It is also very important that you keep your dog under control at this time of year in areas which may be inhabited by deer. It is quite normal for young deer to be left on their own for long periods of time. –

THE NEW ENFORD VILLAGE HALL MORE GOOD NEWS!

We now have confirmed funding of £330,000 towards the overall project cost of about £490,000. We are well on the way to having a new hall next year!! It is planned to go to tender in June ready to start building in early September, with completion next April or May.

The BIG Lottery came down from Birmingham for a site visit and a meeting at the beginning of April. They discussed the project in great detail and were very sympathetic about the dilapidated state of the current building.

The BIG Lottery received applications from all around the country for Stage I of the application process totalling £600m for their designated £50m Capital Cost Grants Fund for Village Halls. They assessed all these applications carefully and reduced the number of projects down to a value of £60m to go through to Stage II of the application process. We did extremely well against the competition and are one of the projects which got through to Stage II. Following a lot of work last autumn putting together a new business plan and feasibility study for the Lottery, they have been down for the site visit and are now vetting the technical side of the project and building work. The Board sits on 22nd May and we should hear the result soon afterwards. Please keep all fingers crossed!

The next step being planned by the Committee is a fund raising programme to include "Buy A Brick" and to contribute to the other essentials we will need for the new hall. We would like to buy new tables and chairs, crockery, cutlery and equipment for toddler and children's playgroups. Details for the fund raising plan will be published in the June Newsletter. A very big Thank You to Margaret Webb and all the sponsors who supported her 'English Channel Challenge' sponsored swim in aid of the new village hall fund – she swam 1,400 lengths of the swimming pool - equivalent to starting from Shakespeare Beach at Dover and finishing at Cap Gris Nez, Calais. Margaret raised over £500 which was a fantastic result!

The hedgerows around the recreation ground need clearing of dead trees and undergrowth, and we are looking for volunteers to come up a couple of weekends during the summer to help with this work. Again further details will be published in June. But in the meantime if you would like to volunteer please let one of the Committee Members know – coffee and sandwiches provided!!

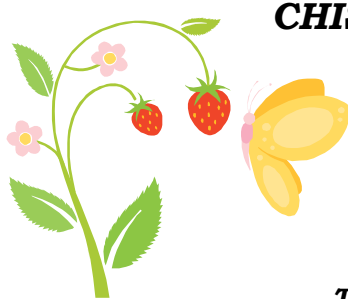

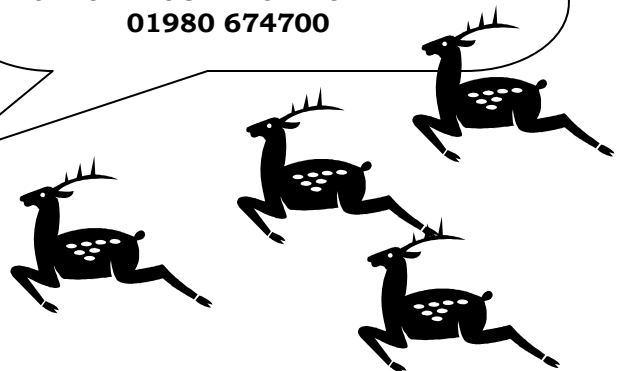

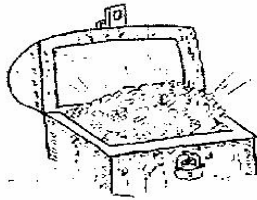

Hello Enford Residents.

The A345 (Road Surface)

We have managed to get inserted into the Pewsey Area Living Plan 2008-2018 the concerns of the condition of the road surface and its fast deterioration. The Living Plan is a document made up of all types of concerns and awareness and it is a knock on the door to Wiltshire County Council for Action.

The A345 (Road Speed)

As you must be aware we have managed again to get the "SID" Unit (Check Your Speed) deployed on the north side of the 30mph zone this has worked quite well and has had a back up from the police mobile camera unit on several occasions over the past 30 days. This SID Unit is the only one of its kind in the Wiltshire County. Whilst it has worked well for the those who don't know the area, the habitual users get used to it and ignore it and hack through as usual. The Police are quite aware of this situation.

