News from Pewsey Children's Centre

NATIONAL CYCLE NETWORK (Sustrans)

The C32 route through Enford Parish has long been recognised as part of the Sustrans Route no 45, and on Thu 9 Sep 10, a number of new signs relating to route 45 appeared along the C32 road. However at East Chisenbury, the route is signed to turn west along a Public Footpath, (Enford no 31) to join the A345 at West Chisenbury. At this junction, there is a sign showing 'Temporary end of signing. Route under development. This route is clearly signed in both directions.

I have written to the local Sustrans contact, but having received no reply, have now forwarded the correspondence to Sustrans Head Office, with a copy to the Public Right of Way Manager of Wiltshire Council.

It should be noted that prior to this route being signed, no consultation took place with, or representation made to Enford Parish Council.

Cycling on a Public Footpath is not permitted. Therefore, I would appreciate notification of any incidents involving cyclists riding along this PROW. (Date, Time, number on tabard if worn, number in group etc)

As promised we wanted to let you know what money raised by the 2009 Fete and Bonfire night had been spent on and also give guidelines of how to apply for funding if you are involved in a local project, or are planning to start one.

Awards made to date:

Enford Village Hall - £1,721.16 (£1,000 to help set up of hall & £721 on grass matting in field)
 Enford Youth Club - £1,243.00 (Start up costs; initial running costs)
 Enford Football Club - £452.00 (New goal-posts; kit for the under 10's 5-a-side team)
 Enford Newsletter - £150.00
 Enford Gardening Club - £100 (Start up costs)
 2009 Enford Children's Christmas Party - £298
 Enford Church - £170
 Help for Heroes - £300.00 (agreed benefactor of 2009 fete raffle)
 Dorset & Somerset Air Ambulance - £100.00 (in thanks for rescues/lives saved locally in 2009)

So that's over £4500 of support we've given in 18 months. Thank you to everyone who came to, and helped at, our events you have enabled us to do this.

The following guidelines will be followed in allocating funds to all future applications:

1. Awards will be considered every 6 months in March and September.
2. Awards will be made for individual projects and are not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis.
3. Awards will be made to causes that benefit the community and not specific individuals.
4. No award will be made for greater than £1,000
5. For any award to be granted there must be agreement by at least 75% of the Funding Committee.

LOCAL POLICING

Wiltshire Police advice has been issued to counter the threat of street robbery. 1. You will be safest in bright, well-lit and busy areas. 2. Act confidently - look as if you know where you are going and walk tall. Be alert to your surroundings. 3. Spread your valuables around. For example, keep your phone, house keys and money in different areas of your clothing. 4. If someone tries to take something from you, it may be better to let them take it, rather than getting into a confrontation and risking injury. 5. When out walking, be careful not to make your MP3 player, personal stereo, mobile phone an easy target for robbers. Keep it hidden. 6. Don't advertise your valuables such as your mobile phone, laptop, jewellery or watch. 7. If you use a wheelchair or invalidity scooter, keep your things beside you rather than at the back of the chair. 8. When driving, especially at night and in slow moving traffic, keep your valuables such as your handbag or wallet out of sight and your vehicle doors locked.

Some of the above clearly applies only to inner cities where there are well lit areas, "walking tall" is easier said than done, and the surrendering of valuables without a fight must be down to the individual. I would add that you should carry a mobile phone, dial 999 as soon as there is any trouble, and tell us what is happening; then at least the Police will be able to record your conversation.

FRIENDS OF THE RIDGEWAY - THE GREAT STONES WAY

On Mon 20 Sep10, Councillor Stan Bagwell and myself attended the Tidworth Area Board meeting at Castle Primary School, Ludgershall. During the meeting, a twenty minute presentation was given by Mr Ian Richie, Vice Chairman of the Friends of the Ridgeway organisation.

The group are currently working on a project known as The Great Stones Way. This is a proposed 29 mile walking route connecting the World Heritage Sites of Avebury and Stonehenge, but will eventually be extended to Old Sarum and into Salisbury. This section is the central part of the ancient Ridgeway which follows the chalk escarpment across south-east England between the Dorset coast and The Wash, a distance of approximately 360miles.

