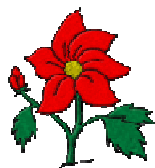

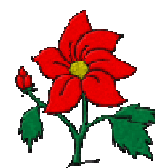

ENFORD NEWSLETTER REACHES THE FALKLANDS

Hello,

My name is Keith Reddick and I ran and printed the Enford Newsletter during the 70's and up to 1983 when I left the village for The Falklands. I handed everything over to Col. Stimpson when I left.

It is good to see the Newsletter still going and now in PDF as it is easy to download. It is also nice to see that the front picture is more or less the same as mine was.

In my day, everything was done with a hand driven Gestetner and then later, an electric one which I managed to get from the company I worked for at the time.

It would be good so see some of my old work on your site when you get around to it, especially as most of it was done single handed.

I was also connected with the old Village Hall and also the old Youth Club with Jane Young. However, I was disappointed as all I found were construction photos.

It would have been nice to see completed pictures and even some of the opening and fete. I am sure that I am not the only overseas villager to want to see more.

From Neighbourhood Watch

I have just heard of two incidences which have occurred during the last two weeks.

1. Field View, Water Lane (car park) a resident had his diesel stolen. The van's tank had drill marks where the fuel had been siphoned during the night. The owner alerted the police.
2. Bitch dogs are being stolen from homes, the following was reported to me this week. Two Springer spaniels between Enford and Upavon were taken from the plain, and a golden retriever was stolen from the owner's home between Enford and Netheravon. Three more incidences like this have occurred in and around our local area, but I do not have any more information .

On the evening of Wednesday 2nd September our hire van was parked in Field View's car park, at the back of our house. My husband went out at about 10pm to walk the dog and can remember a slight smell of diesel as he left the back gate, but thought nothing of it. It was not until the following morning, as my husband started the van to go to work that he noticed the fuel tank was empty. On closer inspection of the underneath of the van he realised that the fuel tank had been drilled and the quarter tank of diesel, which had been in the van, had been left to run across the car park. It is our belief that shortly before 10pm someone had entered the car park, hoping to take the contents of the van's fuel tank, but was disturbed by my husband leaving the house and walking through the car park with the dog, therefore the tank was left to drain across the gravel.

On Thursday 3rd September we phoned Wiltshire Police Crime Desk and reported the incident. We have been contacted by an officer from Tidworth and are awaiting her visit.

We went on holiday on the following day, Thursday 4th and returned yesterday, so have not been able to email you earlier. We were quite shocked and saddened by this act of damage/theft as we have lived in the village for four years and have never experienced, or even heard of, any crime in the local area. But sadly, this acts as a reminder that even Enford is not immune to the crime so prevalent in society today.

**SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES OF THE AGM OF THE ENFORD RECREATION GROUND & VILLAGE HALL TRUST
MEETING HELD ON 14TH SEPTEMBER 2009**

1. TREASURER'S REPORT (Income & Expenditure A/C and Balance Sheet 31.3.08-30.06.09 attached)

The Treasurer, Alan Merrett, pointed out that the accounting period had been extended from 31.03.09 to 30.06.09 in order to present a complete financial picture of the building project.

Grant monies still due to EVH are £61,899 with outstanding construction costs at £80,472, leaving a balance of £9208.

Total grants for the construction were £624,942.

Grants for equipping the Hall totalled £11,645 and £12,910 has been spent to date, leaving a negative balance of £1265.

The Chairman, Judy D'Arcy Irvine, thanked Mr. Merrett for his considerable contribution to the Hall, in particular over the past two years, as he steps down from the post. Ms. Glenda Clark takes over with immediate effect.

2. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Judy D'Arcy Irvine reported that the remaining grant funds are to be put towards Seeding and Landscaping (already under way), protective poles around the Car Park Lights, Sliding Doors between Conference Room and Main Hall and Curtains for the Main Hall. It is hoped that these final items will be completed within one year.

The contractors have undertaken to remove the sub-standard Disabled Handrail and substitute with a black powder-coated metal version to comply with Building Regulations.

In addition, the internal lighting is to be upgraded as some rooms are below the required 'LUX' levels.

Increased Marketing of the Hall to outside organisations and within the wider community is a priority and work is underway

to improve the promotional leaflet including photographs.

3. COMMUNITY GROUP REPORTS

PARISH COUNCIL	No report available
PARISH HALL	Jane Young reported that whilst the Hall continued to be available there were no plans to make any changes.
PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL	No rep present. Very best wishes recorded for Sarah Campbell's speedy recovery. Chairman reported that the Church Christmas Fair will take place in the Village Hall this year on Nov 21st. Seen as a joint venture, the Church will share any proceeds with EVH and there will be no hire charge to the Church.
NEWSLETTER	Jacqui Elkins reported that the Newsletter is now online aiming to reduce deliveries in the future. EVH Committee thanked the Newsletter for their positive support during construction.
GROUND	Hamish Scott Dalgleish reported that the grass is being mown weekly. Problems include moles and rabbits. Annual maintenance likely to be around £400-500.

