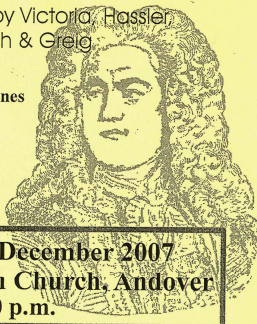

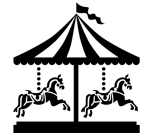

We also suggested that it was time to look at the future and whether there was a better way to organise community events and fundraising. Below are some thoughts:

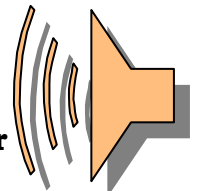
- The show itself is still successful as a small village fete
- It is the only major event in Chisenbury and Enford which attracts a majority of the residents and they would be sad to lose it.
- There is, at present, some feeling that the Flower Show is for Chisenbury only – how can we change this?
- The show aspect is virtually defunct. It is arguable any remaining competitive events, such as the photographic competition would be more successful if run separately.
- Would it be of benefit to the parish as a whole if there was an organisation which could sponsor/encourage/fund more individual, and perhaps smaller, events, cultural, sporting, educational and entertaining?.
- Could we do more for teenagers and children, sporting activities, other village amenities?
- There is a strong move to relate the church far more into the community as whole, not just for it to be for church-goers. We have a beautiful building which will shortly have a toilet and kitchenette incorporated in it. Could an organisation acting as a ‘secular’ arm of the church to boost the use of the church and other community activities, help to bridge this gap? There could equally be links with the Parish Council, the two halls and the footballs clubs
- Any such organisation would have to be seen to be for all the community and not just for the benefit of the church.
- Perhaps a properly established organisation for letting out the tents and tables and other facilities etc., for the benefit of the parish
- **All of this depends on the willingness and enthusiasm of enough people in the parish to run whatever transpires. At present there is not a viable Flower Show Committee , we need more people!!**

So if you have any ideas about what could be done – what you could do, or help you could give, please come to the meeting on 17th January at the church and talk about it

Light refreshments will be available, perhaps even a glass of wine!

Mr Dominic Campbell

It was with much sadness that we heard about the death of Mr Dominic Campbell (Dom). Dom had been such an active member of our community, giving his time and his energy to so many different aspects of the life of this village. In particular he had for some time helped the Newsletter Committee by auditing the accounts and giving sound advice where needed. Dom will be missed by many of us and he will also be remembered with fondness.

THE DISCOVERING LOST WAYS PROJECT

An article from the Farmers Weekly magazine dated 19 October 2007 was recently brought to my attention by a local resident, and deals with plans by 'Natural England' to resurrect some 13,750 miles of unrecorded Public Rights Of Way.

It is reported that the £15m project, is being funded by DEFRA to identify and reinstate thousands of out-of-use PROWs across England and Wales, and could result in an estimated 7m acres being removed from agricultural production.

It is reported that during August 2003, a group of Trail Riders, used maps dating from 1771, discovered that more than 200yrs ago, a Byway Open To All Traffic of approximately 19miles long and 20yds wide had existed in part of Northumberland and the North Pennines, an Area Of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The line of the road now runs under five dry stone walls, and one fence line. If reinstated, these will undoubtedly be removed.

Another reported example is in Somerset, where a dairy farmer has been fighting a 17year battle with the County Council. The article explains that in 1990, campaigners succeeded in claiming a stretch of road, 10yds in width, across land belonging to two separate farms. The farmers claim to have proved that the road has not been used since 1900, prior to which it was a private road, not public. Notwithstanding that, the road has been reinstated, resulting in the removal of a hedgerow on the edge of a field, thus exposing cattle to traffic on the A303 trunk road, and the removal of an area of cultivated ground from crop production.

Don't think it can't happen in Wiltshire. IT CAN

PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY **(COULD THIS AFFECT YOUR LIVES**

Section 53 of The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, permits **any person** to apply to the Highways Authority for an order to modify the Definitive Map and Statement.

During early September 2007, Town and Parish Councils around Wiltshire received correspondence from Wiltshire County Council entitled 'Prioritisation of Applications for Modification Orders', and relates to changes to various Public Rights of Way, (PROW)

The document contains 186 applications, involving changes to approximately 200 PROWs within Wiltshire. Of the total applications, 150 relate to the upgrade of Bridleways to Byways Open To All Traffic. (BOATS). Other relate to the opening of new Byways Open To All Traffic, route variations or closures. Within this group, 133 applications have been submitted by three individuals.