The proposed route will, where ever possible, follow existing PROWs and enter Enford Parish in an area west of West Chisenbury, through Compton, Enford, and along the C32 road to Coombe, from where it will cross to Fittleton and Netheravon.

The presentation was very well received, and Mr Richie accepted an invitation to talk to a group from Netheravon, Fittleton and Enford, on a date yet to be arranged.

The Friends of the Ridgeway Group are taking every care to consult and liaise with Town and Parish authorities along the route.

I have been re-reading the life of the Reverend Sydney Smith who was Curate of Netheravon in the 1790s and regarded as the funniest man of his generation. Queen Victoria loved to laugh at his down-to-earth short sentences. Whilst here in Netheravon, he started a Sunday School (the forerunner of the present state education, not as we know Sunday School today) as well as being the tutor to the Hicks Beach family who lived at Netheravon House.

He gave some sound advice to a friend on coping with the depression from which he suffered. Here are just nine recommendations from the twenty listed:

- Take short views of human life, not further away than dinner or tea
- See as much as you can of those friends who respect and like you
- Make no secret of low spirits to your friends but talk of them fully: they are always the worse for dignified concealment
- Attend to the effects tea and coffee produce upon you
- Don't expect too much of human life, a sorry business at best
- Make the room where you commonly sit gay and pleasant
- Don't be too severe upon yourself or underrate yourself
- Keep good blazing fires
- Be firm and constant in the exercise of rational religion

These few tips seem to be very sound as well as fun to read.

If you 'google' Sydney Smith, you will find lots more about him as well as books he has published, even a recipe:

*Two boiled potatoes strained through a kitchen sieve,
Softness and smoothness to the salad give;
Of mordant mustard take a single spoon,
Distrust the condiment that bites too soon!
Yet deem it not, thou man of taste, a fault
To add a double quantity of salt.
Four times the spoon with oil of Lucca crown,
And twice with vinegar procured from town;
True taste requires it and your poet begs
The pounded yellow of two well-boiled eggs.*

*Let onion's atoms lurk within the bowl
And, scarce suspected, animate the whole,
And lastly in the flavoured compound toss
A magic spoonful of anchovy sauce.
Oh, great and glorious! Oh, herbaceous meat!
'Twould tempt the dying Anchorite to eat,
Back to the world he'd turn his weary soul
And plunge his fingers in the salad bowl.*



I have felt very privileged to have followed in his footsteps and look forward to hearing if you have tried the recipe!

HIGHWAY NEWS

Hello Enford Parish Residents

The A345 Road surface conditions from Enford through to Netheravon.

The new surface is now down and we will have new 30mph "Gateway Markings, fresh White Lines and the cats eyes replaced.

The Speed Limit Review. A345 West Chisenbury and Newtown.

We have now had a reply from the Review Body which saying that we could appeal against their decision. We replied with all the evidence we had "On File" which included the number of houses in the two hamlets, number of adults, children and people with disabilities. We also sent photographs of road accidents that had occurred in these areas. This is the third time we have sent these documents to County Hall. The request is being fully supported by our Wiltshire Councillor Charles Howerd who has given us a tremendous amount of support since the change of Councils. We are now confident that a change will come regarding the speed limit from the 30mph zone at Enford north beyond West Chisenbury and south beyond Newtown.

Speeding and Enforcement.

With the close down of Wiltshire and Swindon Camera Safety Partnership and the systematic reduction of the Police Highways and Traffic Units (15% to 5%), this means that the rural areas are no longer covered by the Traffic or Highways Units. What is left of these units will only appear when they are going to an accident or when they are "Passing Through". We must be under no illusions here the police have over the past years been cut to the bone and they have also been confined to "paperwork" and target chasing exercises .

Enford Community Speed Watch (CSW)

CWS has been in place since August 2008. Having been the first Parish to request this scheme in Wiltshire in 2006, and having been turned down by Wiltshire County Council and the Wiltshire Police as being "unworkable", it was stated recently in the media by a Senior Wiltshire Police Officer that the Wiltshire Police would now give full support to the CMS. This may place the Police in a vulnerable position, in as much that they do not have the trained staff in rural areas to cope with all the problems such as speeding in village areas so CMS will have to fill the gap.

