high by 8'0 wide galvanised mesh panels each with a 12 inch section of sheet metal at the bottom. One of the panels included a gate within an arched gateway. The various fittings and lynch pins for joining the panels together were possibly put into a sky blue plastic bag for removal.

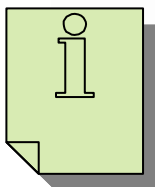

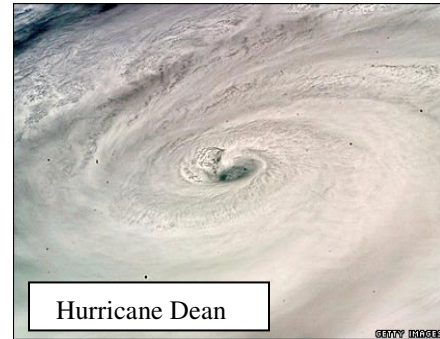

Hurricane Dean

It is a little disconcerting to say the least when during your summer holiday you are told that a hurricane is heading towards you!! Not that we hadn't appreciated that when we travel to St Lucia in August it is indeed the hurricane season, yet in the 8 years we have visited the island we have never experienced anything other than a gentle sea breeze.



However it soon became clear that the St Lucians were taking the hurricane warnings seriously as the resort staff began 'battening down the hatches' and sure enough by 6pm on Thursday 16th August the weather certainly started to deteriorate rapidly. The restaurants on the resort were all closed down and staff sent home to safeguard their properties.

By 9pm a tropical storm enveloped the seascape in a continual show of lightening illuminating the ever-increasing sea swell. It was at this point that we received a phone call from the duty manager to advise us to stay in our rooms but that if we did feel the need we could evacuate to the hurricane shelter which doubled as the resort conference room. Our resort is set against the hillside and fortunately most of the villas are well above sea level. Needless to say we stayed put.

We switched the satellite television in the villa to the American television channel, dedicated to hurricane reports and tracked Hurricane Dean as it swept across the Caribbean, with St Lucia, directly in its path. By midnight it was reported to be 85 miles away at which point we decided to go to bed.

At around 2.45 am, my daughter who had been disturbed by the increase in wind noise, woke me and decided to ring down to reception to ask the latest news. "Hurricane Dean will be here in 15 minutes" came the reply and true enough at around 3am, the crescendo of wind noise .



From our vantage point , 500metresabove the sea, looking out from our bedroom window, we could see the tops of the palm trees virtually touching the ground as the wind battered them from side to side. In the distance too the towering waves could be seen to completely shroud the small offshore islands – it was a truly eerie sight!!

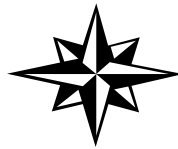
Returning to bed, we were woken two hours later, by the sound of roof tiles clattering to the ground and the creak of roof beams straining. It was at this point that we felt discretion was the better part of valour and that it was advisable to take refuge in a quite sizeable cupboard under the stairs. Armed with cushions, candles and water we ensconced ourselves in our 'shelter'. It made us think of what it must have been like for those in air raid shelters in the war, which undoubtedly must have been a far more harrowing experience.

By 6.30am the winds began to subside and so we ventured back to bed. Hurricane Dean was moving on.

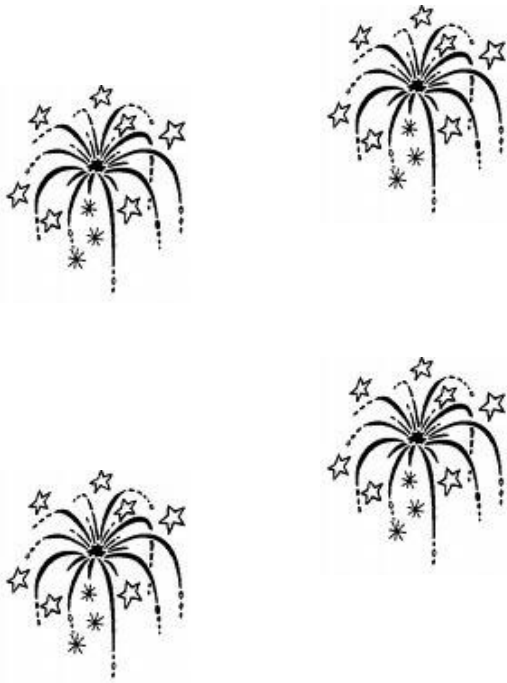
As dawn broke we were witness to the extent of damage, mainly vegetation, that was strewn all over the roads and footpaths and filling swimming pools. Large branches and trees blocked roads restricting travel, but damage was largely superficial although we were to hear that both the roof of the children’s hospital had been blown off as too had the roof of the governor’s house. There was just one loss of life – that of a farmer who had drowned trying to save his cow from a river.

Two days later on our homeward journey to the airport, we saw the devastation that Hurricane Dean had wreaked to the banana plantations, 60% of which were destroyed. We sincerely hope that the farmers will be compensated for their losses, which for so many is their sole source of livelihood. Thank goodness that Hurricane Dean was only classed as a category 2/3 - had it been higher then the damage could have been far worse.

