ENFORD - CHISENBURY GOLF - 21 MAY 2010

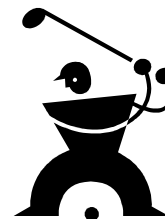

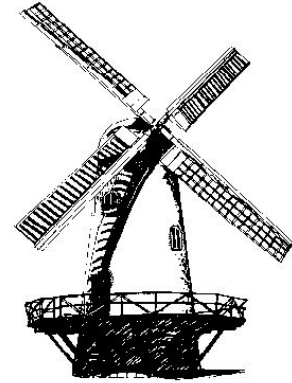

BROADBAND IN ENFORD (steve@becker.globalnet.co.uk)

In the last report I mentioned my 6-month (unsuccessful) campaign to get my Internet Service Provider (ISP) to rectify the appallingly low broadband speed we had been getting, and how eventually we decided to call in a BT engineer. I went on to write about how, within an hour of reporting the fault, it was mysteriously rectified remotely (presumably by BT) such that when the engineer visited the following morning he could find nothing wrong with the line. I also wrote about how we then got billed £125 for the engineer visit even though it was obviously a line fault and not therefore our liability, and how I filed a complaint and how BT immediately agreed to refund the money on our next bill.

Well.....3 months later I checked my new bill and (you guessed!) no refund. Feeling, by now, quite indignant I attempted to post a further complaint using the BT website, however the 'Make A Complaint/Contact BT by Email' pages are very unreliable, and most times fail to load at all. A couple of times I eventually did manage to get the page to load, and typed in my complaint, then the form failed to submit. After 4 attempts (each time having to re-enter the text of the email) over a period of 30 minutes I gave up altogether.

In my experience it is very unusual to encounter a professionally-designed website, for a major corporation which fails in such a way at times of off-peak activity (I was doing this at about 10.30pm). I also recalled that the last time I had used it in November it was equally unreliable. Given that the remainder of the website appeared to function well, the thought did cross my mind that it had been deliberately degraded to deter people from complaining - but surely not?

As a last resort, there is an address on the BT bill which you can write to if you have a problem with the bill. So I wrote a letter. About 5 days later there was a message from BT on our answering machine, apologising profusely and agreeing to refund the £125 immediately. That was about 10 days ago - nothing seen yet.

Meanwhile, our next door neighbour was telling me yesterday that his broadband speed has taken a nose-dive roughly about the same time as ours improved. Could it be that someone is 'robbing Peter to pay Paul'?

The bus shelter will be of traditional design, made from oak and with a pitch roof. We have taken account of the feedback we received and have elected not to have any glass on the sides.

The existing bench will be re-sited alongside the new bus shelter so people can choose to sit outside in the summer if they wish.

HIGHWAY NEWS

Hello Enford Parish Residents,

The last time I gave you a report was in the November 2009 issue. I trust everyone had a good Christmas and New Year and also have had safe driving through the recent bad weather conditions.

A345 Road Surface Conditions from Enford through to Netheravon

The situation at present has not changed from the last report. What has changed and you all know this, is that the road surface has got even worse, and again like the winter before this one the conditions have been appalling and playing havoc with the poor road surface. We have been told by Wiltshire Council that they have spent some £100,000 on repairing pot holes and they expect to spend another £400,000 in the coming months. The Association of Local Councils has stated that more is being paid out in insurance claims to vehicles, than is being paid out to repair the pot holes. In addition Wiltshire Council Highways Department state that they are requesting funding to resurface all or part of this area. We are on the case and will badger them until they get the job done.