The Swan Accident (May 2008).

Patience has now been exhausted. We were hopeful of a successful conclusion to this very expensive accident to the innocent parties who had to count the cost through no fault of their own. It is, therefore, being taken forward to the Police Complaints Commission for investigation.

The C32. Coombe/Enford/Littlecott/West Chisenbury. Traffic Calming.

We have finally managed to get the Council to agree to another Traffic Metro Loop to be deployed in Long Street Enford, so as we may be able to monitor the area by the Enford CSW Team, if we are successful here, we will be able to make a difference to driver behaviour along this very abused lane by "Rat Running" traffic. There was a very sad accident on the C32 at Coombe where a cyclist came off of his cycle and died of his injuries in Salisbury Hospital, our thoughts go out to his relatives. This was a very sad tragic accident. But we must make the authorities aware that this lane was laid down and designed as a village connection lane for horse and carts and pedestrian walkers, it was never ever put there to take 21st century motor vehicles or to be classified for a 60mph speed limit. The lane is now recognised as a "Sustrans" cycle, network route from the Coast to the Midlands, it is also now the "PAT" (Pewsey Avon Trail) a walkers route from Pewsey through to Chichester. It is also going to be part of the Great Stones Way another walkers path. Its not rocket science to work out that Cyclists, People on Foot and Horse Riders don't favour well with fast moving 1 ton pieces of metal. We have the support of the Northern Highways Policing Unit at Swindon and also our Wiltshire Councillor regarding traffic calming and for a reduction of the 60mph National Speed Limit. Once the review has been settled on Class "A" & "B" roads then the Council will start on the "C" class roads this will take about two years, but we are on the case already and have again made many noises to the Council about his small "C" road and how it is being used as a "Rat Run" from the A345 to the A342.

The A345 Heavy Goods Vehicles using the road as a "Through Route".

The A338/A346/A345 working group led by Wiltshire Councillor Charles Howerd will be having a meeting soon with Wiltshire Council Officials regarding the de priming of the A338 and making restrictions on HGV movements along the A345, this meeting will be critical, but it has to be reminded that under the present financial climate, it is possible that the scheme may be shelved due to costs.

The A345 request for an extra bus stop at West Chisenbury.

(I have to apologise here as in my last report I said it was at Compton)

The Parish Council has requested a reduction of the 60mph speed limit to 40mph. Should this be successful then there will be a strong case for Wilts and Dorset Bus Co to install the bus stop. (watch this space) .

The A345 30mph "Gateway Treatment"

This will be renewed under the current resurfacing programme.

The River Avon Bridge (Enford Hill)

As the bridge is to be replaced in 2012, Wiltshire County Council, Over a seven day period, monitored traffic flow and speed through a device placed on the signpost on the west side of the bridge. We will keep you informed.

The River Avon Bridge at Haxton/Netheravon.

Netheravon and Fittleton Parish Councils have agreed with Wiltshire Council on the rebuilding of this bridge. It will be of the same design with a considerable amount of the original top structure being recycled into the new bridge works, making it in keeping with its original design. We will be early informed when this is due to take place.

The A345 30mph Zone New Buildings (West Side) New Proposed Footpath.

We understand that this pedestrian footpath originally requested in 2006 will be laid this Autumn. We will ensure that this comes to fruition.

The A345 at Durrington. Speed Limit Review.

The speed limit will be reduced from 40mph to 30 mph between the first house and the last house on the West Side of the road from Durrington roundabout to the Cemetery.

Grit Bins.

It is not the Parish responsibility to supply the bins of salt and grit. It is the Council's job. However, this does not apply to un-adopted. Enford Parish sent a list some time ago informing the Council as to extra bins for Enford. At Tidworth Area Board meeting 20th September 2010, we were told that allocation would be a lottery, due to financial constraints. There will four extra bins available for the whole of the Tidworth Community Boundary Area but we will try our best

And Finally

Several schemes which have been on the agenda for many years have finally come to fruition in the past few months. Enford Parish Council has done this with the minimum amount of cost to the residents of the Parish. Thank you for being patient and also for your support. Without your support and that of Wiltshire's Councillors , it would have been a much harder hill to climb.

