Over the years greatly improved the grounds keeping them in excellent order for everyone to enjoy. It was only this October we had to ask for volunteers to take over this task!

Hamish was always kind and generous with a heart of gold. He was greatly liked and respected and will be sorely missed by all who were lucky enough to know him. Huge appreciation is due for his tireless support and contribution to so many aspects of village life.

Barbara and her husband, Ron, were very involved in Enford Church. However when Ron died Barbara decided to move to Chippenham, near her son. She was sad to leave Enford which was her life for so long and had so much knowledge about the village. She recently gave to me the newsletters that she had kept

since it first started, to be kept or passed on as appropriate. It was always lovely hearing her talk about village history. I wish she had written a book as I often suggested, but sadly it didn't happen. She was a true Enfordian, heart and soul, and will be missed by many.



We also announce the sad news of the passing of **Helen Hadfield**. Helen and Michael Hadfield, lived in East Chisenbury for almost 30 years and during that time they were very involved with All Saints Church in Enford. Michael was a Parish councillor and a church warden for many years. Helen regularly helped with the church flowers and she also spent many hours embroidering many of the new kneelers still in the church. Both were very supportive, frequently helping in the community. About 12 years ago they moved to Petworth to be closer to family members.

Emergency training Session

In January Andrew Robinson from Wiltshire Air Ambulance led an engaging and very practical 'emergency training' session at Enford Village Hall, with our local community invited. Organised by Enford Parish Council, it covered how medical emergencies are triaged into breathing, bleeding, burns and bones — and why that order matters

Half the session covered unresponsive (unconscious) casualties with Andrew explaining that, for those who are not breathing, absolutely every second counts towards saving a life. The golden rules are: first call 999 (or shout for help if no phone is nearby), then immediately start non-stop CPR, then send someone to fetch a defibrillator as quickly as possible. We learnt that "bad CPR is far better than no CPR", it can buy vital time before medical help arrives.

Everyone had the chance to see a defibrillator in action and practise CPR on dummy torsos. Defibrillators automatically talk you through clear instructions on what to do in such an incident. We have two in the parish: one located in Enford (between the bus stop and The Swan); the other in East Chisenbury, at the entrance to The Red Lion.

The fact-packed talk included other crucial emergency rules: how to stem continuous bleeding (the key is apply firm pressure directly to the wound and call 999). Also, burns need to be kept under tepid running water for at least 20 minutes (much longer than most people think) as otherwise the skin continues 'cooking'. This can significantly mitigate damage.

Andrew delivered a wealth of information with wit and warmth, making the evening both memorable and reassuring.

Hopefully none of us will ever need to use this knowledge, but with the Enford defibrillator having already been used twice for road traffic accidents, you can never know.

Huge thanks to Andrew and to Wiltshire Air Ambulance for a brilliant (and potentially life-saving) session. In recognition of which the Parish Council made a £100 donation to the Wiltshire Air Ambulance —

a vital cause that supports us all.

Recipe of the Month: Pecan and Dark Chocolate Cookies. (A healthy alternative & gluten free)

INGREDIENTS

3 tbs demerara sugar
3 tbs olive oil
2 tbs flax seeds
4 tbs water
200g ground almonds
50g chopped pecan nuts
Salt - a pinch
70g dark chocolate chips



METHOD

Preheat oven to 180c

Mix the flax seed and water in a bowl and set it aside.

In a separate bowl combine the brown sugar and olive oil, then add it to the flax mixture and stir well.

Add the ground almonds and fold in gently to combine it all. Sprinkle in salt, chocolate chips and the chopped pecan nuts and fold again until everything is evenly distributed.

Roll the cookie dough into 12 equal balls and flatten a little gently with your palm. Put in the oven and bake for approximately 10 minutes, until the edges are lightly golden. Leave on the baking sheet for a couple of minutes and then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

Now you can enjoy your delicious and healthy cookies.

These are very quick and easy to make, however I found that, unfortunately, they are even quicker to eat!

Great Bustards do not really have summer and winter plumage. It is more a case of breeding and non-breeding plumage. The males are changing into their breeding plumage now. By February they will be competing against each other and trying to establish dominance over their rivals. When April comes, the males will have established a clear hierarchy, and they can then spend more of their time trying to impress a female.

Feathers are an excellent body covering, but they do have their weakness. They are very light, can take a shape and form suitable for flying, and have exceptional insulation properties. However, on the downside they do wear out faster than fur, and birds will replace all their feathers twice a year.

Applications for awards must be made in writing, by email, to EnfordFund@gmail.com or by letter to one of the group members (Carolyn Ansell, Katie Briscoe, Tracy Buttery, Rob Hibberd, Richard Petitt, Chris Rose).

The following guidelines will be followed in allocating funds:

1. Submissions will be considered at the next scheduled meeting and within 3 months of the request being submitted.
2. Funding will be made for individual projects and is not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis.
3. Awards are made to causes benefitting the community, not specific individuals.
4. No awards will exceed £1,000 in total.
5. For any award to be made, there must be agreement by 75% of the group.

Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 6th January 2026

26/005 Unitary Council Matters WC Blair-Pilling wanted to raise the following points under discussion at Wiltshire Council:

- i. The Cabinet have been discussing a vast, proposed solar farm near Malmesbury however the decision is not theirs and the plans will be sent to central Government for the final decision.
- ii. An extraordinary meeting has been called to discuss payment to a developer in taking over a multi-storey car park.
- iii. The prospect of Council Tax on second homes and unoccupied houses. The owners of most unoccupied properties in Wiltshire are the MoD.
- iv. The move to black bins being collected every three weeks (instead of the current two week collection). Bringing back a booking system for Household Recycling Centres (HRCs) though this is not generally well received. Two HRCs have been earmarked for closure in north Wiltshire. The introduction of waste Food bins (once a week) which is being enforced by central Govt. This will play havoc with the budget on the current contracts.

26/006 Verification of the Minutes

The Minutes of the meeting of 2nd December 2025 were proposed as accurate by Cllr Holdway and seconded by Cllr Hibberd.

26/008 Matters Arising

i. Community Emergency Training. 22nd January at 6.30pm in the Village Hall. To date some 23 people have registered their interest in attending. The evening will be run by the Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity to cover the use of Defibrillators, giving CPR, the recovery position and emergencies such as choking or bleeding. This is free to attend and the Parish Council will make a donation of £100.00 to the Charity. Teas and coffees will be available courtesy of Cllrs Jane Young and Pat Holdway. Cllr Hibberd will promote the event further on Facebook.

ii. Asset of Community Value (ACV) for The Swan Pub. Cllr Peter Cliffe-Roberts and Steve Stringer have completed the form for this application which would be made by the Parish Council. A further discussion was had on the pros and cons of proceeding and a decision was reached that now was not the time to do so.

iii. Date for the March annual Litter Pick. This date has now been set for Saturday, 21st March with the usual refreshments to follow. Further details to be published nearer the time.

Replacement of the Basketball unit. This has been raised in the RoSPA safety report in recent years. The clerk will do some research into a new, compliant unit and it is hoped to have it installed before Spring/Summer.

The Flood Report. Mark Symonds, the Flood Warden, was unable to attend the meeting but sent an update on his progress. He and Cllr Roberts attend the meetings in Warminster run by Wiltshire Council in conjunction with the Water Companies and the Environment Agency. Before reading the report, Cllr Roberts noted that in future WC will no longer be supplying salt/grit, signage, gel sacs and tabards etc free of charge to the Parishes.

For the Flood Wardens full report please see the draft minutes on the PC website.

vi. **The Allotment site.** As of this month there is a new tenant taking over the Allotment site. It needs to be cleared first of all; the Parish Council have agreed to assist with the hire of a skip for the rubbish. Once ready for sowing/planting both vegetables and flowers will hopefully flourish.

vii. **The Christmas Tree.** This has now been taken down. The Parish Council would like to thank Clive Bullen for his assistance and the purchase of new lights and battery power pack.

viii. **The Mink Farm Site.** WClr Ian Blair-Pilling informed the Council that the latest Planning Application and correspondence has now been passed to the Inspectorate. **26/009 Finance**

The Clerk read out the financial position during December and the balance carried forward to January is £17,217.02. There were no questions. The Clerk also informed the Council that a VAT reclaim covering the last 3 years of capital expenses was received in December in the sum of £1,029.96.

26/010 Planning Applications PL/2026/00075 was received earlier in the day and circulated to all Cllrs. This was for the reduction of a Willow tree at Cobweb Cottage in East Chisenbury. The detail is available on the Parish Council website. There were no objections.

26/012 Roads and Highways



Cllr Farrow reported that all the potholes have been dealt with. When inspecting the drainage issues at New Buildings 25/114 (December) he missed a drain as it was completely under water. This has been reported on the My Wilts app. Still at New Buildings, having discovered old photographs showing a footpath by the A345 it was thought this could be the basis for renovation. The Local Highways Footpaths Infrastructure Group (LHFIG) however wish to retain their plans to create a new clean, tidy path and this will go ahead, being extended slightly in length.

26/015 Any Other Business

WClr Ian Blair-Pilling asked Cllr Roberts for his feedback on the Flood meetings. Cllr Roberts felt these were not particularly well organised although were very useful for networking with other Flood Wardens and officials from WC Highways, the Environment Agency and Wessex Water; any minutes arising have to be requested. Cllr Waight will not be able to attend the next meeting in March and has made his apologies.

As we move into 2026, the challenges facing policing and the wider Criminal Justice System remain significant, they affect every community, including yours. Financial pressures continue to bite. Rising costs and tight budgets mean police forces and partner agencies work hard to maintain services with less flexibility. This impacts everything from neighbourhood policing and crime prevention to victim support.

The Home Office's much anticipated Policing White Paper, to set out a clear vision for police reform and investment, is delayed again. Without this strategic direction, forces are left planning year-to-year rather than building for the long term, whilst navigating speculation in the media about possible reforms, including reducing the number of forces and creating regional ones. But without that white paper and clear detail, speculation is all we have.

I remain concerned about the lack of confirmation from the Home Office on what funding will look like after March for key national initiatives delivered locally. This poses a real risk to continuity of services that make a tangible difference, such as street wardens, increased Wiltshire Police patrols in ASB hotspots, and specialist early intervention schemes supporting those at risk of serious violence. Without clarity, these vital efforts could stall just as we are starting to see positive impact.

Despite these challenges, I want to reassure you: your concerns are heard. My office continues to press for timely funding and clear policy direction. We are working with the Chief Constable and her teams to ensure that, even under pressure, the focus remains on keeping our communities safe.

Please keep sharing your views, because strong community voices help us make the case for Wiltshire and Swindon. In January, I will consult with you on the policing budget for next year and your local priorities for community safety to ensure that the service you receive reflects your local needs.
