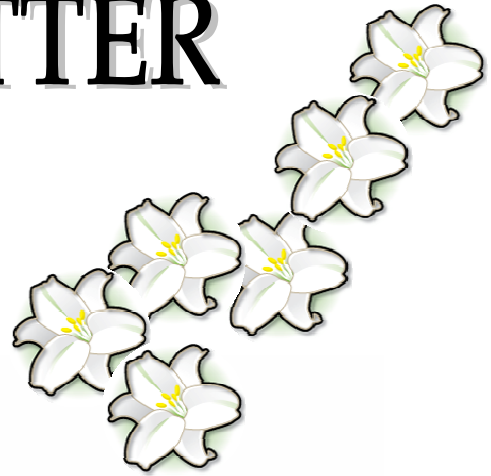
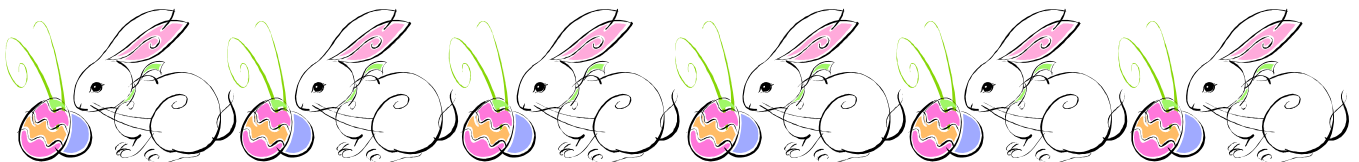

**ALL SAINTS ENFORD CHURCH***Dear Friends*

Easter is extremely early this year, the earliest I am told since the 1920s. Schools are still at work during Holy Week which means members of the Churches can join in the life of our children at work.

As we journey through the week we shall be remembering the events of Palm Sunday when Jesus rode into the city of Jerusalem on a donkey with the crowds cheering him and spreading palm branches in his way. We shall experience how that journey of triumph turned to sadness and deep unpopularity as he upset the rulers of the temple and how the mob turned against him leading to his arrest through the unexpected help of one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot.

## NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Overnight on Sunday 10/02/2008 a "07" registered VW Golf was very seriously vandalised in Palmerston Meadow, Enford, whilst the vehicle was parked on the owners driveway.

The damage consisted of a large quantity of paint stripper (probably made by Nitromors) being poured along the entire length of the car. This has stripped the paint on the vehicle back to the metal base and has caused several thousand pounds worth of damage.

Community Beat Manager, PC Mark Fiander-Lewis, confirmed that no other reports of identical incidents have been made anywhere in the entire Pewsey Vale in recent months and that this is a very unusual and concerning incident for our area.

Police are already quickly discounting local youths from being suspects in the offence and the investigation is now focussing towards a probable adult offender, either male or female. The evidence suggests that the incident is a malicious attack, as opposed to a mindless and random act and that the suspect is probably local to the village, or has close contacts to the village.

As result of the seriousness of the incident substantial police related activities will now be carried out in the area. This includes patrols by NHW members and local residents, as well as local police officers and PCSOs. Home CCTV is also being seriously considered by some residents and the police are offering advice on this aspect of household security.

Please keep your eyes and ears open for any suspicious activity in Enford and do try to look out of your windows regularly during the evenings, especially if you hear any noise outside. I hope this is a one off, isolated, incident but it pays to be vigilant and I am sure none of us want incidents of this appalling nature and seriousness to happen in Enford again!?

**USE OF EAST CHISENBURY PUBLIC ROAD**

***Below is the reply from Major E J Lyons (Retd) Garrison Adjutant, Trenchard Lines, in response to my letter dated 25th October 2007. Please accept my apologies for the late submission to the Newsletter.***

**USE OF EAST CHISENBURY PUBLIC ROAD**

1. Thank you for your letter dated 25th October 2007 which I received on return from annual leave, hence the delay in replying.