A345 West Chisenbury and Newtown Request for a Speed Reduction

As you maybe aware, the Parish Council wrote to Wiltshire Council requesting a speed reduction from Enford 30mph zone north to West Chisenbury and south to Newtown. It was for either an extension of the 30mph limit or a reduction from the 60mph to 40mph. The Speed Limit Review has been published and The Council has taken no notice of this request. We have since sent them another letter demanding to know why they have not recognised the speed problem we have here in Enford. We, like many other Parish Councils, have grave reservations about how this Speed Limit Review has been conducted. We have had to remind the Council of their own document, The Environment Advisory Panel Wiltshire County Council Wednesday 22nd March 2006 Trowbridge, where it stated, "Particular concerns have been expressed about road safety on the A345 between Marlborough and Amesbury. Sections of the A345 have an above typical collision rate within the limits of the Local Safety Scheme budget, consideration will be given to low cost remedial measures where appropriate". To our knowledge nothing has been done within this area. They have been reminded of this report.

Speeding and Enforcement

There is no change here as the police do not have the staff to deal with the situation. Until the police bring back the staffing levels of the Traffic and Highways Units the situation can only get worse. The AA/RAC School of Advanced Driving and other Motoring Organisations including several Chief Constables have all said the same thing, "bring the police back onto the roads to re educate the erring drivers and reduce accidents."

Enford Community Speed Watch

It has been confirmed that Enford was one of the trail blazers for community speed watch within Wiltshire. We had to correct Wiltshire Council in their article of their new "Your Wiltshire Magazine" where it stated that Dauntsey was one of the first pilot schemes in Wiltshire. We have subsequently had a letter back from the editor of this magazine stating that what they meant was that it was a first pilot scheme set up by the Malmesbury Area Board in that area. Enford was doing speed watch before Unitary Council and before Area Boards were ever thought of. We now have the new up to date Unipar camera and have been congratulated by the Wiltshire Police on the results. We have now been given permission to monitor the North site of the A345 (30mph Zone). This is near The Old Vicarage and by the bus stop east side, opposite New Buildings. We have been told that a good percentage of those reported exceeding the speed limit within this 30mph zone are local to the area so please be aware of this.

The Swan Accident

Insurance paid up, structure replaced, but still no famous "Swan Sign" swinging in the wind. Bureaucracy reigns folks. It's all down to The Council's inability to erect two new sign posts either side of the Swan Inn notifying passing through traffic that there is something "Up Front Overhead". So drive carefully. As you well know, due to how the accident was dealt with by the police, there has been an ongoing issue regarding the "Stopping Officers" report, which the police has been reticent in coming forward with this A4 piece of paper. At The Swan Enford AGM on 29th March 2010 it was agreed that Swan Enford would send the exorbitant amount of £70.00 for this little piece of paper and has now requested it under The Freedom of Information Act. We await this very overdue "Stopping Officers" report telling us why the officer let the driver go after he had caused £20,000 of damage, leaving the scene of an accident without checking if he had injured anyone and also for not leaving his insurance details.

Coombe/Enford/Littlecott/East Chisenbury-Traffic Calming

We have since had a meeting with Mark Stansby of Wiltshire Council. An overdue letter from him made certain suggestions on Roadway ground signage which could be installed and funded by the Council, and that the dilapidated village signs could be replaced at certain cost to the Parish Council. We feel this is not a Parish Council's problem. At the time of the meeting the official stated that these dilapidated signs had been neglected by the Council for some time. We therefore feel that the Parish should not be held financially responsible for Council Highway signs that have been left to deteriorate over past years. We will be taking the Council to task on this issue after we have toured the Parish and compiled a report on a list of signs that have gone into a state of disrepair.

The Haxton/Netheravon Bridge closure (Engineering).

As bore holes have to be sunk near the bridge which is the forerunner for installing a footpath from Haxton to Netheravon bridge, we are expecting an increase of traffic flow along the C32 from the Everleigh Road through the villages. We have informed everyone of the problems that occurred with the Swan accident and have informed the Council and the Police that the Authorities will be responsible should another accident occur as like last time, i.e. No Sign Posts. We will be keeping an eye on this situation and if anyone has any problems please contact me. I will try to assist.

