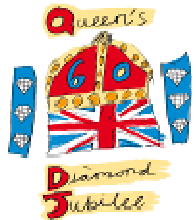

PROPOSED RECONSTRUCTION OF ENFORD BRIDGE

It has been brought to our attention that despite our best efforts to be one step ahead of nature a pair of Swans have built a nest immediately adjacent to the bridge and now sitting on a number of eggs. As well as our own moral considerations these nests are protected by law so we have no option but to temporarily postpone the works until the nest is vacated.

The first job to do on site is placing of the temporary footbridges and moving the public water and telephone supplies apparatus on to them for the duration of the works. Getting these supplies diverted takes several weeks planning so unfortunately it's not a case of going in as soon as the nest is vacated, we therefore have to err on the side of caution and plan ahead as best as we can but allowing an extra couple of days 'just in case'. The road closure will therefore now not commence until **Wednesday the 6th June** ie immediately following the extended bank holiday weekend, this is likely to have a knock on effect to the anticipated end date and it's too early to say how much, if any, time can be made up.

ENFORD COMMUNITY FUND

The following guidelines will be followed in allocating funds

1. Awards will be considered every 6 months in March and September
2. Awards will be made for individual projects and are not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis
3. Awards will be made to causes that benefit the community and not specific individuals
4. No awards will be made for greater than £1000
5. For any award to be granted there must be agreement by at least 75% of the funding committee

RAISING FUNDS FOR BRAINWAVE

On 22nd June 2012 I will be flying to Tanzania to climb Kilimanjaro in order to raise money for a charity that is very close to my heart called Brainwave. Brainwave, founded in 1982, works with families to deliver individual home based therapies that help children with disabilities reach their full potential. This can be anything from walking to conditions such as Down's Syndrome and Cerebral Palsy. For more information visit www.brainwave.org.uk.

I have funded the cost of the trip myself so all money raised will go to Brainwave. This is where I am asking for your support. I aim to raise £5,000 to help the work of this charity.

I will be trekking for 6 days and sleeping in a tent with temperatures getting below -20, collecting water from streams and prior to this will be having a multitude of vaccinations. I will reach an altitude of almost 6,000m to stand on the roof of Africa. After 4 days of walking on the summit I will attempt to cover the same distance and ascent as climbing Ben Nevis but with 50% less oxygen.

This is a major physical challenge for me and I am already training very hard so that I don't let myself down, Brainwave or all the people who have shown their support by sponsoring me in this once in a lifetime opportunity.

Rogation Sunday 13th May

Rogation means an asking of God - for blessing on the seed and land for the year ahead.

It is appropriate in any emergency, war, plague, drought or foul weather.

The practice began with the Romans, who invoked the help of the gods Terminus and Ambarvalia. In those days a crowd moved in procession around the cornfields, singing and dancing, sacrificing animals, and driving away Winter with sticks. They wanted to rid the cornfields of evil.

About 465 the Western world was suffering from earthquake, storm and epidemic. So Mamertius, Bishop of Vienne, aware of the popular pagan custom, ordered that prayers should be said in the ruined or neglected fields on the days leading up to Ascension.

With his decision, 'beating the bounds' became a Christian ceremonial.

Rogation-tide arrived in England early in the eighth century, and became a fixed and perennial asking for help of the Christian God. On Rogation-tide, a little party would set out to trace the boundaries of the parish. At the head marched the bishop or the priest, with a minor official bearing a Cross, and after them the people of the parish, with schoolboys and their master trailing along. Most of them held slender wands of willow.

At certain points along the route - at well-known landmarks like a bridge or stile or ancient tree, the Cross halted, the party gathered about the priest, and a litany or rogation as said, imploring God to send seasonable wealth, keep the corn and roots and boughs in good health, and bring them to an ample harvest. At one point beer and cheese would be waiting.

In the days when maps were neither common nor accurate, there was much to be said for 'beating the bounds' - still very common as late as the reign of Queen Victoria.

Certainly parish boundaries rarely came into dispute, for everyone knew them.

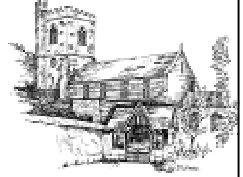

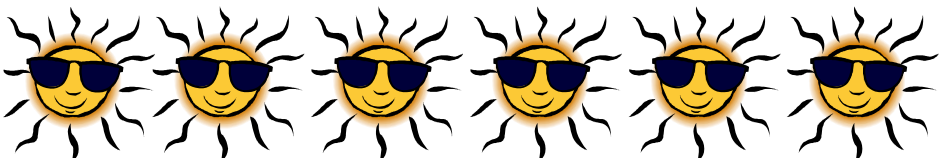

Stop Press: 14-18 May “Charlie Crossing” over the Avon will be closed while 22 Engineer Regiment conducts bridging training. Those who use that permissive route should plan accordingly.

TRAINING IN MAY

May starts fairly quietly when Land Warfare Centre use Challenger tanks on Exercise FIRST VIEW (2-3 May) and for the first two weeks a squadron of Challenger tanks (2 RTR) and a company of Warrior armoured fighting vehicles (2 Royal Welsh) will train across the whole of Salisbury Plain.

13-23 May a Royal Netherlands Marine Corps 120mm Mortar Battery visit for their live firing camp.

During the last two weeks of May there will be:

Heavy use of the tank crossings on the Tilshead to Chitterne road, A360 and A345.

Some training noise during hours of darkness

Low flying by helicopters and fast jets.

21-24 May Ex LION'S STRIKE is on SPTA West and Larkhill.

26-27 May two hundred members of 4 PARA (V) and the US Army Reserve will make a series of parachute drops on the Everleigh Drop Zone as a rehearsal for the D Day commemorations.

28-31 May Ex SABRES THRUST will train across the whole Plain and the Royal School of Artillery will conduct live firing which will include an AS90 artillery battery.

Note Vehicle movement may cause delays at tank crossings and drivers should take care when approaching crossings as mud clearance parties and mechanical sweepers will be at work

FIRING NOISE

Live Firing. Firing is closely managed to ensure that legal noise limits are not exceeded and disturbance is minimised. Although some may find the noise intrusive, it is well below legal limits.
