ENFORD VILLAGE HALL

PROJECT UPDATE FROM THE TRUSTEES

The building work is on time and going well. Most of the brickwork is now complete and we are waiting for the roof trusses to be delivered. We have made a couple of changes to the original design. The first is the removal of the walls between the Meeting Room and the Main Hall. A pair of sliding partition doors will now separate the two rooms when necessary. We felt that this would be an advantage for larger groups (i.e. weddings, private parties, fundraising activities etc). The second change is to install an exterior door from the Meeting Room to the path running along the back of the building. This will enable outside caterers to deliver and remove their equipment without disturbing guests in the Hall.

Gareth Holden, one of our local technical advisers, has kindly written a short article for this Newsletter on the Ground Source Heat Pump, being installed in the Hall for the heating and hot water. We have just been advised that the grant we applied for from the Dept of Trade and Industry (their Low Carbon division) to pay for this Pump has been successful so we are adding a further £15,000 to the pot! We are hopeful that our application to the Big Lottery's Changing Spaces fund is also successful for the remaining £15,000 – we'll know about this one in January.

ACTIVITIES UPDATE

Thanks to everyone who attended the meeting in the church on Tuesday 18th November. Apologies to those who would have liked to have come, but were unable to attend at that time. For everyone who is interested in attending, **the follow up meeting will be held in the church on Tuesday 10th February 2009 at 7pm.**

A core of activities are beginning to develop, with lots of other ideas in progress. We have Pilates and yoga classes scheduled to take place; a short mat bowls club; and a gardening club incorporating a plant and produce swap. Progress is being made in setting up the structure for junior/youth football, with the need for level 1 coaches, or people interested in signing up for a coaching course.

There are several people wanting to be involved in the re-introduction of the Youth Club, so good progress is being made here. The showing of the first film through Movieola is scheduled for June 2009. There is solid interest in setting up the Parents and Toddlers group, as well as the possible introduction of children's mini tennis sessions during the summer.

Eco Corner

I was recently asked to provide some technical assistance with the energy efficient design of our new village hall. Although most of this technology is not generally in domestic use it won't be long before we are all considering it for our own houses.

The hall will be heated by a ground source heat pump; to most people this will mean absolutely nothing! But, you are already using the technology, just in reverse. It's called a fridge.

Your fridge chills the air inside with an evaporator, the cold pipe inside at the back. Heat is then rejected out of the pipe round the back; this bit is called the condenser. (Incidentally if the back of your fridge is too close to the wall and doesn't have a good air gap heat won't be rejected and your fridge will be less efficient and use more electricity.)

The ground source heat pump, which will be used in the hall, will have a heat exchanger. This will chill the ground (like the evaporator in the back of your fridge) through 3 boreholes, which will be drilled to a depth of 70 metres.

Heat will then be rejected (this is similar to the condenser on the back of your fridge, which has moved a little further away from the wall!) into water, which is circulated around the hall for heating.

I can hear you saying 'this is all well and good but a boiler sounds much less complicated'

The advantage of a heat pump is its efficiency. For every 1 kw of electricity used it can produce 4 – 5 kw of heating. This means it will be considerably cheaper to heat the hall, potentially saving us up to 2,000 per year, and significantly reducing carbon emissions.

HIGHWAYS NEWS

Hello Enford Parish Residents,

The A345 (Road Surface Condition)

We are still badgering Wiltshire County Council regarding the poor surface condition of the road from Enford through to Durrington.

The C32

A letter from Enford Parish Council is being sent to Wiltshire County Council Highways regarding the meeting that took place at Long Street on the 8th August 2008 requesting a response from them regarding their suggestions for Coombe, Enford and East Chisenbury. We will keep you informed of the progress.

Community Speed Watch - Enford

Enford Parish Council is still progressing with this scheme and it is having an effect of reducing the speed through the 30mph zone along the A345. Our aim is to get the area known as a road safety check area. Once we have achieved this, those drivers who continually use the area will be aware that we will be there at sometime during the week and so will slow down observing the 30mph Gateway Zone.

The A345 30MPH Gateway Zone

The Parish Council has had a request from the residents of West Chisenbury regarding our investigating the possibility of either an extension of the 30mph speed limit to beyond West Chisenbury or a reduction of the 60mph limit to 40mph through West Chisenbury. We are at present awaiting a response from the residents of Newtown (the opposite direction) should they wish to have the same up to Newtown.

