Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 Temporary Closure of: A342 (Part) Everleigh and Upavon (Ref: TTRO 3501)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic:

A342 (Part) Everleigh and Upavon; from its junction with The Street, Everleigh in a north westerly direction for a distance of approximately two miles (3.22km)

To enable: Wiltshire Council to carry out carriageway resurfacing and associated works.

Alternative route: via A342 (unaffected length) – A388 – A303 – A345 – A342 (unaffected length).

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order will come into operation on 16th July 2014 for two nights between 19:00 and midnight. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. The Order will have a maximum duration of 18 months. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses although delays are likely due to the nature of the works.

Enford Parish Council Update

This last year has been over-shadowed by the unexpected death of Ken Monk. He served Enford Parish for 30 years and for the last 13 years had been Chairman of the Council.

The sad loss of Ken has led to Norman Beardsley being elected Chairman, Norman lives in Coombe and has served the Parish Council for 15 years. Nigel Murray who was elected to the council in April 2014 has been elected Vice Chairman.

The number of Councillors has fluctuated over this past year, however we are now working with the correct allocation for the north and south wards of 11 Councillors, who are all unpaid volunteers.

These are:

1 Norman Beardlsey - Chairman 2 Nigel Murray - Vice Chairman 3 Jane Young 4 Patricia Holdway 5 Michael Fay 6 Richard Pettit 7 Gareth Holden8 Bruce Waight9 David Harbottle10 Richard Roberts11 Anthony D'Arcy Irvine

One of the issues we have had to deal with has been the Flooding. Working with various sectors within Wiltshire Council we are trying to achieve the best long term protection against future floods in Enford. The location of the village, the lie of the land and the unpredictability of weather patterns are beyond control but we continue to work with Wiltshire Council, the Environment Agency and Water Boards. The voluntary post of 'Flood Warden' has been created which Steve Crompton has agreed to take on.

Cllr David Harbottle has been working with the Highways Dept. to keep the roads, verges, road signage, speed limits, street lights etc throughout the Parish in the best possible condition; a difficult task due to shrinking budgets. His work is keeping Enford and its problems high on the Council's 'to do' list. Any issues regarding highways should be reported to David who will raise them with the Highways Dept.

Likewise, Cllr Norman Beardsley has been overseeing the Public Rights of Way, their general state, maintenance, 'up and down grading,' change of use and/or direction. Any issues regarding Public Rights of Way should be reported to Norman.

All the Cllrs are on the Planning committee and give appraisal to applications within the Parish.

Cllrs assist with clearing and tidying up the Play Park and maintaining facilities around the village, including bus shelters, benches, communal areas etc. It is likely that the increase in military numbers in our area will have an impact on our community, liaison officers from various organisations brief on this and other matters at each council meeting.

Parish Council meetings are open to the Public, there is a 'Public Question Time' for matters of concern relating to our community to be raised, alternatively any member of the parish can contact the clerk or any councillor to request a particular subject is added to the agenda for discussion. In most instances the Parish Council is a link to the relevant authority and will raise your concerns directly with them.

Please be considerate when dealing with your dogs in cars on hot days. It is unwise to leave animals in cars in the summer. The temperature in a car can soar on a sunny day, even if it is not particularly hot, putting the dog's life at risk. Be wary of leaving dogs in a car on a cloudy day. If the clouds clear, the car is at the mercy of the sun. If the police are called to a distressed dog left in a car with inadequate ventilation and no water, they will take action to save the dog, by breaking a window, and the owner may be prosecuted.

The Army Training Area provides plenty of opportunity for leisure activities. There are many signs up warning members of the public not to touch anything or pick it up. There was a recent incident in Tidworth where a neighbour reported seeing a resident with a hand grenade, which sparked an unnecessary police reaction, because the item was a spent munition, but it had been brought off the Training Area by an inquisitive individual. Of course there would have been no incident if the individual had obeyed the Army signs and left the thing alone in the first place.

Reported incidents:

In Coombe Lane there was a Hit and Run road traffic collision, whereby a parked car was damaged by an unknown passing vehicle. Hare coursers were seen with dogs on nearby farmland.

Community Beat Manager Writes:

Whilst I was out on patrol last month, we were given some information, which we acted on immediately. We found a Cannabis Factory, seized 806 Cannabis plants, and the cultivator was arrested. Please be aware that drugs production is not limited to inner cities and it can happen anywhere. If any of you have any information about drugs, please let me know.

I have done more patrolling on foot and on the police bicycle, having racked up over 51 miles cycling, visiting all the villages on Monday 19th May and completing a 9.5 mile foot patrol around Ludgershall and the Chutes on Wednesday 21st with PCSO Rosie Smith.

The Tidworth NPT Team achieved second equal place in the Neighbourhood Policing Awards this year. Also my congratulations go to PCSO Maria Downham, who achieved second equal place in the PCSO of the Year Awards.

TRAINING

July will be a very busy month on the Plain with 4 major Armoured Exercises starting with the Land Warfare Centre Armoured Division Exercise FIRST VIEW on the 2^{nd} & 3^{rd} of July with Challenger tanks training on the Imber and Larkhill ranges.

This is followed by a Squadron from the 2^{nd} Royal Tank Regiment with Challenger 2 tanks, 1^{st} Battalion the Yorkshire Regiment Armoured Infantry Company in Warrior AFV's, and an armoured engineer squadron from 26 Engineer Regiment conducting low level training across all areas.

The next major exercise will be the Land Warfare Centre Ex LIONS STRIKE from the 14th to 17th July using the Imber and Larkhill dry training areas for the largest armoured exercise in the programme. The third major exercise will be Ex CROSSED CANNONS 21st to 25th July when 3 of the Royal School of Artillery courses combine for their largest training exercise of the year during which AS90 and Light Gun live firing takes place.

Finally the Land Warfare Centre Armoured Division will deploy their Challenger 2 tanks across the whole Plain for Ex SABRES THRUST 28th to 31st July and will be joined by the Brigade Recce CVRTs for their final exercise BADGERS STRESS.


