## MAJOR MILITARY EXERCISE ON SALISBURY PLAIN

*This exercise will be well underway by the time you receive the Newsletter but the Committee believed it would still be of interest*

20 January 2009

Up to 4,000 troops and 500 vehicles are to take part in a major Army exercise on Salisbury Plain Training Area to ensure that soldiers are sufficiently prepared for deployment to Afghanistan in April.

The Mission Rehearsal Exercise (MRX) will take place from 26 January to 6 February and will involve units from Northern Ireland-based 19 Light Brigade as well as elements of others from around the UK including Tidworth-based 2nd Royal Tank Regiment and 2nd Battalion The Royal Welsh.

The exercise will involve aircraft from all three Services – up to six Apache attack helicopters, two Lynx, two Sea Kings and up to four Chinook helicopters. Small numbers of fast jets will also be in support along with two Hercules transport aircraft.

Every effort is made to ensure that noisy activity is limited to normal training times. In principle, flying hours have been limited to between 7am and 11pm during the week and only limited flying on weekends. However, on some occasions flying will be conducted throughout the night.

Exercise planners have made every effort to avoid over-flying in sensitive and built-up areas. Ground activity will take place on military training areas, including the MOD site at Ludgershall, both during the day and night and over the weekend. While everything possible will be done to keep to the published plan, weather restrictions may necessitate slippage of some dates and venues.

Local MPs, parish councils, police, the AA and other interested parties have been contacted in advance of the exercise.

Lieutenant Colonel Mike Beard, Commander of Salisbury Plain Training area said: “While the Army appreciates that this exercise will cause some minor disruption and inconvenience to people in the local area we would ask for their co-operation and understanding to ensure that the Army maintains its genuine operational effectiveness.

”It is important that people are aware of aircraft activity that may unsettle horses, convoys on roads and mud near tank crossings – which we will endeavour to clear as quickly as possible.”

The police and AA Roadwatch have been made aware of vehicle routes and timings. Convoys will be limited to a maximum of ten vehicles in each packet to minimise the impact upon traffic. Many of the troops will be travelling from Northern Ireland, Catterick in North Yorkshire, Inverness, Norfolk, Aldershot and Germany. A spokesman for 19 Light Brigade said:

“19 Light Brigade has already been through an intense period of training and preparation. This exercise represents the final component of our training and we will soon be completely prepared for deployment to Afghanistan in April. At the end of the exercise we will be the best trained Brigade in the Army and ready for the challenges ahead.”

### PROJECT UPDATE FROM THE TRUSTEES

The contractors took two weeks off over Christmas, missing most of the very cold weather, returning to work on 5th January 2009. Since then the roof structure has been finished and by the time you read this, the roof slates should be on the building and the attractive shape of the roofline completed. During the last week of January and through February, the contractors will start work on the inside of the building, installing windows and security shutters and possibly the underfloor heating at the end of the month. The old building is due for demolition in the last week of the month so if any of you would like a last nostalgic look, now is the time.

At the beginning of January we were advised that we have been successful with our grant application to the Lottery's Changing Spaces grant for the remaining 50% cost of the Ground Source Heat Pump, so we are delighted that the Heat Pump is now 100% funded. In addition, we have received notice that we have been granted £5000 for the supply of the 'white' (electrical) goods in the kitchen as well as all the crockery, cutlery and glasses from the Community Foundation's Grassroots fund. From that £5000, we have also been able to purchase a small portable stage - further sections can be added as our fundraising energies return!

Over the past couple of years, we have monitored the charges made by 14 other Wiltshire village halls. The updated 2009 information from these halls is now being looked at to make sure that Enford's charges are in line with theirs. Be assured that charges will be as low as possible, with reduced charges for local residents.

Please note that the February 10th User Group meeting will **not** now take place, it will be rescheduled later in the spring. Plenty of work is being done behind the scenes to setup user groups and arrange activities – so watch this space for the next meeting date.

Our first **Moviola** film showing will be held in June, date and film to be confirmed.

