We would appreciate any comments you have that might help us to improve the website so that it becomes a useful medium for sharing news and information.

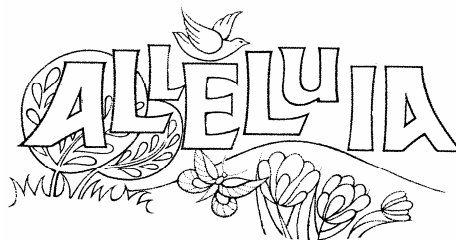

Semana Santa

A strange melancholic hush tinged with expectation wrapped around us as we made our way through the heavily thronged streets and alleyways of that fabulous city Seville.

Children, parents, grandparents, families and friends lined the narrow streets, eyes always watchful looking in one direction.

As we made our way amongst the crowd we were met with friendly gestures telling us to keep against the walls of the high buildings that seemed to stretch upwards into the night sky and forwards along the road to a place we could not see. The small patch of sky above was such a deep black against the golden light that was gently falling around us.

No-one challenged us despite, in our ignorance, our continuing to try and move onwards.

Rather they were afraid for us as they would be for their children.

The mood of the crowd began to seep into our minds and bodies and we too were filled with anticipation, albeit for the unknown.

As we, a small group of visitors to the city, allowed ourselves to become one with our neighbours, there seemed to be a gentle movement in their level of anticipation. This quiet flow which began so small it was barely noticeable could be felt growing inside. What was about to happen? Why were we here with people of whom we knew nothing yet sharing the very same emotions?

Heads began to strain and turn purposefully in the same direction. The golden glow from the lights reflected in every eye. Parents held on to their children tightly yet at the same time making sure that they too would be a part of this great event.

Voices became hushed as the sound of slow beating drums reached our ears. A wave of strength, calm and determination was travelling amongst and through all of us small, vulnerable, fragile beings.

We looked, we saw and we felt the sight of a man riding on a donkey. Behind him a great palm, tree swaying to and fro; its graceful featherlike fronds brushing against the walls and windows of places where everyday work and lives are constantly taking place.

Each beat of the drums brought the tableau closer to us until it towered high above us forcing us to press flat against the walls so that it could pass by. The figure of Jesus on the donkey was life-size, as was the palm tree. The whole of the tableau was gilded with a rich golden hue accompanied by golden lights. You could not help but be moved by such warmth, calm and magnificence. Slowly, majestically this wonderful scene gracefully moved amongst us carried by 40 men. They would carry it, as many other groups would in different parts of the city towards the magnificent cathedral, La Catedral de Santa María de la Sede.

This was the beginning of the most wonderful week. One we will never forget.



I spoke to Jyoti last week and know that the boxes 4 of them, (2 more still to go!) have arrived safely. These books are going to go to a village school at a place called Chhandruk which is a small village in the Annapurna area of Nepal. The boxes will travel by road to the north west of Pokhara and then it will be 5 to 8 hours on the back of either porters or by jopki (a cross between a water buffalo and yak)

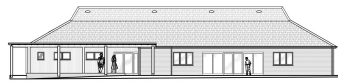

PROJECT UPDATE FROM THE TRUSTEES

Apologies to you all for missing the March Newsletter entry. The half term holiday diverted my attention from the due entry date. This entry attempts to summarise two months' work.

On February 16th the old Hall was demolished and we apologise to those living in Longstreet for the number of lorries carrying the old Hall away and the inconvenience caused.

In the past two months, the internal walls have been plastered, decorations are under way, external doors, windows and security shutters are fitted, most of the electrics are in, the underfloor heating has been installed, WCs, showers and cubicles are in. The three boreholes for the Ground Source Heat Pump have been drilled (each 105 metres deep), the plumbers, tilers and carpenters are in with plenty to do, the floor coverings are down, the exterior ramp and tiled areas are almost finished and the car parking area is taking shape.

Age Concern England has kindly given us £500 to install a Hearing Induction Loop for hearing aid users.