MINISTRY OF DEFENCE

This forecast shows our planned training. Unfortunately operational requirements mean that dates and times can change. The warning flags and signs show the actual range danger areas on a given day. Late night firing times Tues, Thurs and Sat March to October 2330hrs and November to February 2100hrs inclusive.

Any general comment about military training should normally be made through Parish Councils to the Liaison Officer nominated by the appropriate Garrison Headquarters. Any specific complaint should be made in writing or if urgent by telephone as shown below:

TRAINING: October will see a significant increase in training activity across the Plain with the main event being a double TESEX (using the Army Weapons Effect Simulation system), involving 1200 troops from 2nd Battalion The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers and 2nd Battalion The Royal Gurkha Rifles. This exercise will run from 9 – 29 October and will include some armoured opposing forces, and increased low level air activity involving both helicopters and fast jets both day and night. Earlier in the month 3 Regt Army Air Corps will conduct pre-deployment training for 12 Apache attack helicopter crews from 3 – 13 October mainly over the Imber Ranges and adjacent areas. Coinciding with this air activity 3 YORKS armoured battle group will be rehearsing for the Land Combat Power Demonstration (LCPD) on 13/14 October in the Battlesbury Bowl/Heytesbury area. This year's event will feature static displays and a mobility demonstration only with no live firing. From 10 – 15 October the Land Warfare Centre armoured troop commanders course will conduct their final exercise SABRES THRUST across all training areas from Warminster to Tidworth using a squadron of Challenger 2 tanks and a company of Warrior armoured infantry vehicles. Finally the 3rd (UK) Division artillery concentration, Ex IRON STORM, will take place from 11 – 21 October with 1 RHA converting to AS 90 155mm self propelled guns. This exercise will have a live firing phase from 13 – 19 October during which there may be increased noise levels that will be monitored consistently to ensure they do not exceed the permissible level. AS90 night firing will take place on Thursday 14 October, Saturday 16 October and Tuesday 19 October.

ACCESS

Access to Salisbury Plain is regulated by Salisbury Plain Military Lands Byelaws and Bulford, Larkhill and Imber Range Byelaws. This Newsletter is published up to 6 weeks before the event and urgent training bids may come in subsequently. Always comply with local signs and flags.

Access timings can be found on the SPTA Walks Line: (01980) 67 4763.

Bulford Ranges. The public rights of way (PROW) through Bulford Ranges are closed when firing is taking place and red flags are flying. No firing is planned for 9th, 10th, 16th, 17th, 23rd, 24th, 30th and 31st.

Larkhill Ranges. PROW on Larkhill Ranges are closed when firing is taking place and flags are flying. No flying is planned for 2nd, 3rd, 9th, 10th, 23rd, 24th, 30th and 31st.

Note. On occasions some range fires may cause some areas to remain closed.

IMBER

A combination of difficult terrain and unexploded military debris make it hazardous to leave the marked routes. The public are excluded from Imber Ranges at all times, even if flags are not flying. The only exception being when the roads through Imber are opened to allow the public to reduce journey times across Imber Ranges.

Provisional dates for opening the roads at Christmas 2010 are :

From 1800hrs on Friday 17th December to 1800hrs on Monday 3rd January 2011

These dates will only be changed at short notice due to Operational Training Commitments.

Note. Even when the roads are open the village remains out of bounds to the public.



PUBLIC USE OF THE MILITARY LANDS

The more information given the better e.g. time place, vehicle registration, description of individuals and vehicles. If a crime is taking place call 999 and do not challenge the offenders.

Dog Fouling. We have no funds to provide or empty “dog bins” and in large quantities faeces become hazardous waste but in small amounts can be placed in any rubbish bin if “bagged”. All we ask is that:

- Dog walkers stay away from military training.
- Owners pick up faeces, bag them, take them home and put them in their own bin.