The C32 Village Connection Lane "SPEED"

Again we have managed to get the speed problem inserted in the Pewsey Area Living Plan and this will stay in the plan until something is achieved. The Speed Strategy Document 2007 published by Wiltshire County Council suggests that we may be able to get the problem on the agenda with reviewing the 60mph national speed limit and a 20mph speed limit of areas of population. This would take in Coombe, Coombe Lane, Long Street and Enford Village, Enford Hill, Water Lane, Littlecott and East Chisenbury. A letter from the Parish Council is being sent "again" with a copy of our original survey and letter which was sent in August 2007.

Things will not happen overnight and will be a gradual process because what the Government of the day says and what the County Council does all comes down to funding and I am afraid the process will be very slow but we will shout a lot and rattle cages and in the end they will get fed up with the "DIN" so bear with us, the Parish Council are on the case.

I have attached to this bulletin a letter from The Pewsey Area Community Planning Partnership which was sent to the Chief Constable of Wiltshire regarding deaths and Injuries on Wiltshire's Highways. This serious situation was raised at the last meeting of the Partnership and it was suggested that we made our concerns to the new Chief Constable for the reinstating of the Highways Police to their original "FULL STRENGTH".

Safe Motoring to All.

And please remember the police have told us that they will be carrying out random speed checks on the A345 at Enford Hill and on the C32.

Dear Chief Inspector Carter,

Re: Road Casualties on Wiltshire's Highways.

As I started to write this letter it was just announced on BBC Radio Wiltshire that another person has lost their life and a young 9 year old boy is fighting for his life after being airlifted to hospital after a road traffic accident on the A303 at Mere yesterday afternoon, this just adds another fatality and serious injuries to the statistics for 2008 which is rising month by month.

The continuing escalation of deaths and serious injuries that are occurring due to vehicle collisions was raised at the Pewsey Area Community Planning Partnership meeting on Thursday 13th March 2008. It was agreed that we should write to you on this serious situation.

The amount of deaths on Wiltshire's roads during 2006 was 25 this increased to 44 during 2007 and at the present rate of accidents during the first few months of 2008 it will surpass the 2007 toll.

The quoted cost of road casualties on Wiltshire's roads during 2006 was 155 Million pounds plus. These figures are calculated by the Wiltshire and Swindon Road Safety Partnership on guidance from the Highway Authority. These figures are not a true costing as there would appear to be some anomalies. One of our local Parish Councils carried out their own survey between 16/01/06 and 12/07/07 and compared these results with the official list supplied for the same period, there are a large number of accidents not recorded on official lists which, as you will be aware, do not include those RTAs where no injury occurs and are therefore not reported.

What is causing this serious increase in road traffic accidents? The common factor is the very poor standard of driving which is not attributed to any one age group but across the board of motorists. This situation is due largely to the huge reduction of police staffing levels resulting in severe cuts in the Traffic Police Unit and Highway Police Patrol personnel. All that is now possible is a token presence after the accident has occurred. These Police Traffic Units which were once present on the highways, monitored the standards of driving, giving out cautions and written offence notes to the erring motorists. These Police Units were observed by passing motorists and maintained some sense of driving safety along the highways and was a wake up call to those who were flouting the highways laws.

Generating fines electronically from cameras and sending them by post does not have the same impact as being pulled over by the police traffic unit and being given an ear wiggling or accepting a ticket whilst also being observed by other passing road users, this was a real wake up call for those who got caught breaking the law and also for the observing passing motorists.

Previously Patrolling Police Units drew attention of motoring public to more careful and regulated driving. The absence of these units encourages non observance of the Highway Code as there is far less chance of being caught. Combine this to the 2 to 3 million untaxed (which is a considerable loss of tax revenue) it gives some idea as to how the situation has deteriorated to the present low levels. This worrying increase in accident levels cannot all be attributed to reduced numbers of road traffic police but is a significant contributory factor.

Reinstating Police Traffic Units to their past full strength establishment numbers would, in our view, reduce the number of road accidents and therefore save lives and be cost effective in revenue terms and help prevent bad and careless driving.

