Thoughts of Rev. Canon Philip Bromiley

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep, the silent stars go by.

The American Priest, Phillips Brooks of Philadelphia, wrote these words in 1868, following a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. They were words I found myself singing, as I stood on a Hilltop overlooking Bethlehem. Lying some 6 miles south of Jerusalem, within the West Bank, Bethlehem is not so little. It now has a population of nearly 200,000 people. Bethlehem is part of Israel, but is administered by the Palestinian Authority.

Dominating Bethlehem today is a 12 ft high wall around its perimeter. For those on one side, the wall is a 'security barrier', representing an 80% fall in suicide bombings in Jerusalem. For those on the other side, including the 40% of the population whoare Christian, it is a 'wall of oppression' preventing Palestinians seeing family, friends or finding work.

The Wall is a graphic illustration of a timeless truth: sin leads to Separation. It always has done. Bad choices separate us from God and bad choices distance us also from other people. Do we sense a barrier between ourselves and God? Do we know of relationships in need of reconciliation? Jesus came to break barriers down.

Do you remember Fred Dibnah? He was a Lancastrian Steeplejack who demolished chimneys. His technique was never to use dynamite, as it was too unpredictable, instead he used traditional methods to destabilise chimneys by setting fire to wooden blocks, propped up next to the one side of the structure. His catch phrase, as the chimney would come crashing down yards away from him, was "Do yer like that?"

Often we pray that God will break barriers in our relationships down instantly - but it may be that we need the gentle, steady warmth of carefully directed prayer to destabilise hostility. The Peace Child given to us 2000 years ago still has the power to break down walls. The tiny baby is God's mechanism for bringing us together, the world forgiveness, and every human heart, a lasting peace.

Emergency first Aid Session

Enford Parish Council and the Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity have arranged an informative evening to raise community awareness of emergency training.

The event will cover not just the use of defibrillators, performing CPR, the recovery position etc but also other emergencies such as choking or bleeding, giving the community knowledge and confidence to manage a medical emergency prior to the arrival of the Ambulance.

The session will last around 60-90 minutes and is a hands-on opportunity to learn skills that could be used in an emergency situation. 2025 has been a good year for the UK's Great Bustards. The rate of natural reproduction has been good and this has been matched by a decent survival rate. We also released an additional 10 birds that we hand raised from eggs rescued from silage fields and the survival rate so far is pleasing. Great Bustards have a very low rate of natural recruitment, and this is matched with a high rate of adult survival. We will compile a full end of year report with the final end of year data, but we can already be confident the year will end with significantly more Great Bustards in the UK than we started with.

Please do keep in mind GBG Memberships and our guided project visits as Christmas gifts. We also have a range of Bustard themed goods through our web site or drop us an email and arrange to meet us at the village hall where we will have a range of items from cards to mugs and garden decorations.

The GBG is grateful for all the support from the Enford villagers during 2025 and we hope 2026 brings us all further success.

Almond, Blueberry and Coconut Cake/dessert

Serves 10-12 Full of 'super-foods'!*

This truly delicious 'cake' is super simple, wonderfully moist and versatile. It is happy to be served warm for dessert with double cream poured over, or at room temperature when it's time for tea



180g ground almonds
60g desiccated coconut
250g caster sugar
70g self-raising flour
200g unsalted butter, melted, then set aside to come to room temperature

1/2 tsp vanilla extract finely grated zest 2 lemons 200g fresh blueberries 20g flaked almonds 1/4 tsp salt 4 large eggs

- 1. Grease and line a 23cm round cake tin. Preheat oven to 180C 160C Fan Gas mark 4
- 2. Place almonds, coconut, sugar, flour & salt in a large mixing bowl and whisk other ingredients together toaerate and remove lumps
- 3. Place the eggs in a separate medium bowl and whisk lightly. Add the melted butter, vanilla extract and lemon zest and whisk again until well combined. Pour this into the dry mix and whisk to combine. Fold in 150g blueberries, then pour the mixture into the tin. Sprinkle the last of the blueberries on top, along with the flaked almonds, and bake for 50-55 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Keep a close eye on it towards the end of cooking: the relatively large number of eggs in the mix means that it can go from still being a little liquid in the centre to being well cooked in just a few minutes.
- 4. Set aside for 30 minutes before inverting out of the tin, removing the baking parchment and placing the cake right way up on a serving plate. Serve either warm with cream or set aside until cool. Can be frozen and then warmed or served cool.

The Life and Works of H. G. Murphy, Gold and Silversmith.

