PARISH HALL

This item is devoted to our Parish Hall, built as a reading room for the parish in 1910.

At the recent AGM on 5th July 2010, we witnessed the resignation of Chairman Colin Pearse, Vice Chairmen Jacqui Elkins, Treasurer Margaret Young and Secretary Katrina Knight. All of whom deserve our thanks for their commitment to the Parish Hall during their terms in office.

The out going Secretary told the meeting that funds to run the hall would only last until September, at which point the doors would have to be closed.

The meeting was also told by members of the Parish council that in such an instance the Parish council would not be able to fund the halls future and would propose a vote to approve its sale.

It was at this point myself, Gareth Holden and Bruce Carter offered our candidacies for Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer respectively. We were seconded and voted in accordingly. This action prompted some existing committee members to rethink their decisions to give up their places on the committee and remain to help us discover together the best future for the Parish Hall.

Since that meeting we have produced a five point mission statement which reads as follows;

1. To explore what new viable uses the hall may be put to the benefit of the whole parish and to compliment the recently rebuilt village hall. We will investigate such uses (singularly or mixed) as a village shop, post office, library, home office centre, gym, arts centre, nursery, tea room.
2. If it is found the Parish Hall no longer has a roll as outlined in item 1, we will explore the viability of renting the hall to a person or an organization. This may be a commercial user or an association such as an arts society or youth hostel.
3. If neither 1 nor 2 are feasible then we shall explore possible redevelopment of the hall and its sale. It will be incumbent on us to ascertain the parameters of permissible development, and how those parameters are best exploited to the benefit of the parish.
4. To ascertain the estimated minimum yearly cost to "moth ball" the Parish Hall until such time when the hall may offer greater practicable use for the parish.
5. Items 1 to 4 will include due consideration to the impact on the village and those immediately effected any by such proposal. We seek to involve the whole parish in this process.

It is my hope that we only need to limit ourselves to points 1 and 5 of this statement.

It is very easy to dismiss this building as irrelevant. In the last couple of years Enford and its neighbours have benefited hugely from the increased community activity bought about by events such as the fete, our fireworks night and many events and activities that take place up at our wonderful new village hall. These are things where people put something in and get a lot back.

Let us once again come together as a village and do something positive with this part of the village's heritage.

Your ideas, thoughts and help would be welcomed.

Our next meeting is 10th August 2010 at 7pm, all are welcome.

Dear Friends

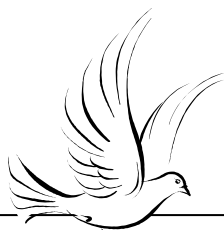

OUR ARTIC EXPEDITION (and we have the tee shirts to prove it!!)

Excerpt from an article our group expedition leader wrote before our long-awaited trip to see polar bears in the Arctic:

“Cut and dried itineraries and clinical schedules may be some people’s idea of the perfect holiday but they don’t work in the wilderness. If I’m up, you’re up’ is my mantra in Spitzbergen. Last year the ship was woken three times between midnight and five for polar bear sightings on sea ice. Zodiac (inflatable dinghy) excursions in both poles are frequently done at rudely early morning times and often don’t finish till well after dinner. Breakfasts become brunch, and then lunch, but suffering for your sport is what turns an enjoyable trip into a memorable one.

Timetables, schedules and agendas belong to the working world, in the home, in the office and on the train. If you’re not getting enough sleep, tough: you can sleep when you get home.

*This summer, when our over-paid priming primadonna footballers inevitably short-change us in Cape Town and Rustenburg, the Sergey Vavilov will be spending ten days in the ice and tundra of Spitzbergen. There will be no itinerary and no structure. If bears or oxes are found – late night vigils will be the order of the illuminated day **and** night. To spend time with Ursus Maritimus at midnight on a cobalt-blue platform is the Polar grail and worth losing a night’s sleep over. June’s goal may yet be found on the ice fields of Svalbard not the football fields of South Africa”.*

With these words still echoing in our ears we finally set off, albeit twelve months later than planned. All last year’s travel plans had to be cancelled for health reasons. Because of the ash cloud and the BA strike, our planned charter flight had been withdrawn and we were subjected to a long day travelling through 3 airports before finally arriving at our destination, Longyearbyen in Spitzbergen, at around midnight.