2. The issues that you raised in your letter were first raised by various parties in June 1997 and raised again over the years since 1997.

3. Since 1997 we have taken the following action:

Published details regularly on our Routine Orders prohibiting Military Vehicles from Trenchard Lines using the minor road through East Chisenbury. (We do not have the authority to ban every military vehicle from other camps from using this road).

Publish details regularly on our Routine Orders advising military and civilian staff from Trenchard Lines not to use the minor road through Chisenbury.

Please find attached a copy of our orders.

We have previously requested the Ministry of Defence Police and Wiltshire Constabulary to set up 'Radar Patrols' on that road. Unfortunately the response was not as positive as we, or the residents from East Chisenbury would have liked.

An extract from the response from the MOD Police and Wiltshire Constabulary was

'You are advised that the minor road through East Chisenbury is a public road and can be used legally by any motorist who holds a current valid driving licence, that the vehicle is properly taxed, insured and where applicable holds a valid MOT certificate.'

4. I would also like to advise you that we have conducted several traffic surveys and discovered that this road is used frequently by commercial traffic plus residents from Upavon village and other local villages. We also noted that 'A' crossing is also a popular shortcut despite the potholes.

5. My personal view is that the back road through East Chisenbury is a dangerous road due mainly to speeding motorists who do not appear to be aware of the very dangerous turn at the Red Lion Pub and at the bridge near this pub. I avoid this road at all costs since a local resident hit my exterior mirror at great speed and then failed to stop to discuss the accident. You will see from the attached notice that we publish monthly within Trenchard Lines that I also strongly urge other motorists to do the same.

6. Have you considered asking your local police to occasionally move their 'radar speed van' from the not so dangerous A345 through Upavon Village to the more dangerous East Chisenbury road?

7. I am sorry that our response could not be more helpful but would remind you that the road is a public road, which the public are entitled to use as frequently as they wish.

## Birding Notes from Salisbury Plain



Most years Salisbury Plain can boast some good birding stories. This year there have been more than usual, with some exceptional ones to spice up the annals of natural history on the Plain.

While the wider conservation world has been investigating further releases of Cranes and Sea Eagles to bolster the existing small populations in East Anglia and Scotland respectively, who would have thought that both species would drop in to visit us?

But maybe it's the reputation of Salisbury Plain spreading that we had a Crane actually land for a short while on Messrs. Rawlins farm in the Avon Valley after it had been seen flying over Stonehenge earlier in the day.

I also put this down to the good mixed farming by the Rawlins brothers who happen to be one of the best Lapwing friendly farmers on the Plain. Unfortunately, the very poor weather this year has not been good for Lapwings which have had a poor breeding season.

The weather may however be a factor in the arrival of a juvenile Sea Eagle which has been with us for a few weeks. It has in its visit been using farmland to the East of the Plain but roosting at times on the estate. The apparently cold weather may have pushed this juvenile out from its high Scandinavian home. Other pointers to this weather pattern are the high numbers of Brambling which are joining the Chaffinches foraging beneath the Beech trees on the western side of the Plain as I write.

Who could forget the appalling weather we had after the false dawn of April which had a major negative affect on the success of some of our breeding birds. Yet there was good news of ongoing improvements in Populations of birds which have been historically at artificially low numbers in this part of the world. A successful breeding attempt by Raven's on the East of the Plain was confirmed by Rob Hayden who successfully ringed the healthy clutch



Having seen Curlew chicks on the Plain In 2000 when we were undertaking our breeding bird survey I have been keen to confirm them breeding again. With possibly three pairs around this year my hopes were high, but hard looking to find chicks in tall grassland is not easy even if they do stand taller than most chicks! However with the help of some sharp eyes from one of our farmers, Nick Adams located a potential breeding site which we later confirmed by seeing two chicks close to their anticipated fledging date one of which we were able to ring. The importance of these few pairs has been heightened by us being able to put this record in context. The publication of the long awaited 'Birds of Wiltshire' just goes to show how few Curlew breed in the county let alone breed on the Downs.