The initial impression from the list of applications is that in each case, only short distances are involved. However, when plotted onto a map, a totally different picture emerges. In the main, the applications have been made to join together existing byways and minor roads/tracks, to facilitate unrestricted access across a number of defined areas.

Within the Enford Parish area alone, 7 applications propose to upgrade 10 Bridleways to Byways Open To All Traffic.

Enford Parish is included in an area from Bulford in the south, moving north through Milston, Figheledean, Durrington, Netheravon and Enford, then east to Everleigh, The Collingbournes and south to Ludgershall, Tidworth and back to Bulford.

Incidentally, all the applications, 25 in total, for the area described above, have been submitted by one person, a resident of Bradford-on-Avon. I recently spoke to that person and asked the question WHY? His response, a shrug of the shoulders and the comment 'Well, off roaders should be able to use them too'.

Byways Open To All Traffic obviously means use by motorised vehicles, and given the type of terrain, could possibly lead to an increase of 'Off Road' traffic through our villages.

It is not the intention to obstruct the enjoyment of any responsible person using such vehicles, but it is believed that if such changes do occur, this could be to the detriment of residents.

I have responded to Wiltshire County Council, putting forward a number of opposition points already raised by some residents, but any additional feedback would be most welcome.

For anyone interested, search the Internet, specifically around the Salisbury Plain area for Off Road Driving, 4x4s, Trail Riders Association and a whole host of others, and see the chatter and comments between various groups and individuals.

HIGHWAY NEWS

Hello Residents of Enford

On 30th October 2007, the Government released a press statement saying that there were 2.1 million vehicles being driven on the highways without insurance. The Government's previous figure was 1.2 million. Going on this new 'guess' by the authorities, I would say add another half a million to this figure and we may be nearer the correct amount. On these new figures released, it represents 6.5% of the UK vehicle fleet which is 1 in 5 drivers on the road without insurance.

As the present law stands, should an accident occur on the UK highways and no-one is injured, the police are not required to attend. Therefore it is a good possibility at one of these incidents that false information may be given to third parties.

We are advising our Parish residents that should a situation arise where they are involved in this type of accident and they are suspicious of the vehicle and the driver information being supplied, they should contact their local police immediately for their attendance at the scene of the accident to take details. This advice has been cleared by the police and is being relayed to all Parishes in the Pewsey Vale.

A345 –Summer 2007 Highway Resurfacing and Road Patching Work

We have made Wiltshire County Council's Highways Department aware of the areas that have been missed after the work had been carried out, i.e. 'white-lining and replacing of 'cats' eyes'. We are also now lobbying for a re-assessment of the current white lining along the 345 to be up-to-date with today's modern high tech motor vehicles and the way they are driven along this very dangerous highway.

The Parish Letter and Report has been submitted to 'Sustrans', the main cycle network organisation with a view for them to lobby the authorities regarding the traffic calming along this very narrow lane that we all know is being used as fast 'rat run' from the A345 through to the A342.

Dear Sir,

Please would you be so kind as to pass the following information on to all of your employees.

East Chisenbury is a small village of 32 houses situated on a C class road which in places is single track.

From the start of the village to the end there are 18 children living here permanently. Some are of school age who leave the house from 0745 hours onwards, some are very young and some disabled. Most of these children are too young to have any credible road sense.

This head count does not include the ever increasing number of visiting grandchildren.

Recently our lane was grid locked by your personnel at 0845 hours with traffic backing up both ways out of sight. Children had to weave in and out of traffic to get across the lane. Other days we frequently see drivers in army uniform speeding through the village, both to and from work.

Many of us are desperately trying to gain permission from highways to put in driveways to protect our children with a gated entrance. At the moment highways will not support our applications due to line of sight. Even though families are the 'life blood' of villages, the authorities seem happy to run the risk of serious injury by RTIs. I have been told by an official that I will not get permission because there has not been a death by a car accident in the village, and so we are not considered a priority case.

There is an application for a speed reduction to 20mph, and also for other speed limiting measures such as speed bumps or give way chicanes.

Why do you think these measures are very much needed on a village lane? Simply because your employees choose to use our village as a 'rat run'.

If this is disputed, I am more than happy to record registration numbers during 'rush hour', and to compare them with the cars of your staff.

I know that this problem has been highlighted to you in the past, and that you have dealt with it very seriously. For that my thanks. It has to be pointed out though that the 'rat run' traffic has dramatically increased again, and we are really in fear for the lives of our children.

Please could you urge your staff to use the main road to travel to work. The difference in distance and time is extremely minimal, and if they are so rushed to get to work perhaps 'A' crossing could be used as an alternative.