The A345 Heavy Goods Vehicles using the road as a "Through Route"

The A338/A346/A345 Joint working group led by Wiltshire Councillor Charles Howerd put forward a paper regarding the De-Priming of the A338 and getting HGV restrictions on rural A roads like the A342/A345/A346. It was successfully passed by the Tidworth and Pewsey Area Boards and the Amesbury area Board has agreed to look at the details again at a future area board meeting. This scheme is on the agenda for the Marlborough area Board meeting this March., this is going to be a lengthy process.. At the Amesbury Area Board Meeting on the 11th February 2010, Enford put their case forward in support of the scheme and a MUST have restrictions for HGVs on the A345 at Amesbury and at Marlborough. This is what we said:

The A345 is not a Wiltshire Council recognised Through Route. In fact, in some of their highway documents it does not exist. It was a sheep drovers' road and nothing much has changed for the past 100 years. The road is totally unsuitable for Large Heavy Goods Vehicles. These vehicles can not pass one another safely and they are breaking the law in places where their Off Side Wheels straddle the continuous double white lines. Side bankings, hedges and residential properties are being damaged and most of all the poorly maintained highway surface is being eroded away due to the heavy flow of traffic. In a police survey in March 2009 it was recorded that 21,000 vehicles traversed the A345 through Enford in a week. This is 3,000 vehicles a day. Enford Parish Council has good evidence of HGVs using the road as a Through Route from the A303/M3 to the A4/M4. A recent statement by the Local Government Association just recently confirmed the damage that is being done to the Rural Road Network of this Country and Wiltshire is suffering the most as it does not have one decent North to South Through Highway for Large Heavy

Goods Vehicles. Large Distribution Sites such as Andover and Solstice Park are not helping the situation and Sat Nav is causing major problems for the rural areas.

If Wiltshire Council does not heed their own Local Government Associations' warnings and also those of the people who live in the County then they will pay a heavy price in years to come regarding the destruction of these rural roads. For all these reasons we support Councillor Howerds Scheme.

30MPH Wheelie Bin Stickers.

Wheelie bin stickers have been distributed to Parish Councillors. These are to be displayed within the 30MPH zones of the A345, Enford Hill, Long Street, Water Lane and Grants Road. They cannot be used anywhere outside of a 30mph restriction zone. I have a few left over if anyone requires one for their wheelie bin.

A345 Compton. Request for Bus Stops.

We have contacted Wiltshire Council and through them the Wilts and Dorset Bus Co, requesting that 2 extra bus stops be provided near New Buildings Compton. We requested these stops last summer and we are still awaiting a reply on the feasibility of these extra stops. We will let you know how we get on in the next Highway Report.

I have been proved wrong. Last month, late at night, a van owner in Ludgershall heard a noise coming from his van, he went to investigate and was set upon by the thieves, receiving serious injuries. It was a cowardly attack by criminals, who then made their getaway. I hope the offenders were not local, but I can no longer assure you that offenders will make off rather than attack you.

In the past month on farms in East Chisenbury, there have been sightings of suspicious characters, possibly on the look-out for goods worth stealing. If you see anyone fitting the description, please let us know, details of vehicle number plates are particularly helpful.

As we enter the month of March, our hope must be that the weather is going to be warmer - after such a winter as this we need some good weather to liven us up. As I write the snowdrops are showing well, the daffodil bulbs are breaking through and many hedging trees around the garden are showing signs of life; I feel pleased that they have done so well after just four years of growth.

We have had to fell a large sycamore which will bring light into our neighbours' gardens; hey are not the most favourite of trees!

Trees do, though, offer stability. We only have to see what happens when rainforests are destroyed - whole ecological systems are wiped out. 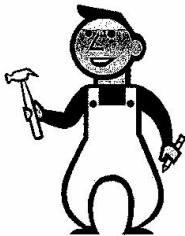

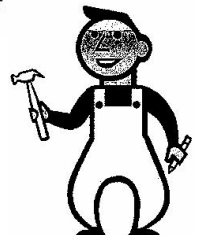


