Getting into Volunteering: Guide Dogs

My name is Sue Davies, I started volunteering with guide dogs in 2022 as a fosterer. That's someone who cares for puppies in training while their Puppy Raiser is on holiday or unwell. A Puppy Raiser is the person who trains and supports the puppy once they leave the litter. We boarded a very handsome black lab called Zeb, who stole out hearts, followed by Coral, Emjay and Maisie. We were able to volunteer on our terms and our journey with the Guide Dogs began.

The families of these puppies were grateful for our care, as we had training we were able to keep up the puppy's training. We were hooked and wanted to commit to raising a puppy for them to become a life changer. We did the training and on July 20th, Victor arrived and we fell in love immediately.

I became interested in volunteering for guide Dogs when I saw an article about a BBC reporter whose guide dog was about to retire and he was faced with using a white stick as the waiting list for a new guide dog was two years I found this very moving and I saw a list of opportunities and signed up. We haven't looked back since. Victor is always keen to learn and tries so hard. Guide Dogs support us well, we have hotlines, training guidance and 24 HR vet access if needed.



It's a privilege to help people in some small way to understand what we do and how they can help by donating in the collection tin or even inspiring them to volunteer themselves. I never imagined how volunteering with Guide Dogs would change my life so much and in such a positive way. This is a wonderfully rewarding opportunity. I can't imagine my house without a puppy and we hope to do it many more times after Victor has moved on.

SEVILLE ORANGE & PASSION FRUIT CHEESECAKE

Utterly delicious no-bake cheesecake perfect after the lamb in March Newsletter. Serves 10-12 (halve the quantities for 6)

300g ginger nut biscuits120g melted butter4 tbsp orange marmalade250g mascarpone200ml double cream2 tbsp icing sugar

Pulp from 10-11 passion fruit (160ml) (or buy from Amazon Funkin passion fruit puree & keep in freezer)

TOPPING

Juice of 1/2 lemon
2 tbsp orange marmalade
Juice & seeds from 2 passion fruit

You will need a 23cm spring form tin (smaller if making for 6)

Put ginger nuts in the mixer and crush to a crumb or put in a bag and bash with a rolling pin. Add the melted butter and mix thoroughly. Line the base of the tin with baking paper or silicone disc. Tip the mix in and squish it down. Put in the fridge while making the filling.

Cut the passion fruit in half and blitz the pulp in either a mixer or a tall jug with a held stick blender. Give a few blasts just to loosen the seeds from membrane. Place sieve over a bowl or jug and pour in the juice, squish the pips as you need 160ml juice.

Put the mascarpone in a large bowl and add the double cream. Mix to break up the mascarpone and then add 4 tbsp marmalade and the passion fruit juice. Blend until it looks like firmly whipped cream. Taste and add icing sugar if you prefer it sweeter. Put the mixture on top of the biscuit base, leaving a few dents in the top to make craters for the sauce to fill! Leave the cheesecake to set overnight in the fridge (or for about 4-5 hours).

Blitz the last two passion fruit briefly to loosen and stir in the lemon juice and marmalade. Mix thoroughly. Remove cheesecake from the tin and place on a pretty plate. Drizzle the sauce so it forms puddles in the dents and trickles over the whole thing.

An update from Simon Campbell, director of The Swan

On behalf of the directors and shareholders of Swan Enford Limited, the owners of the Swan freehold, we thought it would be useful to update the community on events and prospects since the pub's closure on 1 January. Pete & Emma's company, the lessee, has put the lease on the market with agent's Sidney Phillips. There has been a steady stream of interest but no acceptable offers as yet. We are monitoring progress. The idea is primarily to identify a new tenant who is likely to make a go of the business, whilst maximising a return to Pete & Emma for all the work they've put in over the last 9 years. The company remains fully supportive of P&E in this period and we hope to have some good news and a re-opening date at some time in the spring.

ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 5th March 2024

24/020 Public Question Time Mark and Geraldine Symonds attended the meeting to raise the issue of flooding in the village (particularly Longstreet) and were seeking information about who is responsible for what, if there are protocols in place and if there is a comprehensive plan of the storm and foul drainage system in Enford. On a number of occasions they have reported the flooding, potholes and escaping foul water on the interactive map on the My Wilts app but without result other than being informed the problem had been dealt with or, once, referring them to the Parish Council. The problem is ground water erupting as springs not the river bursting its banks. Mark has previously cleared the drains himself. The pumping station struggles with the sheer quantity of water and foul water from the drains is contaminating the spring water. It was noted that Wessex Water were in daily attendance but did not appear to achieve any improvement. He felt it would be useful to know the layout of all the storm and foul drains in the village because as these significant climate change flooding events worsen, it seems that major re-engineering of the system will be required to protect property and residents' safety. It was assumed that any major engineering works would be the responsibility of Wiltshire Council, with Wessex Water, but he felt that WC were not engaged and had not registered the seriousness of the issue. Cllr Roberts mentioned a WC meeting being held in Figheldean on 27th March where this issue could be raised, Cllrs Roberts and Farrow will be attending. Since then Mark Symonds has confirmed that he will also be attending.

