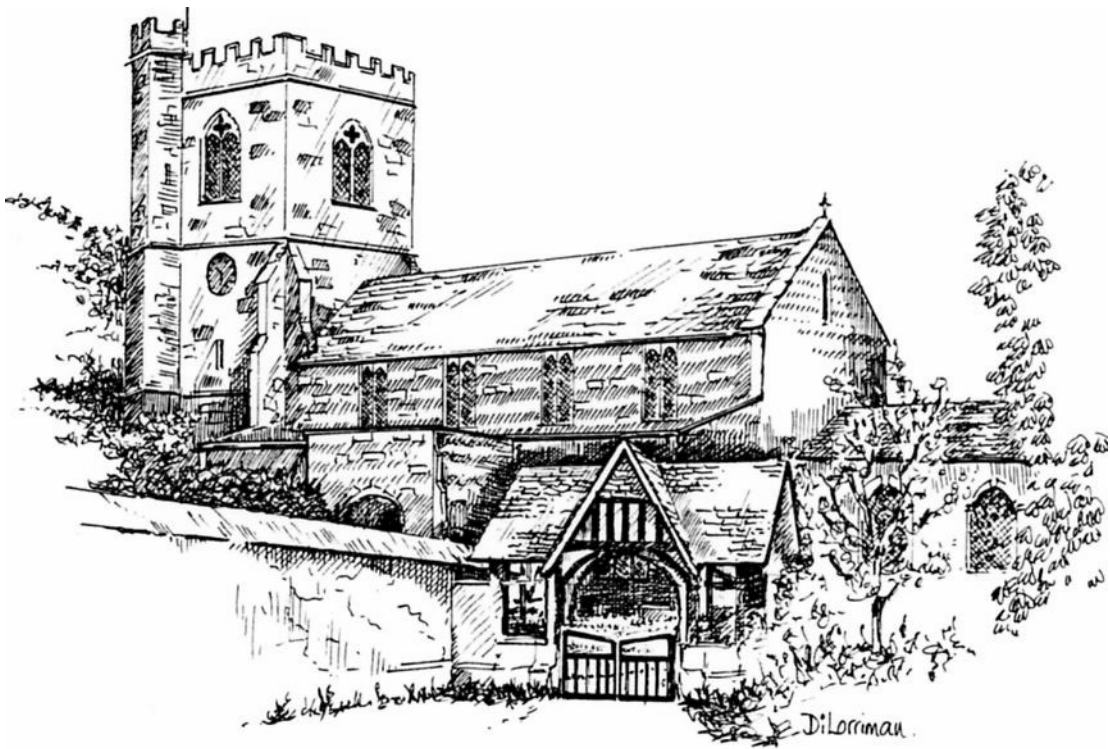

LEAP YEAR FACTS

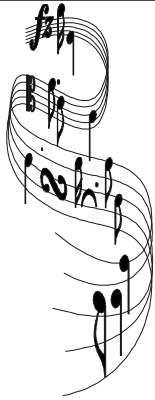
- Our year is 365.2425 days, off from our solar year by .00031, or one day's error over 4,000 years.
- If you're a "Leaper," you will have beaten the 1,506 odds against being born on Leap Day. Leap Year was the traditional time that women could propose marriage. When the rules of courtship were stricter, women were only allowed to pop the question on one day every four years - February 29th.
- It is believed this tradition was started in 5th century Ireland when St. Bridget complained to St. Patrick about women having to wait for so long for a man to propose. So, according to legend, St. Patrick said women could propose on this one day in February during the Leap Year.
- There is a Greek superstition that claims couples have bad luck if they marry during a leap year. Apparently one in five engaged couples in Greece will avoid planning their wedding during a leap year.
- There are currently around 4.1 million 'Leapers' in the world today
- Leap Year Day Babies will never have a "Golden Birthday". A Golden Birthday is when your age matches the number of the day of the month you were born on. Leap Year Day Babies will have to be 116 before they turn 29 on the 29th!

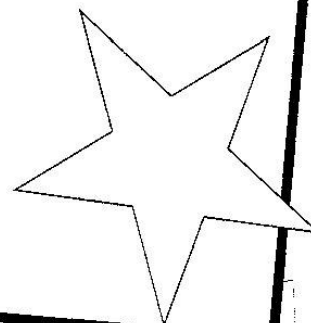

**CHISENBURY & ENFORD FLOWER SHOW
PUBLIC MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 17th JANUARY
IN ENFORD CHURCH**

About 25 to 30 people attended the meeting, representing a good cross section of the Parish. The Committee would like to thank everyone who came for their help and for their contributions to the discussions which were lively and useful!

As Acting Chairman of the Show, Andrew Marx introduced the evening by outlining the current state of the show, its lack of chairman and secretary, its history, some of the problems this had caused and its current state. This covered the nature of the current show, finances and material assets. In particular he pointed out that the flower and vegetable show aspect was virtually defunct but that the fete itself, although small, was an attractive and successful event.

He said the Committee wanted to take this opportunity to take stock of where the show was and whether there should be a rethink about its nature, location, what it supports, where it should go in the future and who runs it.

He outlined the show's assets which included tents, tables, crockery etc and about £2300 in the bank of which £1350 was pledged to the village hall. There is also a credit with the insurance co. of £75 for the cancelled 2007 show. There is also a number of trophies as listed below.

