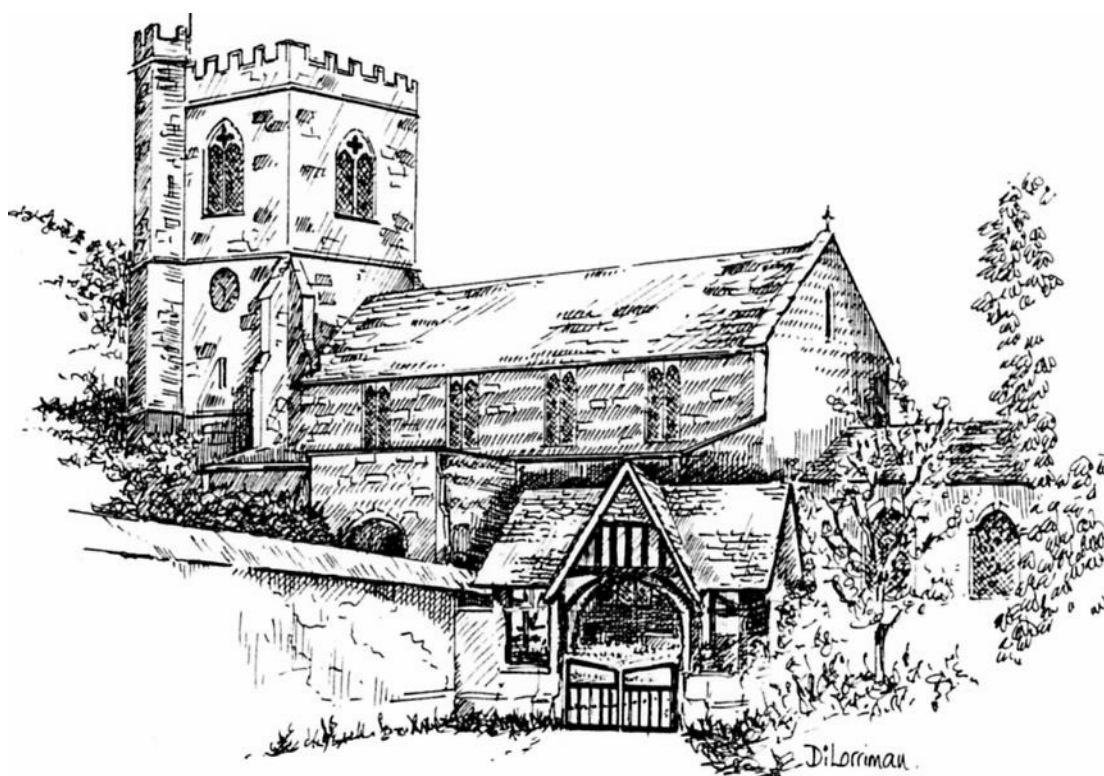

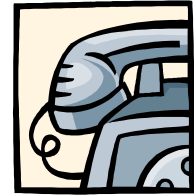

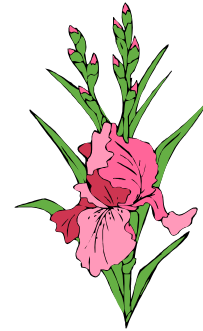
ENFORD NEWSLETTER ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2008