4. USER GROUP REPORTS

FOOTBALL CLUB	Ollie Stagg reported that Enford FC will return to the playing fields in October once the goal posts are delivered.
RED LION CLUB	No rep present.
SHORT MAT BOWLS	David Spencer reported that the Wednesday club is up and running and attracting new members each week. Aiming for 20.
MOVIOLA	Gill Gould reported that the 22.09 film is A Bunch of Amateurs, Oct - Angels & Demons, Nov - Cherie. Moviola charge a minimum of £200 which requires an audience of 65 to break even.
PHOTOGRAPHY	Martin Webb reported the first meeting attracted 7/8 members. Meets 1st Thursday of every month. More members welcome.
BRIDGE	Jeni Scott Dalgleish reported that Nemmy Elliot's improvers' bridge classes start on 15.09.09 and all four tables are booked. If successful, will continue beyond 06.10.09.
YOUTH CLUB	Jane Young reported that the Youth Club opens on Friday 18 September - organisers hope parents will accompany youngsters for the first evening. Youth Action Wiltshire providing and paying for a Youth Leader for 10 weeks.
GARDENING	Gill Gould reported that the club starts on 17 September (and continues on 3rd Thursday each month). Plant exchange, hall landscaping, gardening notes etc - reasonable interest - members welcome.
PILATES & KEEP FIT	Reports from all users that classes are fully booked and all very happy with the Hall.
GREAT BUSTARD GROUP	Lynne Derry (Visitor & Retail Manager) advised that the use of Car park and Toilets going well. Visitors leave their car and are transported to the Bustard site by Land Rover. More info: : www.greatbustard.org or 07817-971327 or 01980-671466.
FIREWORKS	Gareth Holden advised this is now set for 31st October 2009.

5. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Jeni Scott Dalgleish advised that the current Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary have been on the Committee for over 10 years and as the Treasurer steps down at this AGM, it is felt that the Chairman and Secretary should also step down sometime during the next 12 months and a plan to attract candidates from within and outside the Committee must be introduced. It was proposed that future Trustees/Officers hold the position for a maximum of two to three years making it more attractive to future candidates.

The following candidates were proposed and seconded and will hold the positions for the period 1st September 2009 - 30th June 2010.

CHEQUE SIGNATORIES

Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary, Property Officer. Alan Merrett (former Treasurer) will remain a signatory until the final completion of the Building Project. Note two signatories are required for all cheques.

QUESTIONS FROM THE FLOOR

1. Gareth Holden asked whether the Hall has a Licence to sell alcohol. Jeni Scott Dagleish advised that the Premises Licence was issued in August 2009 and allows for the provision of regulated entertainment (showing of films, performance of plays and dance, live and recorded music, indoor sporting events) PLUS the retail sale of alcohol. For events organised by members of the Committee (including User Group representatives), Paul Jackson of the Swan is happy to stand as the legally required Designated Premises Supervisor responsible for the sale of alcohol (although it is not necessary for him to attend the events in person) for a period of six months with a review at that time. In all privately run events, organisers will still be required to hold a Temporary Event Notice (currently £21). A proportion of the Premises Licence cost will be charged to Committee-event organisers (currently £20) in addition to the Hire Charge.
2. Gareth Holden asked the Committee to ensure that the proposed new Hall lamps are suitable for the height of the ceiling and still produce the expected lux levels.
3. Ollie Stagg asked about the poor quality top soil and how this will affect the grass. JDI advised that Gaigers do not feel that the topsoil needs replacing. The landscapers start work on 15.09.09 and will be clearing excess stones from the area to be seeded.
4. Hamish Scott Dagleish asked if the GSHP was working. David Spencer reported that it was, the hot water is working well and the heating has been on and works very efficiently - it is only after a year that he will be able to report on its operational costs.
5. Ollie Stagg asked about the potential problem with water seepage in the Changing Rooms between the shower area and Polysafe flooring and who would pay. JDI advised that the possible problem has been highlighted to the contractors who assure us they will deal with if it arises.
6. Ann Merrett reported that the feedback re the kitchen is that a catering table is urgently needed in the centre of the room. JDI advised that this will be purchased as soon as possible.
7. Hamish Scott Dagleish asked whether an Income & Expenditure Forecast had been prepared. JDI advised that the Forecast submitted to the Grant providers has been updated and available if required. Income forecast is estimated at £9,000 and Expenditure forecast at £7,500. www.greatbustard.org or 07817-971327 or 01980-671466.

