The Ethics of Defence Estates Sponsored Shoots

I was motivated to write a letter, 2 months ago, to the Enford Newsletter as a result of walking past the local shoot as they were collecting up their 'haul' for the day, back in January, which comprised some 12 wild mallard duck and 3 pheasants. I felt that such a loss of our wild duck population was unsustainable.

The response to my letter on behalf of the shoot justified the targeting of wild duck on the basis that there was an infinite source of such duck and stated that the place of those ducks shot will be readily replaced by the previous year's hatchlings. This assumed of course that they, the hatchlings, survived the onslaught of the shoot. The shoot in question operates along the river from Coombe to Netheravon less than a mile in length and on one day they shot 12 wild duck. Since the shoot extends over a 5 month period, it is reasonable to assume it will meet at least 10 times and one can only guess at the numbers lost to our local environment over that time frame. Regardless, however, of the numbers of wild duck shot during the season, the loss of such wildlife is unsustainable. The shoot and all such shoots licensed to operate on publicly owned land should be restricted to take from our local environment that which they introduce and only that which they introduce – simple economics which define a sustainable system.

In order to counter the assumption that there are plenty of wild duck regardless of the level of attrition to which they are exposed, we need look no further than Google to confirm that which we know already – that all British wildlife is in sharp decline due to habitat loss, predation etc. However specifically in relation to our wild duck population, the Wildfowl Wetland Trust report of 2011 states: 'One of the greatest losses recorded in the report has been the mallard – Britain's most familiar duck – which has hit a new low with the lowest recorded numbers wintering at their most important UK strongholds.' [The State of the UK's Birds 2011 report](#) shows that winter mallard numbers have declined by 38 per cent since 1982 and by 22 per cent since 1998. Those are national statistics but what about local statistics – the Wiltshire Ornithological Society carried out peak winter counts 91/92 each year to 99/00 on the Salisbury Avon (our river) and the number of mallard over that time dropped from a peak of 418 in 91/92 to 80 in 99/00. Despite those stark findings, here we have Defence Estates, whose mantra was and should be sustainable stewardship of the Salisbury Plain ranges, allowing shoots to be the arbiters of what wildlife we, the locals, are able to enjoy through what is clearly a lax licensing system.

I was surprised at the level of unsolicited support that I received from Coombe residents to my last letter which reflects deep resentment over the unsustainable way the shoot is managed. No residents of Coombe are members of the shoot and it is these outsiders from where ever they come, who shape in some measure our local bio diversity.

It is a sad but seemingly inevitable foot note to record the observation that despite walking along and across the river at least once a day, whilst I have seen cygnets and moorhen chicks, the only place I have seen any ducklings, this year, was on the canal in Salisbury, where our rather more enlightened urban cousins take pleasure from the sight of wild ducks, rather than shoot them!!

SAVE MONEY ON YOUR HEATING BILLS

Are you aware that there is a Community Bulk Oil Buying Scheme? This is run by Community First (CF) and as the Local Co-ordinator for Enford and Chisenbury I thought I would remind you of the savings that you could be making! This scheme has been set up to help purchasers of central heating oil to make savings by buying in bulk. CF is a local charity that works to support community based action across Wiltshire.

In summary householders pay an annual fee of £20 to join the scheme (£30 for community organisations and £100 for businesses). Once you are a member your local co-ordinator (me) will contact you monthly to ask if you want to place an order (the minimum order is 500 litres). You place your order with the local co-ordinator who will submit the village total to CF (once submitted your order is regarded as binding). CF pass the combined order details onto the negotiators who seek to negotiate the best price from a range of suppliers. The local co-ordinator will then be in touch to advise you who the supplier is, the price per litre (exclusive of VAT) and the approximate date of delivery. Once the oil has been delivered the oil company will invoice you direct.

The negotiated price that members paid for orders placed in April 2013 was 63.0 pence per litre (ppl), the average price quoted to CF Oil at that time was 68.44 ppl and the highest 74.00 ppl. Based on the average quoted price and an order of 500 litres (which is the minimum order) the saving would have been £27.20 so even after the membership cost you would be making savings against your very first order.

To join the scheme you will need to send a completed membership form and a cheque payment to CF. The membership form and further information on the scheme can be found on the CF website www.communityfirst.org.uk by following the links to the Bulk Oil Purchasing Scheme. If you do not have access to the internet and want to find out more you can contact Jess Emery on 01380 722475.

CF will notify me of new member details as soon as they join. I will contact you as soon as I receive this notification. I am hoping to do this as much as possible by email, but I will drop off paper order forms and a list of order dates to anyone that joins who is not on email, and contact you individually to arrange how we will work the monthly ordering.

The more of us that join the scheme the greater the negotiating power and the greater the savings.

The whole experience was truly enchanting , a lovely evening.

Vietnam, Cambodia and Thailand – Part 3

From the traffic and commercialism of Saigon we travelled down to Can Tho on the Mekong Delta and boarded a junk for four days. However, when we arrived we were led onto a small boat and sped upriver. We were rather perplexed but soon found out that our boat was already on its way upriver. We quickly caught up with it and drew alongside, mid river, and had to jump across from one boat to the other, the luggage being thrown across as we did so. We all survived! The fear of falling into that murky brown water helped no end!