Enford Community Fund. No representative will be able to attend the Annual Parish Meeting next month (2nd April) and so they wished to update the Parish Council on how things stand. Chris Rose spoke on their behalf. The Community Fund (CF) was reformed in 2023 and are financially in good shape, just over £6.000 in the bank. He thanked Amanda Farrow for her great stewardship over the previous 10 years. The fund is ostensibly for the cost of putting on the Village Fete and Fireworks night but also for grants of up to £1,000 for local projects. Grants are awarded in March and September though applications can be made throughout the year. Upcoming events where the CF will be involved are: 1. 6th June – 80th D-Day celebrations. Alongside the bonfire/beacon lighting in the evening the CF will be organising food and drink. The Parish Council will also be contributing to the event. Cllr Hiskett will liaise with the CF. 2. 22nd June - The Village Fete. As always volunteers are required to assist with the build-up, running and breakdown. Even two hours of someone's time and support makes a difference to the continuation of the Fete so all volunteers are greatly welcomed - please support your Village Fete. It is hoped stands will include Wiltshire Wildlife, Dorset Fire & Rescue, the Police, the Parish Council as well as the usual attractions – the dog show, cake stall, plant stall (all donations gratefully received!), Fete games, races etc and of course refreshments. 3. 26th October -Bonfire Night. This is a provisional date and plans are afoot though it is too early to be more precise at this stage.

24/021 Police Matters and Neighbourhood Watch. The latest Police Report had been circulated to all Cllrs. PC Jody Kinge confirmed that both poaching and hare coursing on all areas of Salisbury Plain had increased in the last month. Criminal gangs not only do immense damage to crops and fencing but do great harm to our local wildlife, demonstrated by the large numbers of discarded mutilated hares left in the fields and on the Plain. It is not always possible to get drone operators to assist when needed. The hare count (breeding) is up this year hence the frequency of these events. Stolen cars used for this are often found burnt out and they have even

rammed police vehicles in order to get away. There are no longer any MoD Police in the area so it is down to Landmarc, Range Ops and the Police to try to be in the right place at the right time, most often at night with one person per vehicle. Intelligence shows the coursers are coming from as far as Wales and their gambling web-streams reach globally as far as China. The Police will continue their patrols and ask anyone seeing the coursers, to call 999, if possible get pictures of number plates but do not engage with them yourself.

On other matters, speeding continues to be a problem.

Playpark maintenance update. Cllrs Roberts, Hiskett, Farrow and Waight will continue with the maintenance required when the weather improves, currently looking at the week beginning 8th April. The Clerk reported that the contractor for the repair of the Multiply unit has been instructed to proceed. There is a 4 week lead time on making the pieces for the unit, but he hopes to have it installed by Easter.

D-Day 80th Anniversary – 6th June 2024. Discussed during Public Questions 24/020 – see above.

Litter Pick – 23rd March. Will start at 10.00 by the bus stop at Enford Hill. The Parish Council will supply bin bags, grabbers, hi-viz vests etc. It is recommended that people bring their own gloves though some are supplied. Cllr Roberts will place an emphasis on Health & Safety (what to pick up and what not to pick up) plus who covers which areas before getting to work. The event usually takes around an hour to an hour and a half. As The Swan is currently closed, two residents have very kindly come forward to offer teas, coffees and bacon butties afterwards as a thank you. Served from Swancote (opposite The Swan), the home of Geraldine Symonds who has offered her house as a venue. The Council would like to thank her for her generosity.

Bus stop roof repair and path renovation - Memorial Garden on A345.

Cllr Roberts confirmed a working party has now repaired the bus shelter roof. Special thanks go to Tom Hunter and Clive Bullen for their support as well as Cllrs Mark Hiskett and Bruce Waight. The path through the garden needs repair work. First to replace the wooden baton edging but discussion was had on the surface. Gravel can easily be thrown up by lawnmowers (a hazard to traffic) and is slippery if frozen. Wood chip is a weed suppressant but can easily 'shift' with wear. Both can easily be compacted with use. A hoggin surface was mentioned and Cllr Roberts will speak to Dan Withers (Landscape Gardener) to ask for suggestions. Whatever is agreed a working party can assist with the 'new' path.

24/032 Roads and Highways. Cllr Farrow said the Parish Steward was still on secondment to other areas of WC, but will be returning to Parish duties soon. He is very helpful with issues raised. Cllr Farrow requested problems be reported initially on the My Wilts app and tell him the report number to follow it through the system. It has been noted that there is a new mirror opposite New Buildings. The old mirror is discarded and needs to be removed.
