ALL SAINTS ENFORD CHURCH ORGAN PROJECT – UPDATE

The PCC wanted to take this opportunity to update the Parish on the church organ project.

As you may or may not be aware for some time now the existing church organ has been deemed not 'fit for purpose' for a number of reasons. The main one is that it is difficult to play for all other than by the most accomplished organists and this limits its usefulness. Many wedding organists are unable to play their preferred music and the poor performance of the organ has restricted the church as a concert venue by coral groups and ensembles.

The PCC have carefully considered the options available to either upgrade or replace the existing organ. The initial solution was to replace the current pipe organ with an electronic organ. However this solution is not fully supported by the Diocese of Salisbury. They favour pipe organs over electronic alternatives. As a consequence they have asked the PCC to carry out further investigations to find the best solution for Enford church. This has meant that we must put on hold the organ replacement programme, which had seen a new electric organ being in situ by Christmas.

Since the PCC are pushing ahead energetically to address the organ issue and, conscious that any solution will cost money, we continue to raise funds for the eventual solution, whatever that might be. We have therefore opened an 'Organ Development Fund' and all monies raised for that will put into a dedicated fund.

The next fundraising event is a Concert to be held in Enford Church on the 5th February 2011. Details of the event will be published separately in the Newsletter.

Finally, the PCC will keep you posted via the Newsletter on developments in the organ development programme.

News from Pewsey Children's Centre

A Sure Start Children's Centre

The new Pewsey Children's Centre is now open! This purpose built building is on the same site as Pewsey Primary and Secondary School, and shares the building with Puddleducks Nursery and is open to all families in the Pewsey Community Area with children aged 0-5years. The centre is open between 8am-6pm, and parents are welcome to call in any time between 9.00 and 4.30pm, when staff are available to provide help and support for any queries. At certain times, parents can visit our Drop In, which is an 'open door' session where the activity room and resources are available for parents/carers and children to use, with no organised activity. The activity room will also be used to run specific sessions, and the Children's Centre will continue with the usual activities taken out to the surrounding villages. The Children's Centre are next in the area on Friday, 10th December in Woodborough Social Club and Friday, 17th December at Netheravon Phoenix Hall for Friday Funday – come along between 10.30 and 12.00 for a session of fun and creative play. Curious Creation is a weekly session on Thursday afternoons from 1.30-2.30 at the old Upavon School and is an hour of messy play.

Parents/carers are welcome to visit any of our activities, or to call into the Centre to have a look around, and to find out the full programme of activities. The newsletter is also available to pick up from the Information Shop in Pewsey.

MY ENFORD CONNECTIONS

I am Gary Lane living in Bradford, Ontario, Canada and I have just come across your publication on the internet.

Enford is significant to my family history as one of the places numerous family ancestors were born, married, lived, worked, raised families and died. To see the current & 1830 maps – the photos – the current news and general day-to-day happenings is a wonderful surprise.

My ancestral connections to Enford and the immediate area go back 12 generations. The most recent connection is my maternal side Great Grandfather Henry HAWKINS who was born in Enford in 1859. The furthest back I have traced this branch is to my (9 x Great) Grandfather Edmund BANKS born 1624 and who is known to have died in Netheravon in 1706.

The surnames from the area that I am directly connected to are Banks, Barlow, Burden, Cotterel, Daw, Dawkins, Hawkins, Somerby and Swanborough. The places they are connected to are Pewsey, Hilcott, Rushall, Upavon, Enford, Netheravon, Figheldean and Milston.

Sometime between April 1871 and early 1874 my great, great grandfather Jehu HAWKINS gave up the life of "Agricultural Labour" and moved his wife Pamela Louisa (nee DAW) and 5 children to county Glamorgan in South Wales. What compelling reason was there to prompt a man to leave an area where generations of family had lived and worked in agriculture in order to take up a job underground in a coal mine where sadly he was killed a few years later?

Only last month I discovered factual confirmation of my mother's statement "there are men of our family who died underground and are still there." Jehu HAWKINS was killed in the Dinas mine disaster of 13th January 1879. His death was not registered until the 3rd Quarter of the year, which has led me to wonder if this is one of the "men of our family" whose body was never recovered. (I have ordered a copy of his death certificate which may answer this question). Rather sad to think a man from a rural agricultural background of Enford lies in some black damp mine hole in Wales.