Over the past couple of months, we became aware that the Plant Room and Furniture Store were probably too small for our future needs and we have decided to build a small extension for this purpose on the far end of the building, enabling us to provide a larger kitchen and significantly more space for the technical equipment, a dedicated store for the tables and chairs as well as a separate store for the Football Club's equipment. We have managed to secure the necessary funds and the construction has already begun.

Work has begun on the repair of the pitch. In March, the pitch was harrowed, rolled and work is being done to repair mole and rabbit damage. There is an ongoing maintenance programme in place which may require the occasional cordoning off of areas which are being re-seeded.

The Hire Charges have now been agreed by the Committee and both Residents/Regular Users and Non-Residents' Charge Sheets are included in this Newsletter. In addition, we are regularly updating the Hall's entry on the Wiltshire Village Halls Association website (www.wvha.org.uk) and during April, I am hoping to be able to add Hire Charges and Conditions of Hire as well as photographs as soon as the Hall looks ready for a camera session.

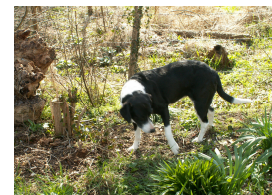

In a period of declining rural services, seeing the closure of many post offices and changes to the provision of Health services, many older people are being adversely affected and suffering as a result.

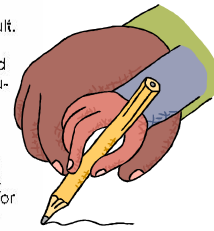
During this difficult period the Link schemes have seen a steady increase in the amount of requests for help and transport from those most vulnerable in our communities. Every week over 900 people, mainly our older residents, are helped to do those things which most of us take for granted. Indeed for many clients the friendly voice and face of a Link volunteer is often the only social contact they may have with their community. Requests for good neighbour help and transport assistance range from helping to change a light bulb to getting to the hospital for an out-patient appointment but regularly include:

- Getting to medical appointments
- Help shopping for food
- Reading requests
- Transport to luncheon clubs and other social events

Each of the 1400 volunteers (approx) throughout Wiltshire make a small contribution which improves the lives of many clients. Existing volunteers get a great deal of pleasure from their work with Link and new volunteers are always welcome. As well as being looked after, appreciated and supported Link volunteers:

- Are reimbursed their expenses
- Decide their own availability and interests
- Achieve an enormous sense of well-being and community spirit
- Make new friends
- Keep active
- Feel valued

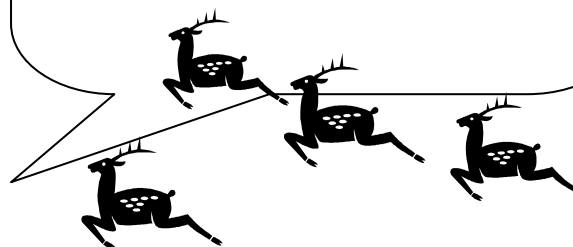

TRAINING: From Friday 27th March to Thursday 2nd April the Imber Ranges will be closed to all civilian access during the Land Combat Power Demonstration (the old 'Firepower Demo'). Apart from this important annual event, activity on the Plain will be confined to some Cadet Units, a Dutch Marine Company and a Challenger Squadron until the week beginning Monday 20th April when a 'double' TESEX starts. This will run through until 8th May and, although large in terms of troop numbers, should cause little if any disruption to local residents.

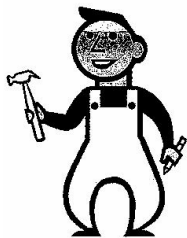

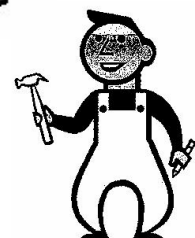

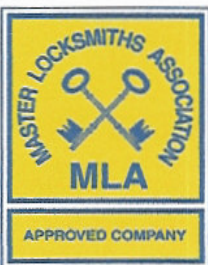