And finally you can see my favourite Stone Curlew. This chick was the final one ringed this season by me. It is the 100th and last chick to be ringed this year in Wessex and I had to fight off the marauding hordes of the RSPB to get it under my belt. More importantly it was reared on the West of the Plain at a new site not used in previous years. This is the culmination of over ten years of planning which has resulted in an expansion of range the third objective of MOD's Stone Curlew plan. Interestingly unlike the poor breeding success of Lapwing this year the Stone Curlew didn't do too badly and chicks put on weight very rapidly, possibly due to the wet weather meaning there were plenty of earthworms to feed upon.

However, this chick was hatched very late in the day and with cool and dry weather into October he had a bit of a rough time being underweight on the two occasions that I weighed him to check on his progress. However by my timings of when I first saw him and when I last saw the adults (which was after most other birds had migrated) I am certain he fledged successfully. Unfortunately this was not good enough for the record keepers, so we live in hope that he returns in the coming years when we can check his colour rings and confirm more success with conservation measures on Salisbury Plain.

The study of bird migration is a fascinating one, and I have for many years been amazed by the story of the Lesser Whitethroat which instead of heading South and crossing into Africa by the direct route retains an archaic migration route eastwards which goes round the eastern end of the Mediterranean. Not only does it do this indicating how it colonised some time in the past but it also evolved a different ecology which allows it to find a niche without competing with its close relatives. But how often can we confirm this research with hard facts, especially when very few of the thousands of birds ringed are ever re-trapped, let alone Lesser Whitethroats which are not caught in very

high numbers. Well this most remarkable thing happened this year when Graham Deacon caught a Lesser Whitethroat with a Jordanian ring on his patch near Westdown Camp. The bird was ringed on the 14<sup>th</sup> March at the Azraq Wetlands, 3845 Km from us and 52 days later Graham caught it again! A fantastic story.

**TRAINING:** The first three weeks of March will be busy but from the Easter weekend onwards it will be relatively quiet. The first week of the month sees two battle groups based on 2 Royal Gurkha Rifles and 2 Rifles on exercise Wessex Warrior. The following week sees a heavy armoured exercise from the Land Warfare Centre and an AS90 Regiment starting a two week live firing conversion. This may be noisy but, as always, we will be monitoring the decibel level and moving gun positions as necessary. Also during the week before Easter there will be some armoured squadron and armoured infantry company training across the plain.

**NOTE:** Due to unforeseen changes there is always a possibility that there could be firing on other of the days listed. This is particularly so now operational training is being conducted to meet many and varied exigencies. The public should be careful to check that Red Flags are not flying before they enter the range. It is the time of the year when we change late night firing times. From March through to October the Tue, Thurs and Sat night firing times will revert back to 2330hrs.

**HELICOPTER NIGHT FLYING** : Night flying will normally take place Mondays -Thursdays inclusive over parts of the training area dependent on the weather and the availability of range space. In some cases the aircraft will show no lights but will operate under strict area control

**AIR ACTIVITIES** : Dates and timings given below are those listed at the time of printing but may be altered due to aircraft serviceability or weather conditions.

**AIRCRAFT TRIALS:**

Aircraft may conduct trials over Larkhill Range on each Wed and Fri from 1200 - 1700 hrs which could involve circuits to the East crossing the Avon Valley.

**LARKHILL CENTRE RANGE ROAD**

The old Devizes to Salisbury road will be closed in the Larkhill/ Westdown Impact Area from 21st to 25th March (inclusive) to allow hazardous scrub clearance work to be completed safely.

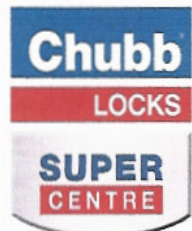