During the discussion several points were made:

- It was very important to continue the show, in whatever form, as a community event to get people together
- There was a need to expand the show to allow for more activities, particularly those which would attract teenagers and children
- It would be very difficult to achieve this expansion at the present venue and if this meant moving to Enford this should be considered
- Such a move would allow for additional events, such as six-a-side football, sports etc.
- Insurance was noted as a hindrance to running such shows but if expansion takes place the extra cost could be covered
- Whatever happened, everything hinged on finding people to run the organisation. There were, however, plenty of willing helpers about

Andrew Marx summed up the meeting as follows:

- He again thanked everyone for coming and for their contributions
- Whilst there was no one at present prepared to run any event, he said that a solution might be forthcoming in the next week or two.
- The Show Committee now intended the following:
 - The Show would be put in limbo until any further developments occurred
 - The accounts would be audited and published in the March magazine
 - Cups held that came from families still in the village would be returned for safe keeping. These are listed below.
- The present committee were willing to remain as caretakers until further developments. Hugo Vickers has been told of the latest developments

The Joan Vickers Salver has been reallocated to the Schools Art Competition with family agreement

PLAINWATCH is specifically designed to rapidly identify suspicious activity on the Plain: firstly and principally to identify criminal activity but secondly to deter such activity.

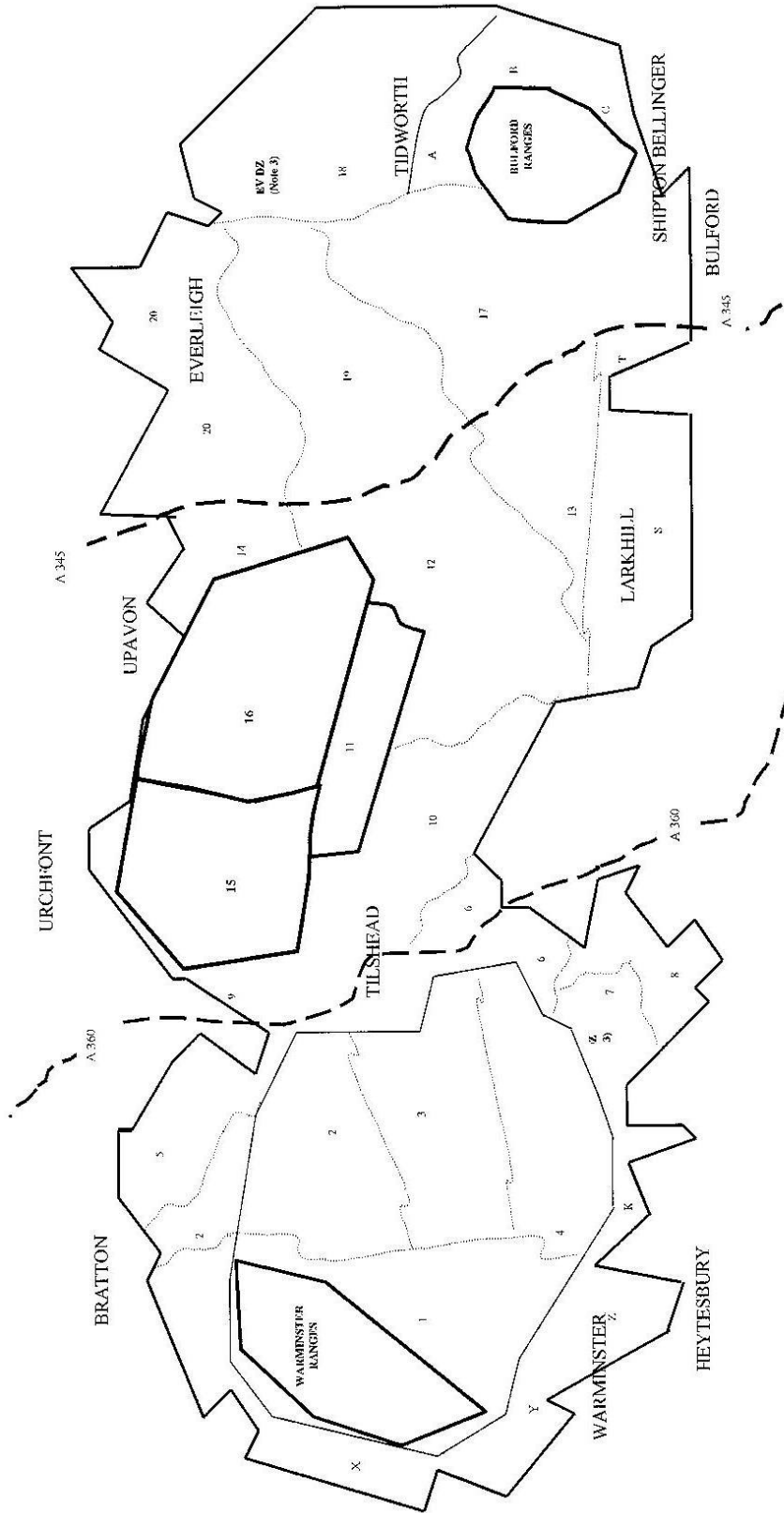

Winter and early Spring is still the time of year when seed is planted. On a holiday in a remote part of Turkey some years ago I was surprised to see a farmer scattering the corn as described in the Parable of the Sower in the Bible. What a hit and miss way of sowing seed – some falling on rocky ground, some amongst weeds and other seed growing well and taking root.

A remarkable man named Jethro Tull thought there must be an easier way and so sitting in Church one day staring at the organ pipes, no doubt during a long sermon, an idea began to form. Beneath each pipe was a stop which closed small hole. As the key was pressed the stop opened and allowed one note to come out.

From this idea Jethro Toll began making his own machine which he called a seed drill. It was a box filled with seeds and had several pipes from it leading to the ground. As the drill was pulled the seed dropped through the pipes to be planted in furrows and in straight rows – saving much seed being wasted.

Jethro Tull has been acclaimed as one of the pioneers of modern farming making the whole process much easier and efficient and cost effective.

We have much to be thankful for especially when see farmers ploughing their fields today.