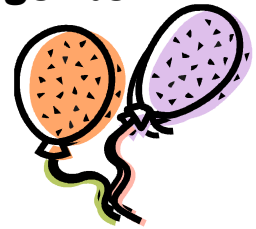


ENFORD VILLAGE HALL

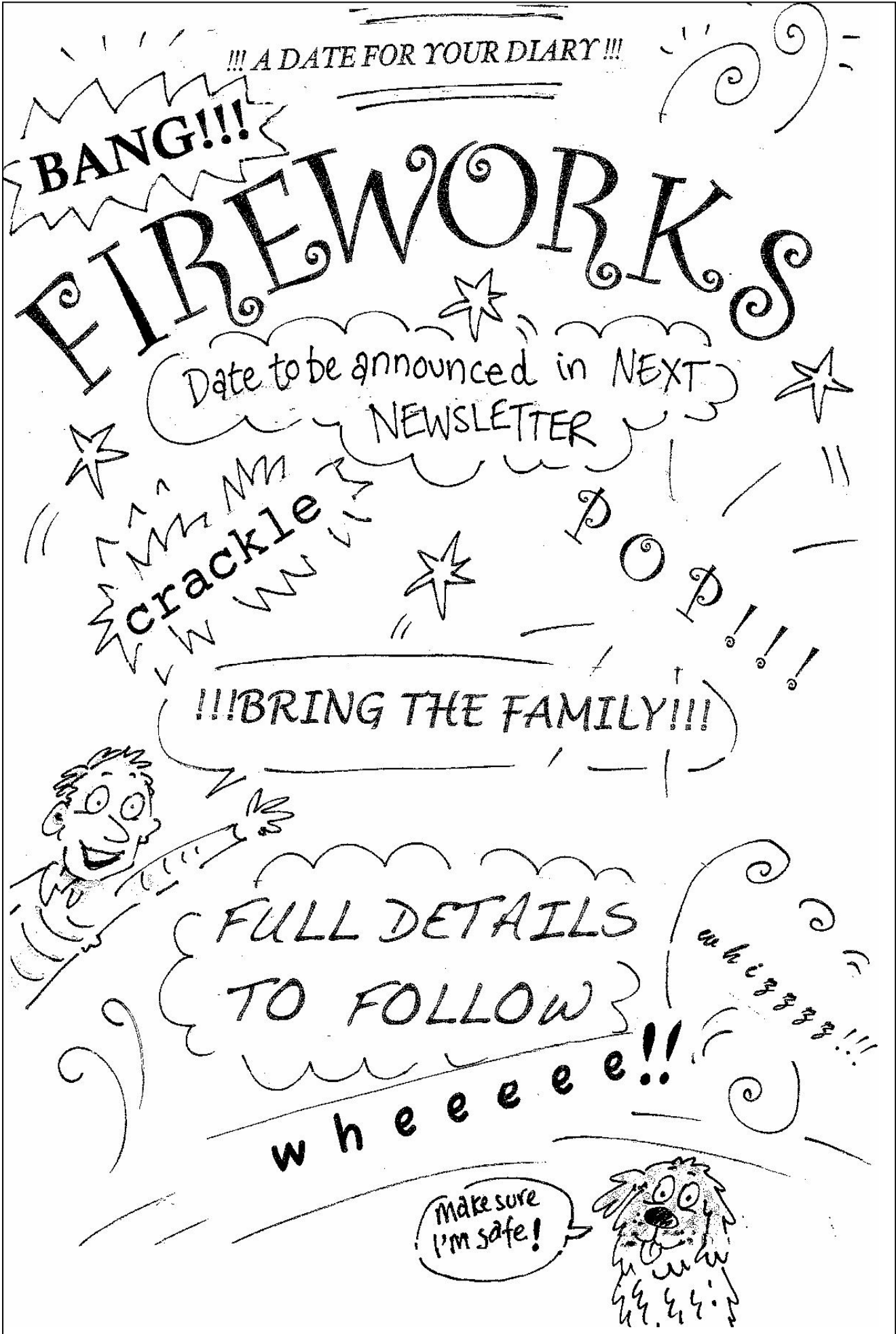

Neighbourhood Priorities

April - June Pewsey Rural NPT Priorities

1. Tackling Drugs

The Pewsey Rural NPT has assisted in executing a search warrant at a house. Class "A" drugs were found at the premises and a male was arrested.

2. Speeding.

The NPT are working with villagers in Enford to monitor traffic speed in this village and there will be interesting developments on this subject to report on in the near future.

3. Underage Drinking/ASB-Netheravon.

One male from Netheravon has been arrested for ASB acts and has been referred to the Kennet Anti Social Behaviour Forum. The forum aims to provide a multi agency approach to tackling ASB offenders more successfully.

Pewsey Village NPT Priorities

1. Tackling Drugs.

The Pewsey Village NPT has been gathering some good intelligence, with a view to seeking search warrants where appropriate.

2. Graffiti/Vandalism

There has been a marked reduction in graffiti in the village recently. Patrols at the relevant locations and information from the public have helped to reduce the problem to zero recorded offences of this type in the last month.

3. Parking-Broomcroft Roundabout / North Street.

The placement of police "No Waiting" cones in this area has had a marked effect on improving traffic flow through the centre of Pewsey. A few unlucky motorists who deliberately ignored the cones have found themselves the recipients of Fixed Penalty Tickets.

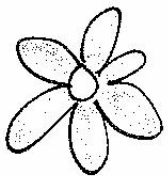

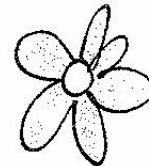

This substance was given the name penicillin and has been responsible for almost wiping out tuberculosis as a killer disease.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

