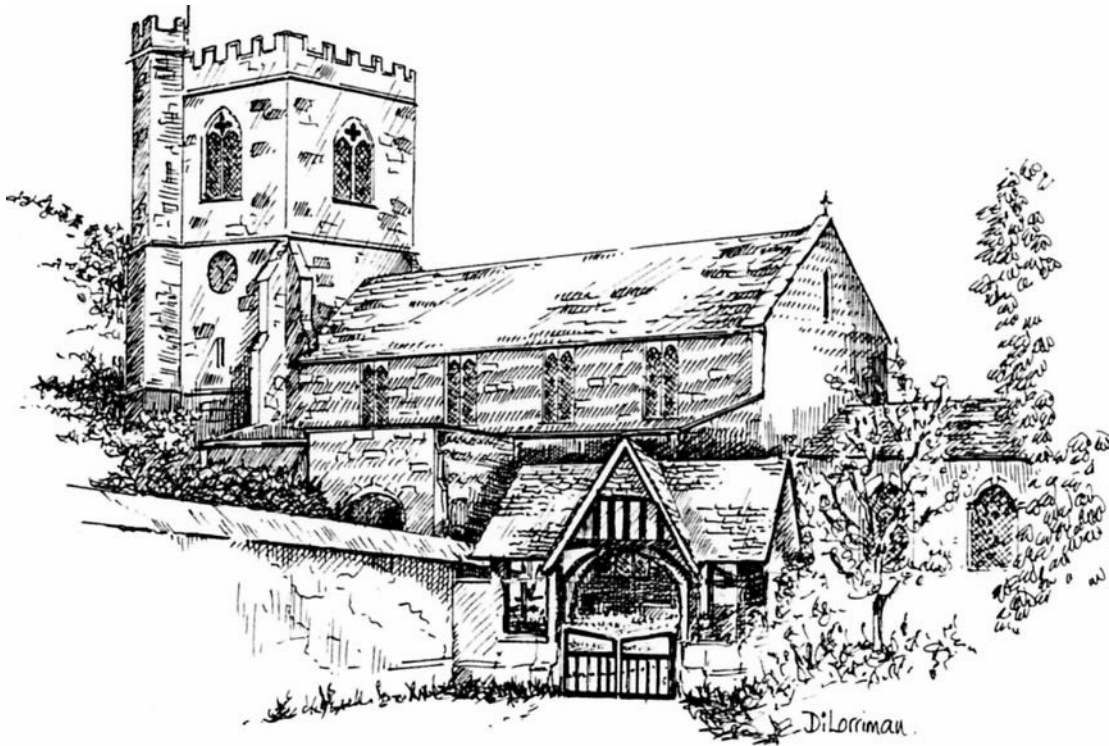

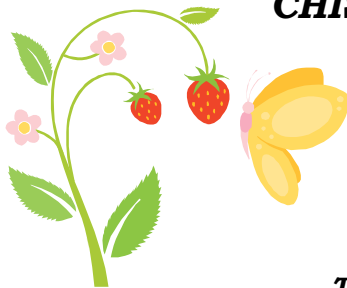

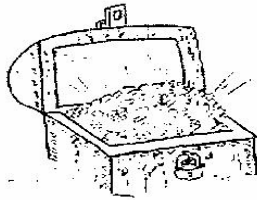

VISIT TO WILTSHIRE HIGHWAYS DEPOT

On 29th April, Stan Bagwell and I visited the Wiltshire Highways Depot in Marlborough. All Parish Councils in the area were invited to send representatives. Instead of a presentation by a person in a suit, we were shown around in groups and given a talk/demonstration by the people who work there.

The first thing on the agenda was a tour around a 'Green Goddess'. The Highways Department purchased 3 from the Army at a very cheap price. They were first made around 1952 and have been in storage, with occasional use (like Firemen's Strikes etc) ever since. When purchased, they only had around 3,000 miles on the clock - after 56 years !! The machines were still in the original Army paint and almost like new. Only the hoses had been changed. Apparently, they are unpleasant to drive. However, the Highways Department are really happy with them as they are incredibly efficient at clearing flooding. They pump very high volumes of water away very quickly. A good buy. Stan and I were impressed.

The next thing we were shown was a gritting machine. It was very 'high tech' in the cab. Although it looked new, in fact, it started life as a co-op truck. It was converted by removing the truck body, and then fitting all the gritting equipment when Highways purchased it.

Then, on to road mending. We had a demonstration of pothole filling, using the latest material, which is water rather than solvent based. This material can be used on water filled potholes and is permanent. The staff member demonstrating it was very enthusiastic about this latest stuff.

Also demonstrated was the gulley cleaning equipment, which was also an impressive bit of kit. It did what it said on the label. (We did mention Enford whilst we were talking to the staff !!).