Harry Murphy served his apprenticeship under Henry Wilson, probably Britain's greatest designer goldsmith of the Arts and Crafts era. It was here he learnt his skills, enamelling, gem-setting polishing, niello, engraving and hammering. From 1928 until his death in 1939 he worked from retail premises in Marylebone, known as the Falcon Studio, where he designed and created a prodigious amount of silverware for the corporate, civic and private sectors as well as some truly startling gold, silver and enamel jewellery inspired by nature, architecture, the Ballet Russes and the vibrancy of the Jazz Age.

John Benjamin is a jewellery historian, author and broadcaster. Formerly International Director of Jewellery at Phillips Fine Art Auctioneers. John is well-known from his many appearances on BBC Television's Antiques Roadshow, a Freeman of the Goldsmiths' Company, a Court Assistant and Founder Liveryman of The Worshipful Company of Arts Scholars and in 2021 was appointed Honorary Jewellery Adviser to the National Trust.


Three years ago Emily opened a boutique in Devizes "Amelie Lingerie" and started collecting old, unwanted bras for donation. Earlier this year, Emily was diagnosed with Stage 3 aggressive triple-negative breast cancer and what started as a charitable passion became a deeply personal journey. Raising funds for Breast Cancer Research, around £700 for every tonne of bras donated also supports women's co-operatives in developing countries, where the bras are distributed to help women earn a sustainable income. This initiative was inspired by Emily's strength and determination. She is extremely moved by the huge response from Enford and the surrounding villages, and very grateful. If you still have unwanted bras they can be handed in directly to Emily at her shop in Devizes.





THE ENFORD COMMUNITY FUND

The Enford Community Fund is a not-for-profit community organisation managed by a small group of local volunteers who organise activities and events across the parish and make donations to benefit the wider community.

Funding is available to support projects and events in the Parish of Enford (which includes Compton, Coombe, East and West Chisenbury, Fifield, New Buildings and Newtown). Applications for awards must be made in writing, by email, to EnfordFund@gmail.com or by letter to one of the group members (Carolyn Ansell, Katie Briscoe, Tracy Buttery, Rob Hibberd, Richard Petitt, Chris Rose).

The following guidelines will be followed in allocating funds:

- 1. Submissions will be considered at the next scheduled meeting and within 3 months of the request being submitted.
- 2. Funding will be made for individual projects and is not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis.
- 3. Awards are made to causes benefitting the community, not specific individuals.
- 4. No awards will exceed £1,000 in total.
- 5. For any award to be made, there must be agreement by 75% of the group.

Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 4th November 2025

The Chairman opened the meeting at 19.37 and minuted thanks and congratulations to the Community Fund for their excellent and well attended Fireworks and Bonfire night. There were over 500 attendees who enjoyed the event immensely, he also wanted to minute thanks to all the volunteers at The Swan who are managing to keep the pub open for 4 days a week with special thanks to Clive Bullen and Steve Stringer who oversee all the ordering and maintaining the stock levels.

25/086 Public Question Time. Steve Stringer was attending the meeting to discuss The Swan which, as most residents know, is up for sale or looking for a new tenant. He raised the matter of an 'Asset of Community Value' (ACV) which he proposed the Parish Council consider applying for in respect The Swan. The principle of an AVC is to provide a six month window for the community to raise funds for the purchase of the property in the event a potential new purchaser intends to buy the property for conversion to residential use. It is only a 'safety net' for the pub / village and there is no cost for this application. It should not deter/hamper any potential buyer of the pub. Through Steve, the Campaign for Real Ale (CAMRA), have offered to help with the forms, as have WC Ian Blair-Pilling and Cllr Peter Cliffe-Roberts. After some discussion it was agreed that this could be a sensible step forward and following the completion of the paperwork should be presented at the next PC meeting before proceeding with the application.

<u>25/092 Matters Arising</u> The annual Playpark Safety Report. Was circulated to all Cllrs on receipt. The Playpark has a low risk rating and any maintenance work will be undertaken in the Spring.

<u>Flags and Tommys.</u> Due to the state of some of the poppies, the PC has purchased some extras as well as two flags – one for the Church and one in the central bus stop. Cllr Pat Holdway has kindly offered to lay a wreath on behalf of all residents at the service on Remembrance Sunday. Cllr Roberts thanked those Cllrs who gave their time to put up the poppies and Tommys around the Church/village.