We think that failure to reinstate these officers will only exacerbate the bad driving standards and increase the death toll on the roads of Wiltshire. The Partnership requests that you look carefully at this problem and, if possible, bring the Police Traffic Units back to the strength they once were.

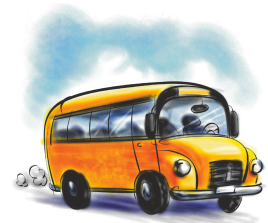

Our Travels in Central America and Cuba (cont)

Through another border and in to Nicaragua – another beautiful country. We'd been warned to keep a sharp eye on our valuables as even a camera could set a local person up for a long time. We encountered nothing but a friendly curiosity and I had one of my best wildlife experiences there. We'd boarded a local banana boat over to the island of Ometepe, situated in the middle of Lake Nicaragua. The island is made up of two volcanoes. As we disembarked it was total chaos, people rushing to get on before everyone had got off, banana-laden lorries edging their way through the melee, and as we struggled off with our bags, Terry got hit by a reversing lorry. The driver was obviously assuming that nothing was behind him. Fortunately it only caught the inside of his arm and, apart from a lot of swelling and bruising, he was fine.

We checked into the hotel and went out to find a shop to replenish our water and soft drink supplies, (we'd bought duty-free rum at the border crossing). We'd been told there was a shop around the corner so off we went – no sign of a shop (which is not that unusual anywhere in Central America. More often than not you can peer into what you think will be a private house, only to find a shop of some sort.) We walked into a building with two large wooden doors and found, in the middle of the floor, one sealed crate of water, one of beer and one of lemonade. We helped ourselves to what we needed, went to the next room where a group of people were sitting around chatting, and paid. We were greeted by some rather strange looks, but that was not so unusual, and off we went – only to be told by the hotel proprietor that we hadn't gone far enough to find the shop! We must have raided someone's party supplies!

We explored the island the next day, passing ladies washing clothes in the river, next to a herd of cows that were, er, drinking 'etc' a little further upstream! We walked up to visit a coffee plantation, on up and up until we came to some ancient petroglyphs hidden in the jungle. Unfortunately I slipped on a wet trail and got myself caught up in some rusty barbed wire which ripped my little finger open in three places.

In the evening we clambered into the back of a local lorry to take us past a beach famed for its sunsets. While we were waiting we walked around the lake with our binoculars, watching herons and kingfishers. We later got distracted by the sounds of two groups of howler monkeys calling to each other across the valley. Suddenly one started very, very close to us. We were trying to find out just where he was when one of the local wildlife guides came along the trail looking for us as we were going to miss the sunset. We explained and he offered to take us to see them. We didn't realise then just how far we'd have to trek, back around the lake, double back up into the undergrowth, an uphill struggle all the way, until eventually we came out into a clearing and there they were! We counted nine – close enough to clearly see them 'howling' just feet away. Wow!

Needless to say the trek back down to the beach was absolutely nerve-wracking as it was by this time totally dark in the undergrowth. But we made it. This turned out to be one of the highlights of the trip. Certainly took away the pain from my cut finger. After some treatment and dressing it only needed time to heal. We were warned though that in hot and humid environments this could take a lot longer than at home.

Arriving back to the mainland rather battered but very happy, we went on to Granada, a beautiful town of Spanish Colonial style. Again much work is being done to renovate the buildings. Shame the people can't be better looked after by the Government. I always feel that, as a tourist, our money will hopefully go towards improving their health and education, but at the same time feeling that we are helping to change their lives, not always for the good.

The night before we were moving on, I caught my toe in a hole in the 'pavement', (pretty much non-existent as we know them, due to earthquakes) fell, and ended up needing stitches in my face. This was definitely not an experience I would care to repeat. I was taken to a dark and dingy clinic somewhere outside town to be greeted by a large lady of African descent, dressed in tight jodhpurs and a dirty "Chilly Willy" emblazoned tunic, who'd been sitting outside on a bench watching the world go by.

