What's that?

LOCAL POLICING

Boiler room scams are on the increase. The victim is contacted by telephone or e-mail, and told of an investment possibility which will produce a wonderful return, far more than one would expect. The investment house may sound very similar to a reputable organisation or have a very ornate website. The victim sends off the money, which is invested, and the criminal disappears. Subsequently the victim finds that either the money has disappeared, or it has been invested in near-worthless junk. Average losses are £20,000. The scam is named after unscrupulous con-men who set up in the basements of banks or investment houses in Wall Street, New York, if the victim wanted to check out the telephone number of the person they were talking to, it would come up as the correct address, but the phone would be in the boiler room, to which the con-man had access.

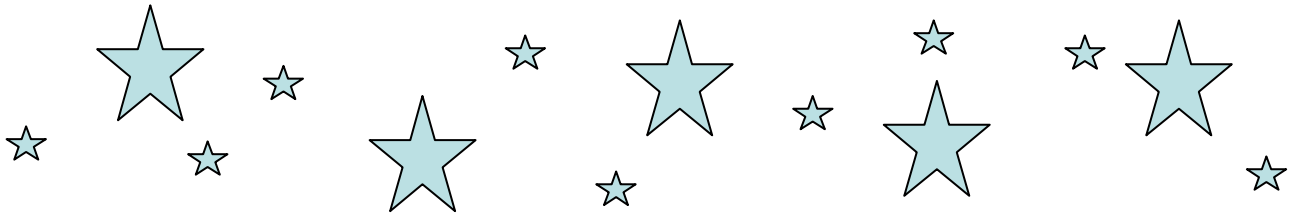
Police were called to an altercation in Long Street, Enford, and someone was the victim of threats in Chisenbury Court, East Chisenbury.

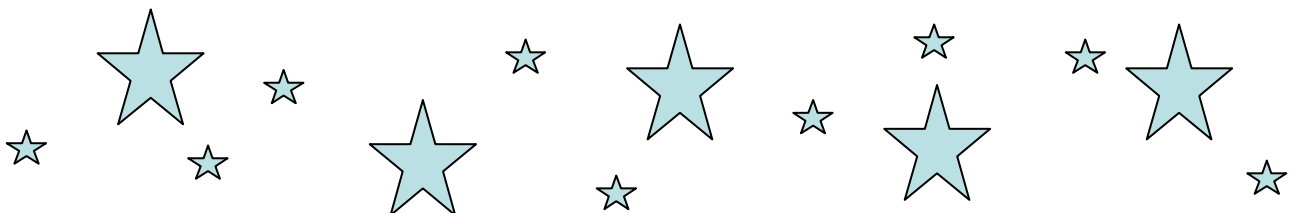

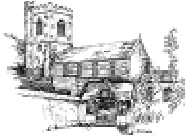

HIGHWAY NEWS

HIGHWAY NEWS Hello Enford Parish Residents, it was March last time I gave a report . Herewith is an updated report for you:

The C32 30mph zone Long Street Enford Village

Enford Parish Council would like to inform you all that after a two year battle to get the C32 integrated with the A345 Community Speed Watch Scheme we have been successful in our efforts and will now be allowed to operate on the C32 north of Water Lane by the White Cottages. So far we have carried out 2 half hour watches with no permanent results. It must be noted that at the times of carrying out the watches these were pilot schemes and it was after we had carried out a watch at Enford Hill. Also, there were other factors that were not evident at the time. We will endeavour to carry out a full watch at this site but we are now restricted on the camera use due to sharing with another team on the A338 at the Collingbournes [More details in the report below].

Enford Community Speed Watch Scheme [Started August 20th 2008 one of three pilot sites]

Enford attended the Wiltshire Community Speed Watch Scheme Meeting at the Corn Exchange in Devizes on 18th April 2011. All teams were invited and there were 41 teams at the last count operating within Wiltshire. The meeting was well attended. Enford Group Team were presented with an award by the Chief Constable of Wiltshire in recognition of an outstanding contribution to road safety in Wiltshire [Well done Team].

We were given statistic reports of what has occurred during the past year within Wiltshire. Enford was attributed with approximately 10% of the overall speeding motorists within Wiltshire. All attending teams were given the chance to speak and also make remarks on flip sheets of what we felt was wrong or right with the working of the scheme.

Enford has now been told to share the Unipar camera with the Collingbournes [A338] who will now have 2 teams operating in their area. We see this as a step backwards to Enford operations and it is counter productive to our past efforts and achievements.