Wiltshire & Bath Air Ambulance Charity Aware programme. The Clerk read out the details of this Community Emergency Awareness Training. The session lasts for 60-90 minutes and covers topics such as recovery position, CPR, defibrillators, choking and bleeding. It was agreed that this would be a useful and instructive event for the whole Parish and the Clerk will contact them and book a suitable evening in the new year. [Please note, this event has been booked in the Village Hall for Thursday, January 22nd 2026. Please contact the clerk to register your interest]

British Army Motorsports Association (BAMA) 4x4 Navigation. The driving event 'Autumn Leaves' will be held on Saturday 29th November starting from and returning to Larkhill Camp. Over a period of 5 hours some 30 vehicles will cover 80 miles of varying terrain with only a map and compass and will be passing through the Parish. It is planned to cause the least disturbance possible.

<u>South West Ambulance Charity.</u> They have approached the PC for funding to purchase, convert and equip a second Community Response Vehicle (CRV) at a total cost of £30,000. After some discussion it was agreed that any funding/assistance being given would be better spent locally and the First Responder in the Parish, will be contacted to advise on the most suitable equipment which would benefit her role.

Path on the A345 at New Buildings. Following previous discussions with the Local Highways and Footpaths Infrastructure Group (LHFIG) a potential plan to increase pedestrian safety of residents of New Buildings, giving safer access to the bus stop and Enford itself, was drawn up and presented to the PC. In turn, the PC wrote to each household in New Buildings to gauge their opinions on the outline plan. Five letters of concern were received with preferences for reduced vehicle speed at the entrance/exit on to the A345. (This was previously raised with the PC and Wiltshire's Highways Dept made a site visit. They said no physical speed reductions could be put in place). The current proposal for a pavement to be installed is an improvement and would benefit walkers/dog walkers from Enford accessing the west side of the A345 and that area of the Plain. Cllrs discussed the concerns raised and agreement was reached that the proposal be taken forward. They also agreed to paying 25% of the cost of the installation.

Christmas Tree, Lights and Carols Event. Diaries out! - this will take place on Friday 5th December at the bottom of Enford Hill by the bus stop. (Should the weather be bad then, as last year, we hope to be able to use the Church). Turning on the Christmas Tree lights, singing a few carols, mince pies, mulled wine, soft drinks and treats for the children! A brief/maybe cold/cheerful event to get everyone into the Christmas spirit!

25/089 Unitary Council Matters WC Ian Blair-Pilling reported: The Stonehenge Area Board is engaging with all the local parishes to ascertain what their most pressing issues are. There will be a formal meeting on 27th November and Cllrs Roberts, Farrow and the Clerk will attend.

Following Netheravon's one year trial of speed reduction on the A345 which has been successful, they now wish to extend the 40mph further north to try and slow the traffic before it enters Netheravon. Highview Farm's (old Mink Farm) recent Planning Application PL/2025/05825 was initially turned down however the owner has now appealed against this decision and the case has gone to the Planning

Inspectorate. All letters, concern or support should reach them by 25th November. The Inspectorate are in the process of changing between two systems and inadvertently published the wrong link. 25/100 Any Other Business The Enford Community Speed Watch is suspended. The role of Community Speed Watch co-ordinator and volunteers to undertake the Speed Watch training, will be advertised in the next Newsletter.

Philip Wilkinson OBE, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire and Swindon

As your Police and Crime Commissioner, I remain very concerned that the current national police funding formula, established by Tony Blair's government is seriously disadvantaging Wiltshire Police and limiting the service we are able to provide. Government's central grant allocates us £115 per head although the national average is £164.

It simply does not reflect the reality of policing a largely rural county, across a wide area, with diverse challenges: rural crime, county lines, cybercrime, serious violence, mental health, victim support and more. I have written to both previous and current police ministers and home secretaries asking them to address the current disparities in police funding. Both the previous government and this one may appear annually to allocate the police more money, but in fact the increase they award does not cover inflation and they increasingly expect PCCs to increase local taxes to compensate for the real reduction in central funding - placing the burden on residents.

Over the last year Wiltshire Police has squeezed out every possible cost efficiency through their Financial Review Programme, but there is only so much that can be trimmed before it begins to harm our core services.

I applaud the progress made under Chief Constable Catherine Roper, being removed from 'special measures' ensuring improved service. Residents tell me that they feel safer, yet none of that is guaranteed to continue unless our funding is fair and sustainable. Unfair funding means slower responses, reduced officer visibility as well as delayed investigations.

Wiltshire residents deserve policing that delivers and keeps them safe and that is what I am fighting for. I will continue to campaign for multi-year settlements and a reform of the funding formula to reflect the demands of modern policing. I am committed to ensuring that Wiltshire has the resources it needs to be safe and well served.