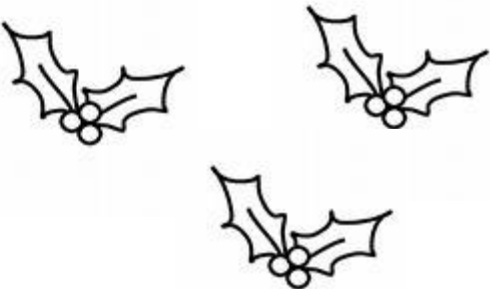

C32 Coombe – Enford - East Chisenbury

Noting the Government's request to rural authorities to re-assess the controlled zones along their rural "A" "B" & "C" roads, which have to be in place by the year 2011, Enford Parish Council has drawn up a report on the C32 from the Everleigh Road Junction through Coombe, to Enford, Littlecott and East Chisenbury, to the junction of the A342 near Upavon.

This report is attached, included are photographs of certain areas along this entire route along with two photographs of accidents that occurred; one in Coombe and one in East Chisenbury. Many more minor accidents have occurred along this stretch of road.

The C32 is much as it was a hundred years ago and has not changed in its width or contour. All residential properties along this route are adjacent to the highway with no footpaths. This lane is being used as a "Rat Run" by vehicles travelling through to the A342 near Upavon. It is this traffic that creates the safety problem for residents.

Both Enford and East Chisenbury were designated conservation areas in 1974. The increasing amount of through traffic combined with excessive speeds are having a drastic effect on this environment and its residents. The imminent development of Upavon Airfield for trials of a pilotless aircraft, with its attendant runway construction and staffing increase, will only increase traffic and exacerbate an already dangerous situation.

Enford Parish Council ask that you consider introducing traffic calming regulation on this road as soon as possible.

The C32 Village Connection Lane from the Everleigh Road junction through Coombe, Enford, Littlecott, East Chisenbury to the junction of the A342 near Upavon.

1. Width of Lane at The Everleigh Road junction 11' 6" road speed unrestricted
2. COOMBE .Width 12'. No footpath. 14 Residential Properties.
2. COOMBE LANE. Width 12' No footpath. 25 Residential Properties.
(Note: this Lane leads only to Salisbury Plain.)
3. ENFORD VILLAGE. Width 12' at Long Street. No footpath. 35 Residential Properties on both sides of Lane in close proximity of roadway.
4. ENFORD HILL Width 15' No footpath. 10 Residential Properties and Enford Parish Church. This Lane connects the A345 30mph Zone to the C32 Enford Village and has no restriction.
5. WATER LANE. Width 13'. No footpath. Leading to Grants Road, Paddock Close, Palmerston Meadows and Field View . 92 Residential Properties are connected to Water Lane. (Note: Like Coombe Lane this Lane leads only onto the Plains and is un-restricted)
6. LITTLECOTT Width of Lane 12' No footpath. 3 Residential Properties.
7. EAST CHISENBURY Width of Lane 13' No footpath. 32 Residential Properties.
8. Width of Lane at the C32/A342 Junction near Upavon is 13'

The photographs of the C32 include resident's photographs of two of the many accidents that have occurred in the past. With the exception of the present 30mph Restrictions at Enford Village and East Chisenbury, the whole of this section of the C32 and its side lanes are un-restricted.

The danger from increasing traffic to pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders on the C32 is a great concern for residents. It should be possible for residents to step out of their houses without the fear of coming into contact with a fast moving vehicle. This Council wishes make Enford Parish a safe area for all concerned.

Enford Parish Council request a review of the C32 connecting Lane from Everleigh Road Junction through to the junction of the A342 past East Chisenbury. We ask that all areas above be considered for a 20 MPH restriction.

TRAINING: October will be a busy month but generally quiet month for the local parishes apart from the period Sat 6th to Thurs 11th Oct when the annual firepower demonstration and its associated rehearsals will take place on the Imber ranges. This will involve AS90 artillery guns and other weapons plus fighter ground attack and will, inevitably, be noisy.

NOTE: Due to unforeseen changes there is always a possibility that there could be firing on other of the days listed. This is particularly so now operational training is being conducted to meet many and varied exigencies. The public should be careful to check that Red Flags are not flying before they enter the range. It is the time of the year when we change late night firing times. From March through to October the Tue, Thurs and Sat night firing times will revert back to 2330hrs.

HELICOPTER NIGHT FLYING : Night flying will normally take place Mondays -Thursdays inclusive over parts of the training area dependent on the weather and the availability of range space. In some cases the aircraft will show no lights but will operate under strict area control

AIR ACTIVITIES : Dates and timings given below are those listed at the time of printing but may be altered due to aircraft serviceability or weather conditions.

AIRCRAFT TRIALS:

Aircraft may conduct trials over Larkhill Range on each Wed and Fri from 1200 - 1700 hrs which could involve circuits to the East crossing the Avon Valley.

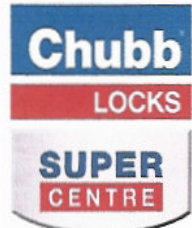