On 22nd February 2011 the camera was taken away for calibration, we received it back on 4th April 2011. 42 days [6 weeks] of downtime. We had the camera for 12 days use and we were asked to hand the camera over to the Collingbourne team for them to use. We have since been out of operation up to 15th May 2011 which is another 17 days downtime. This means that we have been inhibited and non operational for approximately 2 months. This cannot be progress not when we were experiencing up to 500 counted vehicles passing through the A345 in a one hour watch of which most of the vehicles were exceeding the 30mph speed limit. With these future circumstances we will not be expecting an award next year for our outstanding contribution to road safety in Wiltshire!

We consider the lack of equipment to do the job properly and efficiently is now working fundamentally against the scheme bearing in mind when Enford first took up the challenge in 2008 the police gave us 2 cameras to operate with and then we were reduced to one and now its going to be now and again [part time]. We must mention here that at the Tidworth Area Board Meeting at Collingbourne Ducis this month when we raised the question of lack of equipment to do the job correctly the Area Board said they will now look into funding camera requirement for the Tidworth Area Scheme.

The A345 Department of Transport Road Network Policy Consultation

We have submitted our letter to the DfT and copied the Hon. Claire Perry MP for Devizes and Wiltshire Councillor Charles Howerd on this issue. The points we made were that the A345 is not a suitable 'through route' north to south through Wiltshire for large HGVs and other traffic that is now using this small 'drovers road' as a convenient quick route from the A303/M3 to the A4/M4. We also said that Wiltshire Council does not recognize the A345 as a major North to South through route.

2 New bus stops for West Chisenbury

Improvement of the Community Speed Watch Scheme within Wiltshire.

Recognition by the Authorities of increased traffic flow using the A345 North to South and restrictions required to halt the large HGVs using this small road as a 'Through Route' across Wiltshire causing damage to the highway/verges and residents property and also increasing pollution to the local environment.

I would like to thank all of the Enford Community Speed Watch Volunteer Team for their commitment and support over the past three years. Without them the scheme here in Enford would not have survived. Thank you all for assisting me in taking this scheme forward for our area.

NEWSFLASH

The Carrier Group USS George HW Bush is on its first combat deployment and will be exercising off the Scilly Isles on EXERCISE SAXON WARRIOR. HQ DTE SP has just agreed to allow the Carrier Strike Group to conduct live strafing and bombing runs on Larkhill ranges on Sat 21 May 11 from 1300 – 2330 hrs using F18 Hornet and EA6 Prowler aircraft.

TRAINING ON SPTA

31 May Royal Engineers will close the military road between C crossing (A345) and C1 (C32) in order to construct an engineer bridge over the River Avon. There may be a short closure (a few hours at some stage from 23 May in order to complete welding repairs on the same bridge.

June will be relatively quiet. During the first two weeks 3 YORKS from Warminster and 2 R WELSH from Tidworth will carry out low level armoured infantry training in Warriors on the West and East together with a company of Warriors from 1 Scots Guards.

16 – 19 May sees the largest armoured exercise in the calendar (Ex LION STRIKE), an AS90 self propelled artillery battery exercise from the Royal School of Artillery and a squadron from 4 Logistics Support Regiment conducting combat logistic patrols on

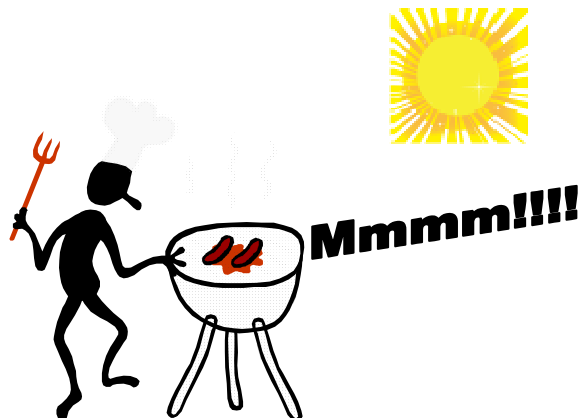

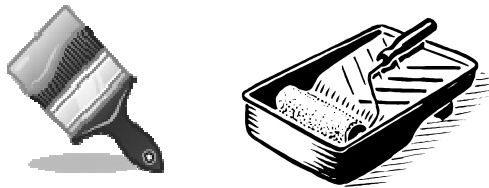
