A word from Rev Philip Bromiley

Shedding a tear



There was a little boy who gave 50p to the Vicar after a service, as he was shaking hands with parishioners. "That's for you" the little boy said. "That's very kind, but why?" replied the Vicar. "Well, my dad says, you're the poorest preacher he's ever heard."

Preachers will be limbering up in November to help congregations consider again the tremendous sacrifices of our armed forces and the suffering of many millions of civilians caught up in war and terror. It remains a profound moment and for many, a time to shed a tear as we reflect and remember.

There are painful experiences in our world because living in a broken world is fraught with danger. Not just wars and conflicts, but the sufferings we all endure from time to time in our daily lives. As a child, I remember my sister nearly severed her thumb on a lemonade bottle and it was awful. It reminds me of that Annie Lennox song 'walking on broken glass'. The last verse: Now everyone of us was made to suffer, Every one of us was made to weep, But we've been hurting one another, And now the pain has cut too deep... So take me from the wreckage. Save me from the blast. Lift me up and take me back. Don't let me keep on walking. on broken glass. The Good News of the Gospel is that Jesus has saved us from the wreckage.

Although the shattered glass of our brokenness still lies on the floor, we are rescued from its permanent consequences. Christians are not immune from the suffering around us. Nevertheless, we carry a hope of heaven where there will be no more pain and our tears will be wiped away. Until then, I suppose we must tread carefully.

I've noticed, there is a lot of crying in Scripture, 697 references to be precise. Tears are the hallmarks of the shattered glass on the floor of our broken world. Abraham wept over the death of Sarah. Hannah wept before the Lord for she was without a child. Esau wept over his father Isaac, after being cheated out of a blessing. The Psalms are wringing wet with the tears Of David before the Lord. Jeremiah was called the Weeping Prophet. Jesus Himself wept over the future of Jerusalem and at the grave of Lazarus his friend. Tears of sadness. Tears of grief. Tears of repentance and sorrow for sin.

Don't be ashamed of your tears. For the chemist, they are simply a combination of sodium chloride, phosphate of lime, mucus and water. For the critic, they are a sign of weakness. To the Lord, they represent the bleeding of a broken heart. He honours our tears and never fails to come close to us when we cry. Tears in our prayers are a sign of honesty. Sir Walter Scott said, "Tears are the softening showers which cause the seed of heaven to spring up in the human heart."

Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 12th October 2021

21/113 Police Matters and Neighbourhood Watch

PC Sharon Duggan was unable to attend. Cllr Clark said there was nothing new to report from the Neighbourhood Watch aspect. Cllr Roberts said he had joined an online Area Board 'clinic' (informal meeting) where Police and Fire service 'heads' had been invited to attend and answer any questions directly. It would appear that Amesbury and Swindon have considerable 'law and order' problems and he pointed out how lucky Enford is to have so little unpleasant behaviour.

21/115 Unitary Council Matters

i. **Stonehenge Area Board 'Clinics'**. These are held on the first Monday of each month at 7pm on Teams. The link is issued by the Community Engagement Manager (CEM), Jacqui Abbott. These are open to anyone and are not simply an informal version of the Stonehenge Area Board. They had started as a 'clinic' for anyone to raise issues and questions. That remains so, but they will also include specific topics interest. All suggestions welcome. October focussed on the Police and Fire with the new PCC attending as mentioned above. See 21/113). The main issues raised included speeding & parking in rural villages as well as urban areas and late night anti-social behaviour in Amesbury. A Stonehenge area Speedwatch group has now been formed to focus on the issues and disseminate best practice. The first meeting was held online on Monday 11th October. The November meeting will focus on the current consultation on the next 5 year road resurfacing programme. A future meeting (probably December) will focus on local Individual and community action to mitigate climate change.

ii **Afghan Refugees** - WC is keen to welcome and assist Afghan refugees. A number are already transiting in a hotel in Wiltshire and the Council is assisting with linking them to Schools, GPs and seeking housing. There have been private housing offers and the Council may use properties controlled by its Stone Circle Company but they will not be taking social housing places. WC are still getting details from central government and are advising those wishing to make donations to go to the Red Cross or hold back until the needs and means are clearer. Latest updates are to be found on WC website. The leader of Wiltshire Council has been highlighting the number of vacant MoD properties in the county which they believe could assist.