She took me inside, led me to an old-fashioned leather trolley bed covered with a grimy sheet, with some blood-stained metal steps leading up to it and I lay down, staring up at the 12" strip light thinking "I think I'd rather die than be treated here".

I took the chance to look around while she was out of the room.

There were no actual doors or windows in the clinic, just bare block walls painted dark blue with brown slime. The ceiling was a paler blue, difficult to tell through the dead insects and mosquitoes. Someone came in from outside and peered down at me and then wandered off again. I was just about to get up to leave when the lady came back with a tray of medical equipment. She put on some sterile gloves and started to poke my eyebrow, opening and closing the rather painful gash! Her little finger then pushed down onto my closed eyelid to the extent that I was sure I'd be blinded!

Needless to say the trek back down to the beach was absolutely nerve-wracking as it was by this time totally dark in the undergrowth. But we made it. This turned out to be one of the highlights of the trip. Certainly took away the pain from my cut finger. After some treatment and dressing it only needed time to heal. We were warned though that in hot and humid environments this could take a lot longer than at home.

Arriving back to the mainland rather battered but very happy, we went on to Granada, a beautiful town of Spanish Colonial style. Again much work is being done to renovate the buildings. Shame the people can't be better looked after by the Government. I always feel that, as a tourist, our money will hopefully go towards improving their health and education, but at the same time feeling that we are helping to change their lives, not always for the good.

The night before we were moving on, I caught my toe in a hole in the 'pavement', (pretty much non-existent as we know them, due to earthquakes) fell, and ended up needing stitches in my face. This was definitely not an experience I would care to repeat. I was taken to a dark and dingy clinic somewhere outside town to be greeted by a large lady of African descent, dressed in tight jodhpurs and a dirty "Chilly Willy" emblazoned tunic, who'd been sitting outside on a bench watching the world go by.

She took me inside, led me to an old-fashioned leather trolley bed covered with a grimy sheet, with some blood-stained metal steps leading up to it and I lay down, staring up at the 12" strip light thinking "I think I'd rather die than be treated here".

I took the chance to look around while she was out of the room.

There were no actual doors or windows in the clinic, just bare block walls painted dark blue with brown slime. The ceiling was a paler blue, difficult to tell through the dead insects and mosquitoes. Someone came in from outside and peered down at me and then wandered off again. I was just about to get up to leave when the lady came back with a tray of medical equipment. She put on some sterile gloves and started to poke my eyebrow, opening and closing the rather painful gash! Her little finger then pushed down onto my closed eyelid to the extent that I was sure I'd be blinded!

I just wanted to know when the doctor was going to arrive!

I was then told the news! She IS the doctor! Chilly Willy tunic, jodhpurs and all.

She then stitched me up. I think I was past caring by this time. After an injection, painkillers, antibiotic ointments and tablets I was brought back to the hotel. Now there was a question mark over whether I'd be able to travel on the next day. I asked for some ice as my face was already turning a strange colour and my eye was swollen. Someone eventually came back with 3 mini-icebergs!!!! I've never seen such huge chunks of ice and could not even imagine where they may have come from. So off I went, lay down, by this time it was 1.30 in the morning, trying to balance a block of ice on my, rather tender by this time, face. I managed to hold it for about two hours on my eyebrow before sleep eventually overtook me, and I woke up in a pool of icy water about two hours later.

However, when I did get up in the morning, a lot of the swelling had gone and I felt fine, just a glimmer of a headache, but ready to face an eight hour bus journey to our next destination via Managua, which I'd been looking forward to seeing. 90% of the town had been annihilated in the earthquake of 1972 so much of it is just a modern sprawl of buildings. The old palace and cathedral are still standing and I stood wondering what it must have been like to be caught up in something so dreadful. We went to the crater overlooking the town - it's just a placid lagoon now.

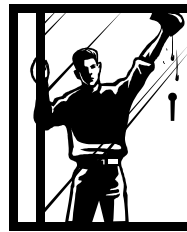

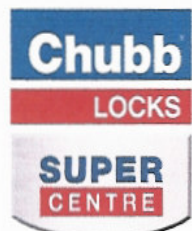
