Congratulations to Rev. Canon Philip Bromiley on becoming a Canon

Last month I was invited by the Bishop to become an Honorary Non-Residential Canon of Salisbury Cathedral, placed in the Stall of Chisenbury and Chute. Being a canon doesn't make me a "big shot" or "easily fired"! It is a deeply humbling and profoundly meaningful honour. Salisbury Cathedral stands as one of the most remarkable expressions of faith, history, and architectural beauty in the country, and to be invited to share in its life and ministry is both a privilege and a responsibility.

The title of Honorary Canon carries with it not only recognition of service but also an invitation to a deeper connection with the Cathedral's ongoing mission: to inspire, to serve, and to be a living sign of God's presence in the world. The Stall of Chisenbury and Chute, with its own historic associations to our Team, roots this appointment within the ancient rhythms of the Diocese, and forges another positive link between our parishes and the mother Church of the Cathedral.

This moment invites reflection on vocation and service. It is not merely an accolade, but a calling to embody the Cathedral's values of hospitality, prayer, and outreach. I take my seat with genuine gratitude: for those who have supported and guided me on the journey, for the trust placed in me by the Dean and Chapter, and for all those in our churches who quietly stand as beacons of hope, beauty, and faith in our time.

GREAT BUSTARD GROUP

The long warm spell this the summer was generally helpful in terms of the breeding success of Wiltshire's Great Bustards. The species is rarely known to drink, getting moisture from plants and doubtless from dew as well. One unforeseen consequence of the hot weather was the



earliest cereal harvest some local farms have ever known. We are aware of the dangers of spring and summer silage mowing for Great Bustards and indeed for all ground nesting birds, but the chicks are usually able to fly from danger by the time the combine harvesters are out. This year, the early harvest was taking place when some of the chicks were still very small and trying to ensure their safety was an additional task for the GBG team.

The head-started birds – hand reared chicks hatched from eggs rescued from silage cutting – have now been released. These were reared and released about 10 miles from the Enford area, but the birds move around and some have been recorded close to Enford already. The adult population, and their wild reared chicks are generally creatures of habit, and their location can often be predicted. The head-started chicks are a bit more challenging to keep tabs on. Some leave the area for their first winter with trips to France not uncommon. Toulouse is the longest trip we know of, but many will stay around Wiltshire and can be seen anywhere.

If you see a Great Bustard, please do let us know. All reports are very useful to us, even the ones which are something other than Great Bustards! Farmyard turkeys, Buzzards, various geese species and even deer have been reported as Great Bustards, we are pleased to receive all reports and follow them up.

The lecture is **John Singer Sargent**, the American expatriate artist, born in Florence in 1856 who died in London in 1925. His early submission to the Paris Salon, the *Portrait of Madame X*, was met with scandal rather than accolades making him leave Paris and move to London.

His portraits were consistent with the accepted style and formality, while his informal works and landscapes displayed a more impressionist theme.

A later discovery of previously unseen male nudes, resulted in re-evaluation of his life and work. His same-sex interests, unconventional friendships with women and engagement with race and gender issues, mark him as socially and aesthetically progressive.

Gavin Plumley is our speaker, a writer and broadcaster and lectures widely on the culture of Central Europe. Recipe of the month

Spiced Lentil & Butternut Squash Soup

As we head further into autumn, this easy, filling soup makes an excellent lunch or quick supper,

Ingredients

2 tbsp olive oil	1 butternut squash (1—1.5kg)
2 onions	100gms red lentils
2 garlic cloves	1L Hot vegetable stock
1/4 tsp hot chilli powder	1 small bunch coriander
1 tbsp ras el hanout	Dukkah (Available

Method

Heat the oil in a large flameproof casserole dish or saucepan over a medium-high heat. Fry the onions with a pinch of salt for 7 mins, or until softened and just caramelised. Add the garlic, chilli powder and ras el hanout, and cook for 1 min more.

Stir in the squash and lentils. Pour over the stock and season to taste. Bring to the boil, then reduce the heat to a simmer and cook, covered, for 25 mins or until the squash is soft. Blitz the soup with a [stick blender](#) until smooth, then season to taste.

Stir in the coriander leaves and ladle the soup into bowls. Serve topped with the dukkah, yogurt and extra coriander leaves.

To make your own easy Dukkah.