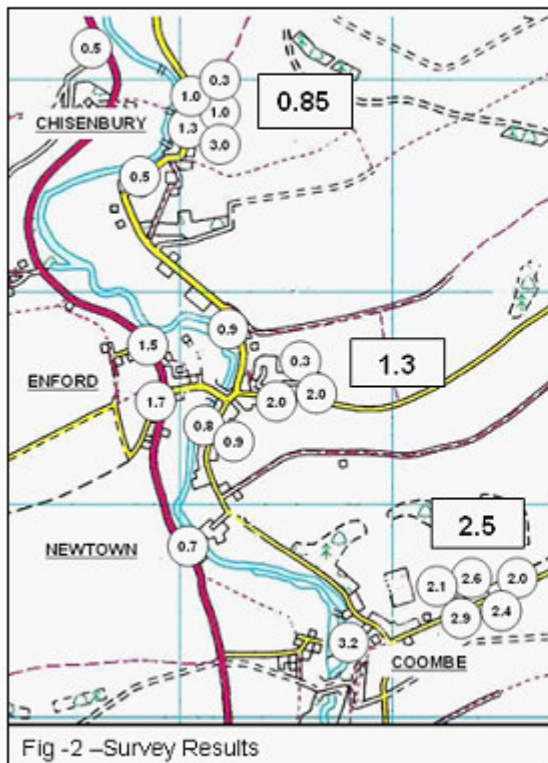

BROADBAND IN ENFORD (steve@becker.globalnet.co.uk)

Thank you to the 21 people who responded to the broadband survey. The results (throughput speeds in Mbps) are plotted on the chart below - circles show the readings reported by individual respondents, squares show the average (less the highest and lowest readings) for each cluster.



The general results are pretty much as you would expect to see, with speeds dropping off the farther away you move from the exchange in Netheravon. There is also quite a variation in speed within each cluster, and this could be due to many factors - the most likely being: time of day the reading was taken (speed increases and decreases during periods of low and high demand - the best times seem to be early morning, afternoons and late evening); the condition of each line (a noisy line will result in reduced speed); the condition of household wiring (proximity to sources of interference, integrity of appliances and connectors); the level of service provided by different internet service providers (ISPs).

A couple of people said they were satisfied with their broadband, however there is a feeling from the majority of respondents that things are not as good as they should be. The main cause of annoyance seems to be the when there is a loss of connection or significant, long-term drop in speed for no apparent reason. Here are a selection of comments:

"My speed and connectivity was excellent. Now the speed has dropped dramatically and from time to time I am completely cut off and have to close down my router or my

computer and wait for it to sort its self out"

"I have been worrying about my broadband speeds and decline in quality of my telephone line for several days.."

"We have been experiencing download issues with BT for around a year now. We have had to get BT to do resets as the connection has dropped over various weekends. Similarly, the speed has perked up momentarily (for a few days).."

"Have had a lot of problems in last two years .. For example it is frequently impossible to log on on Saturday morning. I regularly have to restart hub. Performance varies and the last two months or so have been quite good but last few days not so good"

"The speed has worsened very noticeably in the last few months and is about the same as the old dial up. I too have to tolerate frequent failures of one sort or another - a recent development"

If you visit http://winterbournestoke-thedigitaldivide.blogspot.com/2009_03_01_archive.html you can read at length about similar problems experienced by Winterbourne Stoke. The use of underground aluminium (instead of copper) cabling and interference from heavy electrical machinery and electric fences are amongst some of the possible problems which they have identified. The bad news is that they have as yet been unable to get BT to do much about it.

So what can you do? Well, the first thing is to check your home installation (see the above website for lots of useful information on how to do this). Get in touch with your ISP and get them to re-set your BRAS/IP profile - this is an exchange setting which defines the maximum speed data can be sent down your line - it should be self adjusting but it seems that it can get 'stuck'. Go to <http://www.anomalousaperture.com/2008/08/a-simple-telephone-line-quality-test-for-adsl-uk-only/> and read how to test your BT line for noise. If all else fails call in a BT engineer, however note that you may be charged for this if they find the problem is due to your home installation (as I write this, we have just had a BT engineer check our line - he has reported no problem however my broadband speed which, 6 months ago was over 2Mbps, is still no better than 0.13Mbps!).

What else can we do? Well, there are alternatives to BT. You might consider a mobile broadband package for your PC - these will deliver about 1 Mbps (although claiming to be much higher) and prices are quite competitive these days. Some rural villages like ours are installing their own wide-area wireless systems; others are laying fibre optic cable from the exchange - both considerably faster than copper wire.

I shall continue to investigate options on your behalf.