Effectively we would think that a 40mph before West Chisenbury and Newtown could be achieved, but this would all be down to W.C.C. Highways and of course funding, but the "A" and "B" road speed limits are being assessed so anything is possible. We will keep you informed.

The C32. Long Street 30mph zone - The Swan Inn Road Traffic Accident - Damage to its Ancient Sign

Enford Parish Council has written a letter to the Chief Constable of Wiltshire Police regarding the procedure of the investigating officer as to why highway offences and laws were committed and broken and no charges were made against the offending vehicle's driver. We will keep you informed.

Dear Sir.

As the side bankings of the A345 get eroded away bit by bit due to the Large Heavy Vehicles using the road, so the safe positions of the road signs get closer and closer to the carriageway. This is now quite evident along this small width road.

At Netheravon going north the village signpost with the 50mph marker has been hit and is leaning sideways. Again at Netheravon going north on the straight stretch a 50mph repeater sign has taken a hit! Just further on a R/H road entrance sign has been struck.

Again at Netheravon going north the last road entrance sign to the village has taken a huge impact and is now leaning out over towards the highway. This will soon connect with another HGV, come adrift and finish up on the carriageway

At Netheravon going south the road entrance left sign to the village has taken an impact.

Going north the Newtown sign has taken a hit and further along at Enford in the 30mph Gateway Zone a 30mph repeater sign has been knocked sideways.

Again at Enford, within the 30mph zone going north at the top of the hill, there is a British Telecomm telegraph pole that is now so close to the carriageway that eventually when TWO HGVs try to pass one another at this point, the vehicle going north will make contact with the pole and it will come down.

This damage to the road signage and poles will continue until someone realizes that this small width road is unsuitable for the large oversize overweight vehicles that are now using this route.

The commercial vehicle use of this road has been increasing year on year and there does not seem to be any respite. With this continuing use, the side banks and residents' property who live along this route will continue to be encroached upon and eventually the road signs will have to be moved outwards away from the ever increasing highway which is being gained by stealth. I do believe that there is only so far this will be allowed to continue, as resident owners of property along the route will (if not already) have a case of their property being eroded away and taken over by large oversize commercial vehicles. One of the main land owners along this route is the Ministry of Defence.

I assume that this situation has been taken into consideration by the Authorities regarding the planning application for the proposed large food distribution depot at Solstice Park, Amesbury. If they have not, then they will have one very huge problem on their hands to solve.

I trust that at the next regular road inspection by W.C.C. Highways the damage to these road signs will be seen and refixed into their correct positions for the reasons of Highway Safety.

TRAINING: Whilst the month will be relatively quite up to the finish of training on the 19th of December. The public should be aware that on the nights of 1st and 8th of December Units will be driving without lights across the Imber ranges and the Centre of the Plain from Tilshead to Larkhill.

From March through to October the Tue, Thurs and Sat night firing times will revert back to 2330hrs.

MINISTRY OF DEFENCE - DTE SP (WEST) IMBER RANGES

- Notice is given that only the roads from:
 - Warminster to Gore Cross via Imber, and
 - Bratton to Heytesbury via Imber
 Will be open to the public from 1800 (0600pm) Friday 19 December 2008 through to 18.00 hours (06.00pm) Sunday 4th January 2009
- Please bear in mind that **ONLY METALLED ROADS** will be opened, all other tracks, stone tracks and Southern Range Road and IMBER VILLAGE remain closed (Out of Bounds) in accordance with the Imber Ranges Bylaws. Any movement off the aforesaid roads on the Imber Ranges is forbidden, trespassers are liable to prosecution.
- Red Flags are only flown at the vedette post when live firing is taking place on the ranges. The absence of red flags does NOT imply that the roads are automatically opened to the public, times for which are notified in the Press and displayed on the entrance notice boards.

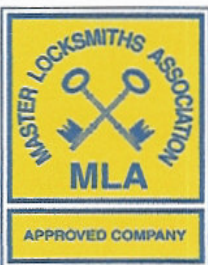

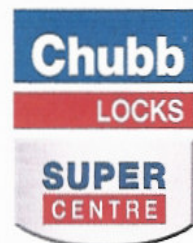