1. My responsibilities extend to sitting on the Regulatory Committee at 3-week intervals to consider planning applications from across the Kennet area which the officers of Kennet District Council may not decide personally under current rules.
2. The current system is fairly simple.
 - a. Householder and non-householder applications are sent to Kennet District Council for consideration. The Parish Council and adjacent householders are informed by letter. I receive email notification. A notice is pinned nearby, often on a fence. Kennet have a target to deal with applications within 8 weeks.
 - b. The Parish Council gives its opinion and states whether it objects. Local people may support or object to the application: to the Parish Council by letter and/or direct to Kennet DC by letter or internet. If you are a lone objector you will be ignored so you should explain your objection to the District Councillor.
 - c. As your District Councillor I have a right to insist that an application goes to committee rather than be determined by Kennet staff. For householder applications an objection by the Parish Council is ignored unless supported by the District Councillor.
3. I am always available to give advice to an applicant or to an objector, or to the Parish Council. Please see my contact details below.
I am not in a position to state before a Kennet Regulatory meeting whether I will vote for or against a particular application otherwise I will have 'fettered my discretion' and be unable to vote. It's not a pleasant task to disagree with the opinion of a Parish Council or parishioner but on a small number of occasions I have had to do so. On others I have defeated a poor recommendation by Kennet staff. It is a double-edged sword!
4. This system will stay in place until the new unitary Wiltshire Council takes over on 1st April 2009. Thereafter Community Area Boards may determine applications. There will be new elections for Unitary Councillors at this time. Should I be your 'divisional' councillor after the elections I will advise you of the new system.

NEW UNITARY WILTSHIRE COUNCIL

The Officers and Members of County and District Councils across Wiltshire have proposed the following Parishes for this 'division' based on the criteria of approximately 3700 voters for every division :-

Chute, Chute Forest, Collingbourne Ducis, Collingbourne Kingston, Enford, Everleigh, Fittleton, Netheravon, Tidcombe & Fosbury.

Myself and the Parish Chairmen of the present Netheravon Ward have written to the Government's Boundary Committee to say that the common community is in the Avon Valley and that the proposals did not produce a community whose community identity revolved around the Avon valley.

We were ignored!

I have written again protesting that the inclusion of Chute, Chute Forest and Tidcombe & Fosbury will lead to an excessive amount of travelling for the future councillor, particularly at night across poor, unlit, roads in winter attending Parish meetings and Area Community/Board meetings. The carbon footprint and councillor safety are other considerations to be borne in mind.

I have suggested to the Boundary Committee that Figheldean Parish be substituted for Chute, Chute Forest & Tidcombe and Fosbury, and further that Milston be substituted for Everleigh. This would create a fairly compact division across the Avon and Bourne valleys.

We'll see if they listen or ignore us! A decision is expected in October 2008.

The new Wiltshire Unitary Council takes over on 1st April 2009.

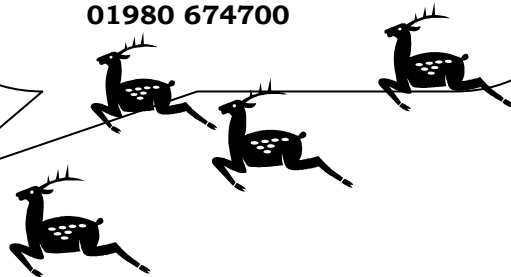

Lammas Day

In English-speaking countries in the Northern Hemisphere, August 1 is **Lammas Day** (loaf-mass day), the festival of the first wheat harvest of the year. On this day it was customary to bring to church a loaf made from the new crop. In many parts of England, tenants were bound to present freshly harvested wheat to their landlords on or before the first day of August. In the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle, where it is referred to regularly, it is called "the feast of first fruits". The blessing of new fruits was performed annually in both the Eastern and Western Churches on the first, or the sixth, of August. The Sacramentary of Pope Gregory I (d. 604) specifies the sixth.

TRAINING: August will be a very quiet month with the Plain mainly being used by various battalions of the Army Cadet Force. There will be a trial involving unmanned aircraft and various other equipments in, over and around Copehill Down Village until 24th August and this area will be closely monitored to ensure that, for their own safety, civilians do not stray off the public rights of way. From 19th August through until 3rd September we will be hosting a Dutch air mobile battalion and from 26th August there will be some armoured manoeuvres on the East of the Plain.

NOTE: Due to unforeseen changes there is always a possibility that there could be firing on other of the days listed. This is particularly so now operational training is being conducted to meet many and varied exigencies. The public should be careful to check that Red Flags are not flying before they enter the range. It is the time of the year when we change late night firing times. From March through to October the Tue, Thurs and Sat night firing times will revert back to 2330hrs.



HELICOPTER NIGHT FLYING : Night flying normally takes place Mondays to Thursdays inclusive over parts of SPTA. Some aircraft will show no lights but all will operate under strict area control.

AIR ACTIVITIES : Dates and timings given below are those listed at the time of printing but may be altered due to aircraft serviceability or weather conditions.

AIRCRAFT TRIALS:

Aircraft may conduct trials over Larkhill Range on each Wed and Fri from 1200 - 1700 hrs which could involve circuits to the East crossing the Avon Valley.

PARACHUTING. : Parachute dropping is scheduled to take place on EVERLEIGH and FOX COVERT DZs during normal working hours on most weekdays. Outside working hours and at weekends the dates and approximate times are:

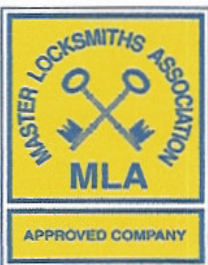