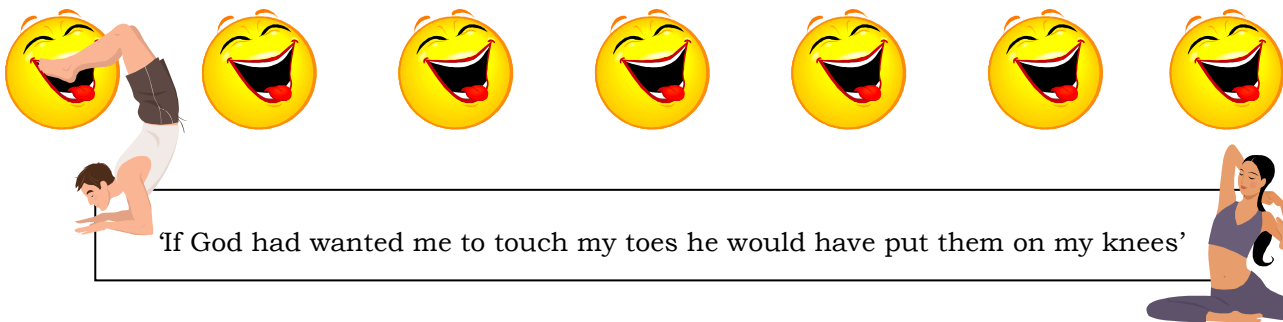

There's no doubt about it, walking is good for you. It's good for your heart, it's good for your lungs, it's good for the muscle and bone growth of your children and it's good for your feeling of wellbeing! Strong scientific evidence now supports the many benefits to health of regular walking – it is recommended that we take at least 10,000 steps a day.

Studies show that walking can:

- Reduce the risk of coronary heart disease and stroke
- Lower blood pressure
- Reduce high cholesterol
- Reduce body fat
- Enhance mental well being



Walking offers a great way to help kids get the active habit. If parents express excitement about the prospect of a walk in the countryside, they are more likely to transmit this feeling to their children. It's important to treat the walk as an exploration or adventure and to go at the child's pace, no matter how often they want to stop and look at things; take treats to eat and plenty to drink; and head for some landmark that will appeal to them such as a castle, a playground, an ice cream van or a boating pond. If children experience walking as part of a fun activity they are more likely to want to go again.

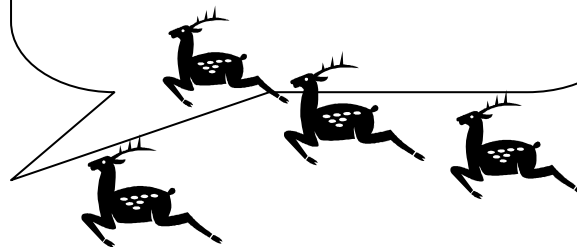

### Rural Beat Officers Westdown Camp

Following the launch of PLAINWATCH we are pleased to report that the scheme is assisting us in the detection of crime and subsequent prosecution of offenders. We take this opportunity to thank everyone who has called in on the PLAINWATCH number to report an incident which they regarded as suspicious if not criminal. We have received in excess of 100 reports from members of the public which has resulted in a number of successful prosecutions and generated numerous intelligence reports that have been passed on to our Force Intelligence Bureau. Four recent court cases for Fly Tipping resulted in the offenders being fined £2000 (rubbish pictured right) £550, £550 and £350. All could have been avoided but for their laziness in not going to their local recycling centres.



There are many public rights of way on the plain, however a number of 4x4 fans insist on driving off the rights of way. To date we have issued more than eighty fixed penalty notices to people who break the law in this way and we have noticed a drastic reduction in this type of offence. The owner of this vehicle went to court and was given a hefty fine and costs.

Another attraction of Salisbury Plain are the military training features that lend themselves to illegal gatherings for the purpose of holding Raves. These gatherings usually involve motoring and drug offences. The last 'Party' was at Pear Tree Hill. Once the party had been halted and the equipment packed away we seized two vehicles, one containing music systems and lighting and four men were prosecuted for a number of offences. We have not seen them since.

## OPERATION HERALD AND FUEL THEFTS

Theft of metals has become a growing concern in the UK. Incidents are occurring across the country and scrap metal thefts include anything from copper pipe, copper core cable, statues and even manhole covers. Wiltshire Police have launched 'Operation Herald' and working closely with them we aim to speak to local scrap yards to remind them of their legal responsibilities when accepting metal from the public. We will carry out checks on vehicles loaded with scrap metal using Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR).

