RED LION: Recipe of the Month

Courgette, Pea and Broad Bean Samosas

Creates about 30 small samosas.

Equipment:

Pastry brush, colander, bowls
Fryer/controlled frying environment @ 180C

INGREDIENTS

Feuille de Brick pastry (or Filo pastry) 150g Fresh peas podded (or frozen) 300g ½ cm diced courgette

70g diced onion2 cloves chopped garlic4g cumin seeds4g Garam masala4g medium curry powder1 Tbsp plain flour

150g Double podded broad beans (frozen can be used but still podded)

100g ½ cm diced cooked potato

Dice the courgette, lightly salt and leave in a colander over a bowl for 30 minutes. This de-gorges the courgettes, seasoning and softening them at the same time.

Dice the potatoes, and bring to the boil. They will cook quite quickly. The aim is for a cooked potato that holds it shape, not mash! When at this stage strain and drain.

Sweat the onions and garlic in a little oil until softened. Add your spices and toast to release maximum flavour. Add your courgette and cook for 2 minutes. Next add the potato, peas & broad beans and cook for a further 2 minutes. Check seasoning Allow the mix to cool.

When mix is cool take 1 tbsp plain flour and add just enough water to make a paste. Take a sheet of feuille de brick (filo can be used) and cut into 2-2 ½ inch strips. Take about ½ a dessert spoon of mix and place at the bottom of each strip. Fold the pastry on itself in triangular folds. Ensure you keep folding in this way whilst keeping the mix enveloped inside. Seal with the flour paste. You can make different sized samosas if you wish.

Fry @ 180C until golden, small samosas generally take about 3 minutes to cook. Remove from the fryer and drain on kitchen roll, sprinkle with a touch of salt and enjoy.

Eat them as they are, with a mint or mango chutney, or as a side to your own curry!





DCC Wiltshire and Swindon

Police and Crime Commissioner: Philip Wilkinson

Wiltshire Police have faced low points in the last year but it is becoming clear some of the improvements put in place are starting to deliver - and with a new leader at the helm, the Force is in safe, steady, hands. Chief Constable Catherine Roper's drive and commitment to delivering a quality policing service to Wiltshire residents, which is contributing significantly to Making Wiltshire Safer, has been apparent since she took the role. Focused strategic direction introduced immediately looked to answer the criticisms in the HMICFRS PEEL report with Chief Constable Roper leading her officers, staff and volunteers from the front and with the implementation of clear priorities for the Force: Safer Public Spaces. Violence and Burglary. Communities have been seeing focused operational work to tackle serious violence through increased engagement, highly-visible, and proactive, policing. This is alongside a commitment to attend 100% of residential burglaries. Currently, the Force detection rate for burglaries is 9.7%, which is a significant improvement, but I will always challenge for more. I know residents want safer roads, safer communities with more police officers - this hasn't been lost on the new Chief. Significant focus has been given to consistent proactive roads policing, stop checks, continued speeding enforcement in hotspots and increased engagement with all communities. With support being given to our fantastic Community Speed Watch volunteers by the Force's Speed Enforcement Officers, and the work of the Roads Policing Unit, notices of speed awareness courses, fines and court summons have increased from 192 in 2021 to over 2,000 in 2023's first five months. In addition, the Force recently hit government's officer recruitment targets, achieving the highest number of officers since 2008. It has also introduced a quicker, non-degree, route to get police officers through training in 20 weeks and on to our streets. Wiltshire Police remains in the Engage process but I am confident the reforms and improvements put in place by Chief will improve in those specific PEEL report areas of focus, for example: victims' service, 101 and 999 improvements, increases in justice outcomes for rape and serious sexual assault.

All of this is really promising progress, and excellent delivery of my police and crime plan, but I, and my office, will continue to support and challenge Chief Constable Roper to deliver on behalf of Wiltshire's residents.