Later on, we were shown the office. There was a computerised mapping system which kept track of every vehicle they owned, using some sort of tracker. It saved a lot of money and time when moving vehicles onto the next priority job. The staff were very knowledgeable about all the places/villages in their area. The system of handling calls (like the ones which are passed to C.L.A.R.E.N.C.E) was geared to prioritising jobs. We were shown the latest digital pens used by the Parish Wardens, whereby they can make a sketch, take a photo and send sketch and photo down the line using a mobile 'phone. This would show the exact situation on the ground immediately to the office.

The staff were all very friendly, knowledgeable and obviously enjoyed their work. All in all, a pleasant and interesting visit.

Our Travels in Central America and Cuba (cont)

On then to Leon, another old Spanish town - without the UNESCO money. Nothing much had changed since the earthquake and it reminded me of a bombsite – most buildings half demolished, still blackened by the earthquake, non existent pavements and concrete roads full of deep potholes. We had quite a job finding somewhere to eat here and finished up in the one and only restaurant. This had been our hottest day, over 40 degrees and high humidity. Not the best of days for me, struggling with a head injury in such heat in one of the worst places we'd seen. However the restaurant came up with a decent chicken meal and a half decent bottle of wine so we couldn't complain.

We left Nicaragua and entered Honduras, heading for its capital city, which has the most attractive name Tegucigalpa. The city itself proved rather less attractive. We shouldn't walk around alone, there were no decent places to eat etc etc. – not a place I wanted to spend a lot of time in because of the tales we'd heard along the way about buses being hijacked by bandits, people getting pistol-whipped if they retaliated or refused to hand over money and cameras etc. The most dangerous stretch of highway was to be faced after our flight out to Roatan, another Caribbean island I'd been looking forward to. It turned out to be just what we needed after the rigours of the previous few days!

Unfortunately I couldn't snorkel because of my injury, in spite of the 'doctor's assurances that there wouldn't be a problem. Apparently, because the water is so warm there and the reef is so shallow, there is a lot of bacteria in the water which could infect my wound. Knowing how much further we planned to go and how much longer we would be on the road, I had to content myself with swimming in the shallows rather than going out to the reef – supposedly the second best after the Great Barrier Reef. I felt quite relieved when the snorkellers came back disappointed with what they'd seen. Nothing different from what we'd seen in other places!

The break on the beach did revive us and we were soon ready to see some more of Honduras before moving into Guatemala. We braced ourselves for the dangerous stretch of road that was being constantly plagued with bandits. Pointless trying to hide anything on the bus or on our person so we just kept fingers crossed and hoped for the best. Needless to say nothing untoward happened and we arrived at Copan, a major Mayan site.

Again, security was tight as various people had been mugged walking to the site. It's perfectly understandable when these impoverished people watch wealthy tourists strolling along without, seemingly, a care in the world and to know how far a few dollars would go in their own pocket. Copan is one of the many ancient Mayan cities dotted around Central America and, apart from the ruins, I was pleased to come across lots of brightly coloured macaws in the trees, and agoutis, large rodents about the size of a badger, rummaging around in the undergrowth.

We then carried on to the border and crossed into Guatemala with the cloud hanging low over the mountains. After an hour or so we were allowed through the border crossing and had a stunning drive down through the mountains, a little nerve wracking too on this road with its steep drops and deep concrete ditches. We passed one big lorry on its side, cab crushed, obviously having taken the bend too quickly. We came across lots of rock falls covering part of the road. There just isn't the money to send people out to move these huge boulders. Every time there is heavy rainfall landslides cover the road.

We passed through the large industrial city of Guatemala and arrived in Antigua, a very beautiful town, Spanish Colonial again, but very clean and well cared for. There was a buzz of excitement going through the town. Big preparations for the Holy Week pilgrimage through the surrounding areas culminating in the central square outside the cathedral, we were told.

Needless to say we had to stay for that and it was quite a sight to see, hundreds of people dressed as Roman soldiers, followed by priests and then the huge plinth holding the statue of Jesus carrying the cross carried by approximately 50 young priests. They were swaying from side to side to enable them to carry this enormous weight. This was followed by the nuns carrying a smaller plinth of the Virgin Mary. These catholic parades and pilgrimages are apparently quite a common occurrence here as they are in Spain, Cyprus and Greece. With the backdrop of the volcano, topped with a cap of fluffy cloud, and the mountains bathed in the evening sunshine, it was an amazing spectacle.

After spending some time travelling around the surrounding countryside, which again is absolutely stunning with its volcanoes and lakes, we said our goodbyes to Central America and headed off to Cuba – but that's another story

Magistrates Court; £50,000 fine and/or 12 months imprisonment.

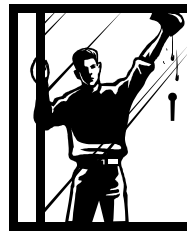

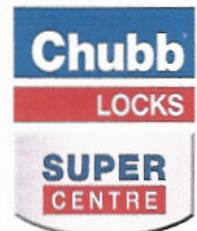