- 50g blanched hazelnuts
- 2 tbsp sesame seeds
- 1 tbsp coriander seeds
- 1 tbsp cumin seeds
- 1 tbsp fennel seeds

Method

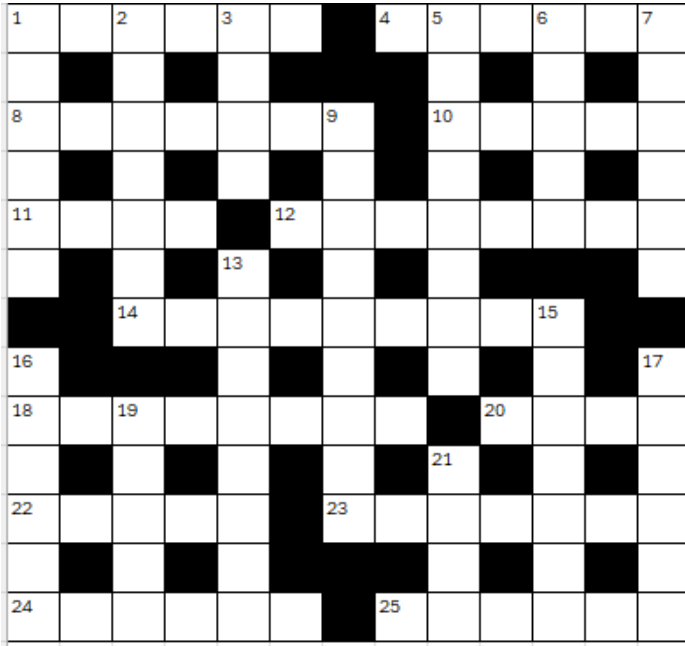
Heat oven to 180C/160C fan gas 4. Mix everything together in a bowl then spread over a baking tray and cook for 8-10 mins until the dukkah looks toasted.

Tip into a food processor and pulse a few times just until the nuts are chopped but not smooth. Store in an airtight container.

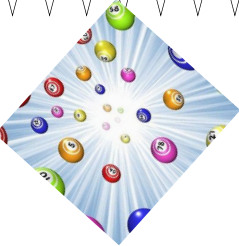

Applications for awards must be made in writing, by email, to EnfordFund@gmail.com or by letter to one of the group members (Carolyn Ansell, Katie Briscoe, Tracy Buttery, Rob Hibberd, Richard Petitt, Chris Rose).

The following guidelines will be followed in allocating funds:

1. Submissions will be considered at the next scheduled meeting and within 3 months of the request being submitted.
2. Funding will be made for individual projects and is not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis.
3. Awards are made to causes benefitting the community, not specific individuals.
4. No awards will exceed £1,000 in total.
5. For any award to be made, there must be agreement by 75% of the group.

Wiltshire and Swindon



Philip Wilkinson OBE, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire and Swindon.

As your Police and Crime Commissioner, I remain very concerned the current national police funding formula, established by Tony Blair's government is seriously disadvantaging Wiltshire Police and limiting the service we provide. Government's central grant allocates us £115 per head but the national average is £164.

It simply does not reflect the reality of policing a largely rural county, across a wide area, with diverse challenges: rural crime, county lines, cybercrime, serious violence, mental health, victim support and more. I have written to previous and current police ministers and home secretaries asking them to address the disparities in police funding. Both the previous government and this one may appear annually to allocate the police more money, but in fact they do not cover inflation and increasingly expect PCCs to increase local taxes to compensate for the reduction in central funding - placing the burden on residents. Over the last year Wiltshire Police has squeezed out every possible cost efficiency through their Financial Review Programme, but there is only so much can be trimmed till it harms core services.

I applaud the progress made under Chief Constable Catherine Roper, being removed from 'special measures' ensuring improved service. Residents tell me that they feel safer, yet none of that is guaranteed unless our funding is fair and sustainable. Unfair funding means slower responses, reduced officer visibility, delayed investigations. Wiltshire residents deserve policing that delivers and keeps them safe and that is what I am fighting for. I will continue campaign for multi-year settlements and reform of the funding formula to reflect the demands of modern policing. I'm committed to ensuring Wiltshire has the resources it needs to be safe and well served.

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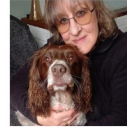

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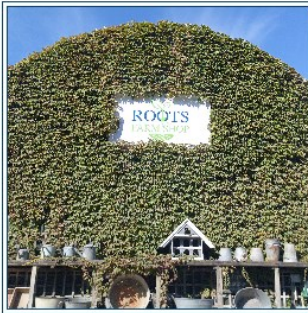