It was broad daylight; the sun was shining but freezing cold. We immediately boarded our small ship and headed off to the restaurant for some food and drink before dropping into our bunks!

We had a lie in the first morning with an 8.00 breakfast. Wow, the food on the ship was comparable to any luxury cruise ship with everything one can imagine laid out for us.

We headed off to the south of the island passing magnificent snow covered mountains, the sea smooth and the sun shining. After exploring the ship inside and out we noticed the pack ice getting nearer and went out on deck to meet it. Soon we were crunching through it when the tannoy crackled into life to inform us that a polar bear had been spotted on the ice!!!!!! We had been told that there were many vantage points around the decks so everyone vanished for cameras and binoculars and soon we were watching in the distance what we’d all seen on TV - and had hoped to see in real life – a polar bear striding over the ice in his quest for a meal! He was magnificent and after watching and hoping he’d venture closer he eventually disappeared. There was great cause for celebration in the bar afterwards with people saying ‘If I went home tomorrow I’d be happy!’ etc. Little did we know then what we had in store for the rest of the voyage!

The next morning brought us virtually within touching distance of a bear. He was spotted in the water! The Captain (Beluga, which I thought a very apt surname for someone working in polar regions!) put the brakes on and we almost ran this poor bear over! There was some concern that we’d got far too close but apparently the bear had had plenty of time to swim away from us but chose instead to swim back around the bow of the ship in front of everyone, climbed out onto the ice and stood on his hind legs to get a better look! He then jumped from one ice floe to the next to try and get even nearer.

Day three brought the best polar bear sightings ever. The ship had received news that a whale carcass had been swept into a bay right up on the northern tip of Spitzbergen so we turned tail and headed north which took a day and a half. On the way we saw white-beaked dolphins, fin and minke whales. When we arrived we loaded into the zodiacs and headed for the bay. As we came around the point there was a female bear with her cub on the carcass. More were to follow and altogether we visited the sight morning, afternoon and evening and had 17 bear sightings! Absolutely unprecedented! It was bitterly cold and many people had to return to the ship. Jane and I managed to get it right and didn’t suffer from the cold at all. I think excitement and adrenalin kept us two warm!!! Only our fingertips froze because they were exposed whilst taking the million and one pics!!!! Some people didn’t even venture out and boy, did they miss out!!!!!!

Safety was of paramount importance and we were instructed in different procedures to cope with certain conditions. One was to move from one zodiac to another whilst out on the water. We had to do this several times, if people were going back to the ship early or, as in our case, the engine failed and we had to be ‘rescued’. We had to step up onto the pontoon, step across to the other boat, sit and slide along to our place, with the aid of the ‘sailor’s grip’ where you and the zodiac crew member grip each other’s arm and don’t let go until sitting down. We did it without thinking, no problem at all! It was only afterwards we realised how close we really had been to that freezing Arctic sea!!!

The next day we headed down into the fjords. The weather was perfect, blue sky and still water and the scenery was truly magnificent. The reflections in the water of those huge snow-covered peaks and several glaciers were a photographers dream! We set off again in the zodiacs to explore the ice floes, Arctic terns flying overhead, seals lying on the ice and another polar bear spotted as we left the area. How lucky could we be?

We’d even got quite casual about seeing them and rather hoped we wouldn’t be woken in the middle of our sleep. What we wanted now was walrus, birds, Arctic foxes and maybe reindeer.

The next day was walrus day!! Hundreds lying together on Mofen Island, a nature reserve we were not allowed to visit but passed very close to on the ship. But **they** were allowed to visit us and before long groups of two, three and even seven or eight were found around the ship. We later visited a ‘haul-out’ where we got a good close view of a group on the beach.

We then began to travel south, the snow and ice slowly lessening, which meant that we could get out of the zodiacs and walk! Terra Firma felt good after days on the ship. Here we visited huge bird colonies, great and little auks, guillemots and kittiwakes as well as gulls, terns and my favourite, the puffin. We soon came across reindeer and an Arctic fox chewing on an old reindeer carcass. We followed him when he left and discovered several cubs hidden in the rocks. That just about completed our wish list.

What an incredible trip. The whole thing was amazing, the ship, the crew, the food, the fantastic expedition leaders, scenery, wildlife and our fellow like-minded passengers.