### FUEL THEFTS

Due to the ever increasing fuel prices throughout the summer, SPTA suffered its share of fuel thefts. Offenders will use any

means possible to steal your fuel, including drilling a hole in the bottom of the fuel tank to drain your fuel into their containers. If you are walking your dog and leave your vehicle unattended in a remote area, consider whether it would be vulnerable to attack. Do not leave anything on view inside. Put it in the boot or glove compartment. Agricultural vehicles are a target for fuel theft. These offenders are not worried about using red or normal diesel in their vehicles. ### MAGISTRATES AND THE CPS VISIT WESTDOWN

Due to the complexity and size of DTE (SP) Local Magistrates and members of The Crown Prosecution Service were invited to Westdown Camp to see for themselves the enormity of our problem and the type of offences suffered on the Plain. The day, hosted by the Commander DTE (SP), highlighted the difficulties encountered by all agencies involved in policing the

area, especially fly tipping, hare coursing and 'off roading'. The day proved a great success, having made the judicial authorities aware of the unique policing challenges we face.

### WINTER ON DTE (SP)

The military authorities and their partners take great care to protect Salisbury Plain. With over 60% of the area being Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), special measures are in place during severe wet weather, to ensure that any damage is kept to an absolute

minimum. All users of the plain can play a part in helping us to protect the landscape. In severe weather, drivers should stay on the stone tracks and give the byways a chance to recover. Off road motorcyclists and 4x4 enthusiasts are regularly caught driving their vehicles other than on a right of way. These offenders are issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice or reported for summons. The more serious offenders have had their vehicles seized. Please be environmentally aware.



## ILLEGAL HARE COURSING

Hare Coursing is illegal. Unfortunately, because of the terrain, we have a few persistent offenders on the plain. It is a very difficult offence to prove. The offenders will often say "I was walking my dog when he just took off" If we do catch up with them they have often committed other offences for which they are prosecuted.

There are a number of ways to deal with hare coursing, unfortunately none of them is permanent. We

have a very large area to police and there will be occasions when we do not catch these offenders. We are committed to reducing crime on Salisbury Plain and any assistance given by all users of the area will help us to obtain information and details of incidents and offenders which we can then forward to our Intelligence Bureau for further and more in depth investigation. Please call the Plainwatch number if you see anything you

believe to be suspicious or unusual. We are currently disposing of a 4x4 vehicle found on the area and suspected of having been used by coursers on the plain.

### In Case of Emergency Campaign (ICE)

We all carry our mobile phones with names & numbers stored in its memory but nobody, other than if we were to be involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored but which one is the contact person in case of an emergency?

Hence this 'ICE' (In Case of Emergency) Campaign.

The concept of 'ICE' is catching on quickly. It is a method of contact during emergency situations. As cell phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during emergency under the name 'ICE' (In Case Of Emergency).

The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scenes of accidents, there were always mobile phones with patients, but they didn't know which number to call. He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognized name for this purpose.

In an emergency situation, Emergency Service personnel and hospital Staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialling the number you have stored as 'ICE'.

**TRAINING:** February will be a busy month on the Plain with the first week seeing the culmination of 19 Light Brigade's training in preparation for its forthcoming deployment to Afghanistan. This will be followed by a large scale armoured manoeuvre exercise for the Land Warfare Centre in the second week and a series of one week unit lead pre-deployment exercises for units of 12 Mechanised Brigade who are due to deploy to Iraq in mid summer. There are also some squadron level armoured exercises in the second half of the month.

**NOTE:** Due to unforeseen changes there is always a possibility that there could be firing on other of the days listed. This is particularly so now operational training is being conducted to meet many and varied exigencies. The public should be careful to check that Red Flags are not flying before they enter the range. It is the time of the year when we change late night firing times. From March through to October the Tue, Thurs and Sat night firing times will revert back to 2330hrs.



**HELICOPTER NIGHT FLYING :** Night flying normally takes place Mondays to Thursdays inclusive over parts of SPTA. Some aircraft will show no lights but all will operate under strict area control.

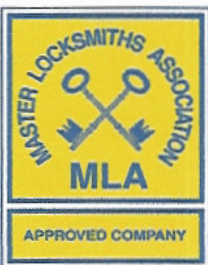

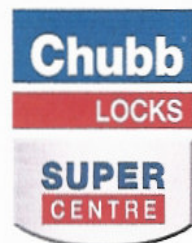