To your employees it's a 'rat run'- to us it's our home and the safety of our children is under threat.

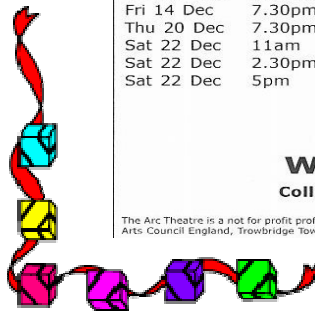

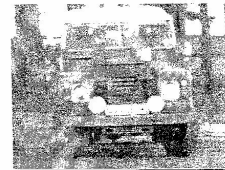
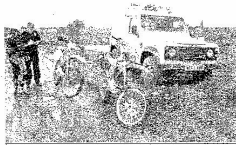

ADVICE FOR ROAD VEHICLES USING THE ARMY TRAINING AREA SALISBURY PLAIN



The Salisbury Plain Military Training Area is subject to a number of Bye-laws which control entry onto the area and the conduct of all persons thereon. The Training Area is used by the Military for the live firing of different types of weapon systems and for tactical training in all conditions both by day and night. These Byelaws are displayed at all legitimate entry points onto the SPTA.

The public may enter certain parts of training areas only if the red flags or red flashing lights are not displayed, and providing that they do not interfere with military training. Certain areas must not be entered at any time as they are used as impact areas for live firing. These areas are clearly signed and are dangerous to enter as unexploded military ordnance WILL be encountered there. It is an arrestable offence to enter such areas! Imber Army range is one such area and is closed to the public at all times.

Off-road vehicles and Motor Cycles etc, may use the **Byways and made up hard stone tracks** as long as they comply with the above paragraph and are **Registered, Taxed, Insured and if necessary have an MOT Certificate.** **The Road Traffic Act applies anywhere that the public have legal access with a motor vehicle.** The **driver/rider** of the vehicle must also hold a **valid licence** to use the vehicle and if a learner must be accompanied by a qualified person.

Civilian Land Wardens, the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP) and various Military personnel patrol the area, all have powers under the Bylaws. The MDP are civilian police officers with full Constabulary powers. Any of these personnel will be happy to answer any questions you have, and give advice regarding the training area.

60% of the SPTA is designated as Sites of Special Scientific Interest (S.S.S.I.) due to the rare flora and fauna that flourishes there and as such it is protected under the Countryside and Wildlife Act. Penalties for offences under this Act can be severe. The Military Lands Act 1892 also gives authorised persons the power to seize vehicles and apply for to the courts for them to be forfeit to the Crown.

All this might sound very draconian, but there are many miles of hard stone tracks and Byways that you can use, some of which are very rough and extremely muddy. A good map of the area is required to identify these legal routes, such as the O.S. Land Ranger series which is sold by W.H. Smiths and many local garages. A Global Positioning System (GPS) is also a good investment.

Refuse & Recycling Collections

Residents with a green garden waste bin can also dispose of their trees in this way. All trees that are collected will be shredded and turned into compost, which can then be bought at the Household Recycling Centres.

SUMMER COMES BACK TO BITE US: An extract from The Daily Mail last month.

It is long gone and best forgotten, but the wettest summer on record has left us with an unpleasant legacy. The damp summer and mild autumn have caused an unprecedented outbreak of disease carrying ticks and fleas. Numbers are at an all-time high, posing serious health risks to humans and pets.

Ticks can carry Lyme disease, which can lead to paralysis, blindness or even death for humans, and lameness, heart and kidney problems for pets. According to figures from the Health Protection Agency, there were 768 reported cases of Lyme disease last year, compared with 292 in 2003, a 263 per cent increase. Hampshire has been the worst hit in the past 12 months, with more than 220 cases reported, Salisbury Plain, Exmoor, Dartmoor and the South Downs are also regarded as danger areas. The first sign of Lyme disease is a ring-shaped skin rash, which spreads out within 30 days. Other common symptoms include tiredness, headaches, joint pain and flu-like symptoms.

The HPA estimates that 1,000 to 2,000 Lyme disease cases go unreported each year. Vets say dirty homes are also contributory factors to the increase in parasites.

Sabrina Stroud, business manager for animal healthcare brand ProMeris UK, which carried out the research said: "Climate change and the damp summer have created the perfect breeding conditions for these potentially lethal parasites. Now is not the time for complacency."

WARMINSTER/IMBER OPEN

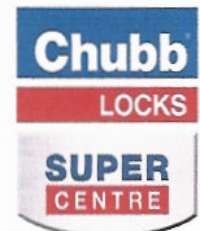