21/118 Matters Arising

i **Playpark Equipment (Swings)** Cllr Young and the Clerk had a site meeting on the previous day as part of a quotation gathering project with a view to possibly replacing/adding equipment to the Playpark. From the circulated document comparing 5 different suppliers and their costs, it was agreed to approach a local company based in Salisbury to install a basket swing and a goalpost for football. The Clerk will proceed with this order. It was suggested an approach to the Enford Community Fund might help with the overall cost of £5,250.00 inc VAT

ii **Annual Playpark Safety Report.** It was agreed with RoSPA that their Inspector should attend the Playpark in September and make his annual report on the safety/condition of the equipment. In previous years as the Report has been received and discussed at the October PC meeting however there has not as yet been any Report issued. This item will carry through to the November meeting.

iii **Remembrance.** A discussion was had on whether the Parish should purchase a 'Tommy' silhouette and where this might be placed. They are expensive, starting at around £350/£400 and increasing to circa £1,220 for a double statue. It was agreed Cllrs Roberts, Hiskett and Cliff-Roberts would again put up the poppies around the village on 1st November. Some of these are becoming worn and the Clerk was asked to make enquiries to purchase some new ones. Cllr Young agreed to lay the wreath on behalf of the Parish Council and the Clerk will arrange the purchase.

21/119 Resident's issues Raised.

i. Verge cutting at Fifield Lane. The Clerk had received an email from a resident of Fifield concerned at the overgrown verges which had not been cut back by WC. It was explained that WC are running a 5 year trial based on ecological reasons to try and boost diversity in the hedgerows. This policy includes only cutting back verges at junctions or on blind corners for road safety earlier in the year and maintaining control of said verges and hedgerows by cutting them all back later in the year. There was concern from Fifield that essential vehicles like Heating Oil deliveries, have said it may not be safe for their drivers/vehicles and refuse to deliver. The Clerk asked WC Blair-Pilling to look into this.

21/120 Finance

The Clerk reported on the Parish Council's finances for September. There was a total of £14,316.14 carried forward with total outgoing for the month of £501.00. Normally on or around the 21st September the second tranche of the Precept is received from WC however this year receipt was not due until 28th. The bank statement covered the period to 27th September. Therefore the closing balance for the month is £13,815.14. The second tranche of the Precept (£8,203.50) will show in the October Reconciliation. There were no questions.

21/124 Roads and Highways

Cllr Coulthard reported that:

- i. It appears that there could be two charges for a survey in both Coombe and East Chisenbury to have the speed reduced to 20mph. Cllr Coulthard has asked WC Blair-Pilling to assist if possible to make this just one charge. This is ongoing and he is in discussions with the Stonehenge Community Area Transport Group (CATG)
- ii. Cllr Coulthard has been informed that the official '20mph' signs should be installed in Enford by the end of 2021.
- iii. Cllr Roberts asked if the Parish Steward could please clear the areas immediately around the grit bins and litter bins for ease of access and also if he could tidy up the verge along Enford Hill as this is pushing traffic into the middle of the road.

21/125 Public Rights of Way (PRoWs)

Cllr Hiskett reported that the new signpost (on the corner by The Red Lion) in East Chisenbury will be installed in the Autumn.

On the matter of the collapsing steps on the footpath by the junction of the A345 and Enford Hill he reported that WC will also be fixing this problem.