From Enford my family tree has spread its branches to Canada, Australia, New Zealand, the US and elsewhere.

I have for some time now been giving consideration to purchasing the micro-fiche records of the Parish Church with the intent of transcribing them and making them available online through the Wiltshire Online Parish Clerk Project.

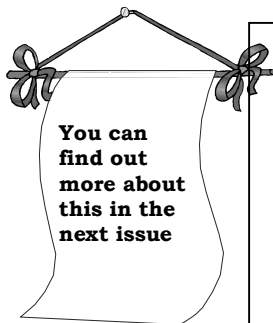

As you can imagine Enford Parish are very disappointed with this recent metro loop for the C32 at Long Street Enford, this is now the second time we have requested to commit our Community Speed Watch Team to this area. In 2009 the percentile speed was 30.9 and in this last result it was 30.6 which came also with an increasing amount of traffic flow.

It is amazing that the percentage was lower this year than last year and with no Skip in existence to impede the readings?. We would like to place a few facts before the Council. This 30 mph speed limit in the village of Enford is all part of the A345 30mph limit and this also takes in Enford Hill which connects the A345 with the C32 which then connects with the A342 past East Chisenbury, so this 30mph speed limit is all part of one, under the same law enforcement for this Enford 30mph area.

In the summer of this year a survey was carried out by a contractor for Mouchel who are the agents for Wiltshire Council, this survey device was positioned half way down Enford Hill, this small lane is no more than 500 metres long, the survey registered the amount of vehicle flow and the speed that the vehicles obtained through the area, this unit confirmed that vehicles were exceeding the speed limit to 40mph, down this small connecting lane. It is inconceivable that vehicles are speeding along the A345 and also down Enford Hill but "Not" through Long Street Enford.

There have been several accidents along the C32 from coombe through Enford to East Chisenbury "All" attributed to speed. I am obtaining photographs of these accidents and will send them to you under separate cover.

The C32 for most of its length is a single track village connection lane and with the exception of Enford and East Chisenbury which are 30mph zones the rest of the lane is covered by a National 60MPH speed limit which is farcical in this day and age, so everyone can imagine what vehicles are likely to do when they come upon these two 30mph restrictions after being allowed to travel at 60mph along the rest of the route.

Coombe, Enford and East Chisenbury have No Pedestrian Pavements whatsoever, most of the properties door front entrances are right on the roadway, and this proves to be very dangerous, when residents step out of their properties onto the C32 Lane. The Villages of Enford and East Chisenbury have been designated Conservation Village areas. The C32 is a well known "Rat Run" from the A345 through Enford and East Chisenbury Villages exiting onto the A342 at Upavon.

We trust that the Council are fully aware that the C32 is now a recognised "Sustrans" cycle route from the West Midlands to the coast, it is also now part of the Pewsey Avon Trail (PAT) for walkers and soon to be next year part of the Great Stones Way from Avebury through to Stonehenge again for walkers, this small lane is going to see an enormous amount of Cyclists and Pedestrian Walkers exploring these trails along this small single track lane in the coming future, and these people do not mix well with fast moving 1 ton pieces of metal.

Enford Parish Council have over the past years been campaigning for some form of traffic calming along the A345 and also the C32. We have made a big impact on the A345 regarding speeding vehicles, we would also like to carry the same forward for the C32. We have the volunteer force and the experience all we require is the authority from the Council, for the Enford Community Speed Watch Scheme to carry out the traffic calming in Long Street Enford (C32).so as to ensure that this small lane is not abused by inconsiderate speeding motorists passing through the area.

With regard to the 85 percentile speed criteria that is used at present, it only takes one driver and vehicle travelling at 35mph to kill or maim a child/pedestrian or cyclist, this criteria and the OLD 60mph National Speed Limit regarding this small lane, are completely out of date and not in touch with the type of high tech modern day vehicles and the people who are now using them.