By now our group knew each other quite well, especially after the escapades in the mudbath (see last episode), which was lucky as we were then warned that we would all be sleeping together, in basic accommodation, with one toilet!!! Hmmm!

We found to our amazement that we were indeed in the same area but it consisted of virtually the whole deck; three double bunks down each side with pristine white bed linen and mosquito nets, fluffy pillows and duvets, and three bathrooms!

We were faced with a small problem at bedtime. Either we could have a quiet night with the engines switched off and therefore no electricity for the cooling fans strung through the cabin, or, we could have the cooler temperatures and the noise. Having mosquito nets meant that we could sleep with all the windows wide so the consensus of opinion was to switch off the engines – wonderful! Well it was for the occupiers of the lower bunks (i.e. me), the others baked in their beds (no windows up there!)



There was a staff of three, consisting of the captain, who

insisted on steering the boat only with his feet, and two guys who did everything else i.e. cook, clean, guide on hikes etc., and they looked after us very well indeed. Huge breakfasts of pancakes, eggs, juice and coffee, then lunch followed by 8 course seafood/fish dinners in the evening, usually fish caught that day from the boat.

We were each given a cocktail of rice wine and juice after dinner which led on to the drinkers amongst us taking it in turn to buy a bottle of some sort of spirit and we would sit out on deck after dinner watching life along the river bank until it got dark when the stories would start. Eventually we'd start to totter and stagger, (the movement of the boat of course!) down the various ladders to bed. We went at more or less the same time to save disturbing the others. And what a great sleep it was!

Not being allowed a lie in though, we were all seated around the breakfast table at 7am ready for our 8am trip to the floating markets to pick up our vegetables for the coming meals.

Stopping at various villages along the river we were surprised by how enterprising the villagers were, setting up small businesses to sell their wares to visitors. At Ben Tre there was a sweet making 'factory' with its huge vats of coconut and caramel, girls sitting at long tables cutting and packing, all out in the open air. Then we found a distillery, making wine and liqueurs, huge jars of snakes among the various fruits fermenting on the shelves. Of course we had to try the various offerings – I'd not tried snake wine before! I've had worse experiences, (notably eating a witchety grub in Australia which gave me nightmares for months afterwards. I was convinced it was growing inside me)!!!

We then found sampans moored at the riverside so took one back to our boat on the main river.

We walked one day from where the ship berthed to a plantation to see the various trees, jackfruit and the evil smelling durian, together with papaya, mango and other fruit and vegetables etc. grown in the area. By this time it was very, very hot and the locals we passed were all taking it easy in hammocks strung outside, their children playing in the dirt beneath.

What bliss to get back for a refreshing shower before tucking into spring rolls, fish and enormous prawns, fruit and beer, followed by an afternoon snooze on one of the sunloungers. When the sun had cooled a little we'd stop at another interesting place further up the river, and so the days sped by.

All too quickly we were driving back to Saigon, in readiness for our journey to the Cu Chi Tunnels and Cambodia, which will be the final instalment in next month's edition.

STOP PRESS

Considerable damage has been done to the byway network by large numbers of four wheel drive (4WD) users during the very wet winter . Landmarc and Wiltshire Council have been conducting repairs in the drier weather especially in Chitterne, Shrewton, Tilshead and Wylde parishes. We are working with Tread Lightly and Wiltshire Council to educate all users on sustainable use of green lanes and will publish a Good Practice Guide (GPG) shortly.

A section of stock fence is soon to be erected between the Impact Area and the perimeter tank track on Ridgeway in Market Lavington and Easterton parishes in the area of Lavington Vedette. This will not affect rights of way and will include a kissing gate for the proposed new **Lavington Loop** footpath.

There will be an update on Plain Watch in next month’s edition.

TRAINING

June will start with fairly low levels of training in the first week.

10 – 24 June sees the major training event involving 3rd Battalion the Scottish Regiment and 3rd Battalion the Yorkshire Regiment on Exercise WESSEX THUNDER using the AWES weapons effect simulation system. 3 SCOTS are a light role battalion equipped with light wheeled vehicles and 3 YORKS are an armoured infantry battalion equipped with Warrior and Bulldog supported by a Challenger tank squadron and armoured engineer troop for their role as the Land Warfare Centre Battle Group. WESSEX THUNDER will train in the West and Centre of the Plain. Local units from Tidworth and Bulford conduct fairly extensive training on the East.

24 – 30 June, 12 Mechanised Brigade will rehearse and conduct an armoured battle group obstacle crossing demonstration on Imber Ranges. In the same period squadrons from 1 Royal Tank Regiment (Challenger), the Light Dragoons (CVRT) and 4 Logistic Support Regiment together with a Royal Netherlands Marine Corps mortar battery will carry out low level training in the Centre and East. u

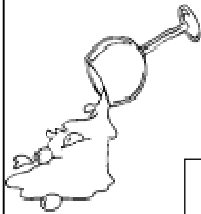