21/127 Any Other Business –

- i. Cllr Cliffe-Roberts reported that as agreed at the last meeting, signs have been acquired and fixed to the Defibrillator stating that the unit is alarmed and giving the door entry code.
- ii. Meeting Dates for 2022. Cllr Roberts raised a point on the meeting for 14th June 2022 – neither he nor Cllr Hiskett would be able to attend. The protocol will be followed. The Clerk will open the meeting and a Chairman will be agreed for the occasion by the attending Councillors.
- iii. The Council approved the cost of purchasing a Christmas Tree and Cllr Roberts asked for ideas to make the advent of Christmas more exciting. It was agreed that a 'Lighting Up Ceremony' should take place on Friday 3rd December at 6 o'clock giving everyone time to get back from school activities/work etc. Details will be finalised but it is envisaged that children will be able to add their decorations to the tree, there could be mulled wine for the adults, soft drinks for the children and mince pies – possibly even a carol!
- iv. Cllr Cliffe-Roberts asked if there was a Bonfire night planned – nobody knew and it was assumed not.
- v. Mention was also made of 3rd June 2022 which is the Queen's Golden Jubilee. Possible ideas were put forward for a Village Celebration and it was decided to ask members of the Village to come forward and create a committee to organise a Community Event. To this end the Clerk has been asked to put a notice in the Newsletter and bring forward the November 9th meeting to 7 o'clock in order to welcome all those willing helpers!

Mary Isabel Worsdell

26th August 1921—17th September 2021

Age 100 years

Mary was born in August 1921 in Christchurch Hampshire. Sadly her mother died quite young when Mary was only 9, so she was then brought up by her father and his housekeeper. The family moved to Devizes in the 30's where her father had a small holding, and subsequently married his housekeeper. As soon as she was old enough she joined the Auxiliary Territorial service (the ATS), and during the Second World War she was part of a crew operating an anti-aircraft gun site in Wrexham, North Wales.

Mary returned to Devizes after the war and married Bert in St James church, Southbroom in 1951. His roots were in Upavon, and they set up home first on Enford Hill, and then in Water Lane, Enford, where Bert himself built their bungalow. It had a large garden and paddock, and the family was virtually self-sufficient with chicken, goats, lots of vegetables, game shot out on the Plain, and fruit from the trees.

Larry joined the family in 1964, and he well remembers spending lots of time preparing fruit and vegetables for the table and the freezer. Bert and Larry would go out with his dogs to shoot rabbits for the pot, and also spend time fishing in the Avon.

They enjoyed holidays at a campsite in Weymouth. Larry remembers that Mary never moaned about anything, she always saw the best in everyone, never complained, and just got on with things without question. That reflects her character, and when local people heard of her death, they all said what a lovely lady she was – she obviously touched the hearts of lots of people and was well known and loved in the village. Sadly Bert and Mary left Enford when it came too difficult to keep everything going, and went to Berry Close in Netheravon. Bert died in 2019, and Mary was cared for at home for a time and then in a home in Shaftesbury.

Mary was also a member of the newsletter committee for many years, and a very active member in the village.

RECIPE for NOVEMBER SODA BREAD

Many of you will have been following the trend of making bread through lockdown, possibly for the first time. I didn't get round to it - always a bit nervous of bread-making without a trusty machine to do it for me. However, I was recently given this recipe for SODA BREAD which is utterly delicious and so easy. You need absolutely no special skills or equipment. Please do try it and eating a supermarket bread might become a thing of the past!

Ingredients

450g seeded wholemeal bread flour (Waitrose sell the Love Life version or Duchy Malted Grain is good too)

50g rolled oats (porridge oats)

1 tsp salt

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

1 tbs treacle (or use honey)

1 tbs honey

400 ml buttermilk (found easily in Waitrose but might be tricky elsewhere - typically it tends to come in the wrong sizes but I buy three and that means two loaves)

Method

Mix dry ingredients

Mix honey and treacle and buttermilk together - Mix liquids in quickly but don't overhandle, Press to flatten a bit and cut a cross on the top.

Cook on a baking tray in pre-heated oven (180 fan) for 30 mins or until it sounds hollow when you tap the top (My AGA takes 40 mins in the baking oven). Let it cool a bit and tuck in! Butter and honey highly recommended!

Extra: I think it's delicious as a savoury bread (very good with smoked salmon). So... either to the whole mix (1 tbs) or to half the mix (1/2 tbs) add fennel seeds.

- ◆ Clear up fallen leaves - especially from lawns, ponds and beds