I don't know if the Council takes any other things into consideration when deciding on this 85 percentile criteria regarding speed, but over the past year there have been quite a few deaths on the rural roads of Wiltshire where drivers have been charged with causing death by dangerous driving and this problem is escalating, which means that now there are no speed cameras or safety camera partnership or police patrolling the highways things will only get worse.

Enford Parish are committed to road safety within this area and we feel that prevention is better than cure. One death in Enford on the highways is one too many.

We trust that the Council will now reconsider this situation to allow the Enford Volunteer Community Speed Watch Team to monitor the C32 at Long Street Enford for future road safety.

The Results of the survey for the area of Long Street are provided below.

The survey was carried out between 12/10/2010 and 20/10/2010. A total of 3439 vehicles were checked. The 85th percentile was 30.6mph (the 85th percentile is the speed at which 85% of the traffic is travelling at or below).

As with every other department, we have to target our limited resources to where they will be most effective and as such I would remind you that unless there are exception circumstances we will not except another count request for this location or close surrounding area for another 12 months. For your information the thresholds for interventions are below;

30 to 32 mph 85th percentile = No Further Action (NFA)
 32.1 to 34.9 mph 85th percentile = eligible for Community Speed Information (temporary) Sign Boards
 35 to 38.9 mph 85th percentile = eligible for Community Speed Watch
 39 to 42 mph 85th percentile = eligible for the Speed Indicator Device (SID) programme
 40 to 43 mph 85th percentile = No Further Action (NFA)
 43.1 to 45.9 mph 85th percentile = eligible for Community Speed Information (temporary) Sign Boards
 46 to 48.9 mph 85th percentile = eligible for Community Speed Watch
 49 to 53 mph 85th percentile = eligible for the Speed Indicator Device (SID) programme

Community Speed Watch does not operate in any speed limit above 40mph.
 Any other results in higher speed limits will be discussed on their individual basis and merit.

TRAINING ON SPTA

December will see a significant reduction in training levels on the Plain in the wind down to Christmas. The Royal School of Artillery conduct end of course live firing 1st – 3rd and 14th – 15th December, which will include AS90. During the second week the Defence Logistics' School will be running combat logistic convoys of up to 80 heavy wheeled vehicles across the whole of the Plain. Except for movement to and from the Plain convoys will be restricted to the training area and tank crossings. From 13th – 17th the Land Warfare Centre will mount two large armoured exercises, BADGERS STRESS and TEAM SPIRIT during which reconnaissance, armoured infantry and armoured elements will deploy across most of SPTA. From the 18th Military activity will reduce to a low level.

ACCESS

Access to Salisbury Plain is regulated by Salisbury Plain Military Lands Byelaws and Bulford, Larkhill and Imber Range Byelaws. This Newsletter is published up to 6 weeks before the event and urgent training bids may come in subsequently. Always comply with local signs and flags.

Access timings can be found on the SPTA Walks Line: (01980) 67 4763.

Bulford Ranges. A number of public rights of way (PROW) run through Bulford Ranges and are closed when firing is taking place and red flags are flying. No firing is planned for the 11th, 12th, 20th to 31st December inclusive

Larkhill Ranges. A number of PROW run through Larkhill Ranges and are closed when firing is taking place and flags are flying. No firing is planned for the 11th, 12th, 13th, 20th, 21st to 31st December inclusive

Note. In the event of range fires access may be denied to some areas due to the risk of unexploded ordnance "cooking off".

Imber. Difficult terrain and unexploded military debris make it hazardous to leave the marked routes. The public are excluded from Imber Ranges at all times, even if flags are not flying. The only exception being when the roads through Imber are opened to allow the public to reduce journey times across Imber Ranges.

The dates for Christmas/New Year 2010/11 opening have been extended and will now be from 1600 hrs on Friday 17 Dec 2010 to 1600 hrs on Thursday 6th January 2011. **Note this is a change from the traditional 1800 hrs to 1600 hrs in order to allow opening/closing works and range clearance to be completed in daylight.**

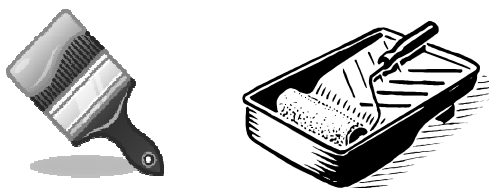
